19	(d) All plumbing shall be in accordance comply with the applicable local plumbing ordinances. ordinances and with

22	(e) Comfortable and sanitary conditions for patients and employees shall be maintained at all times. times, as follows:		
23	(1) floors, including carpeted areas, shall be kept clean, dry, odor free, and in good repair;		
24	(2) walls and ceilings shall be kept clean and in good repair;		
25	(3) doors, windows, and window treatments shall be kept clean and in good repair;		
26	(4) equipment, furniture, and light fixtures, including in reception areas, shall be kept clean and in good
