In (a)(4), line 14, please insert a comma after "18A .1300" and before "which". Please note a conforming change to (c), line 17, after "18C" and (d), line 20, after "Code".

In (e), line 22, are "comfortable and sanitary" being defined by what is required in (e)(1) through (6)?

In (h), Page 2, lines 6-11, was this language added in response to public comment?

6	(a) The premises of a dental facility shall be kept neat and clean and free of accumulated rubbish and any substances		
7	that create a public health or safety hazard.hazard, as follows:		
8	(1) all floors shall be free of obstacles to cleaning;		
9	(2) reception areas, hallways, treatment areas, office facilities, and other walking surfaces shall be free		
10	of obstruction;		
11	(3) all equipment and instruments that have been used for patient dental care shall be handled in		
12	accordance with Rule .0103 of this Subchapter; and		
13	(4) solid wastes and medical wastes shall be handled and disposed of in accordance with 15A NCAC		
14	18A .1300 which is incorporated by reference, including subsequent amendments.		
15	(b) The premises shall be kept free of all insects and vermin.		
16	(c) Water of a safe, sanitary quality shall be piped under pressure, pressure to all equipment and fixtures where the		
17	use of water is required. The water supply shall meet the requirements in 15A NCAC 18A .1700 or 15A NCAC 18C		
18	which are incorporated by reference, including subsequent amendments.		
19	(d) All plumbing shall be in accordance comply with the applicable local plumbing ordinances and with		
20	the North Carolina State Plumbing Code which is incorporated by reference, including subsequent amendments and		
21	editions, and is available at no cost online at https://www.ncosfm.gov/codes/codes-current-and-past.		
22	(e) Comfortable and sanitary conditions for patients and employees shall be maintained at all times.times, as follows:		
23	(1) floors, including carpeted areas, shall be kept clean, dry, odor free, and in good repair;		
24	(2) walls and ceilings shall be kept clean and in good repair;		
25	(3) doors, windows, and window treatments shall be kept clean and in good repair;		
26	(4) equipment, furniture, and light fixtures, including in reception areas, shall be kept clean and in good		
27	repair;		
28	(5) rooms shall be heated, cooled, and ventilated to maintain a temperature between 65°F (19°C) and		
29	85°F (30°C), and ventilation equipment shall be kept clean and in good repair; and		
30	(6) moisture shall be controlled such that there is no evidence of microbial growth on interior surfaces		
31	and objects.		
32	(f) All liquid and human waste, including floor wash water, shall be disposed of through trapped drains into a public		
33	sanitary sewer system in localities where such system is available. In localities where a public sanitary system is not		
34	available, liquid and human waste shall be disposed of in a manner approved by the state Department of Environment		
35	and Natural Resources.accordance with 15A NCAC 18A .1300 and 15A NCAC 18C.

4	(h) No animals	, except certified assistance animals required to assist disabled individuals, animals shall be allowed	
5	in any area of a	dental office where clinical work is being performed.performed, except service animals in accordance	
6	with GS 168-4.2	2 and the Americans with Disabilities [Act.] Act, or certified facility dogs. For purposes of this Rule, a	
7	"certified facilit	ty dog" shall be defined as a dog that is trained and certified by a program that is accredited by or a	
8	member of Assi	stance Dogs International, Animal Assisted Intervention International, or a similar organization whose	
9	purpose is to p	promote standards of training, placement, and utilization of assistance dogs (an "assistance dog	
10	program"). Whi	le in the dental office, the facility dog shall be handled by a dentist, dental hygienist, dental assistant,	
11	<u>or other employ</u>	ree designated by the dentist who is trained and certified by an assistance dog program.	
12	(i) For purposes	s of this Rule, "clean" means washed and free from dirt, grime, bodily fluids or tissue, foreign material,	
13	or unwanted matter. "Good repair" means capable of being cleaned and used for its intended purpose in a safe manner

4	(a) All instrum	ents or equipment used in the treatment of dental patients shall be sterilized according to manufacturer		
5	specifications usage. All dental health care settings shall follow the most current guidelines on infection control for			
6	the dental office and the dental laboratory adopted by the American Dental Association. Effective control technique			
7	and precautions to prevent the cross contamination and transmission of infection to all persons is the professional			
8	responsibility of all dentists. All licensees are required to maintain and provide a safe, therapeutic environment for			
9	patients and em	ployees and to follow a comprehensive and practical infection control program at all times.		
10	(b) All settings	in which licensees engage in the practice of dentistry or dental hygiene ("dental settings") shall comply		
11	with the recommendations and guidelines of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") for infection			
12	prevention and control directed at or applicable to dental settings. The CDC recommendations and guidelines are			
13	incorporated by reference, including subsequent amendments and editions, and are available at no cost online at			
14	https://www.cdc.gov.			
15	(c) All licensees are responsible for utilizing and maintaining sterilization and infection control techniques and			
16	precautions as required by this Rule to prevent the cross contamination and transmission of infection to all persons.
