The Rules Review Commission staff has completed its review of this Rule prior to the Commission's next meeting. The Commission has not yet reviewed this Rule and therefore there has not been a determination as to whether the Rule will be approved. You may email the reviewing attorney to inquire concerning the staff recommendation.

In reviewing this Rule, the staff recommends the following changes be made:

There is some potential ambiguity in the interaction between (a)(1) through (a)(6). The following three questions relate to that ambiguity.

As written, age groups can be combined unless this rule limits such combination. Is this correct?

Subparagraph (4) appears to be an exception to subparagraph (1) and not a limitation on combining age groups two and older. Stated another way, there is nothing prohibiting placing children aged two and older with older age groups if that staff/child ratio for the youngest child is maintained. Is that correct?

It is unclear whether subparagraph (2) or (6) controls if they conflict. If the agency intends (2) to control consider "<u>except as provided in Subparagraph (2) of this</u> <u>Paragraph</u>, children..."

Paragraph (b) seems to indicate that residential pre-school aged childcare is only licensed for 3 to 12 students and that residential school age childcare is only licensed for 3 to 15 students. Are those limitations elsewhere in rule or statute?

14 in Paragraph (b) of this Rule and children under two years of age are in care, that person shall not concurrently perform

15 food preparation or other duties that are not direct child care responsibilities.

16 (e) When only one caregiver is required to meet the staff/child ratio for a center located in a residence, as described

- 17 in Paragraph (b) of this Rule the operator shall select one of the following options for emergency relief:
- 18 (1) the center shall post the name, address, and telephone number of an adult who has agreed in writing

It appears to me that the second sentence of G.S. 110-86(2)i. is an example of the broader category established in the first sentence, and that this rule clarifies only the second sentence. Is this correct?

Stated another way, "Cooperative arrangements among parents to provide care for their own children as a convenience rather for employment" are statutorily not childcare regardless of whether they address "instructional needs." Is this correct?

- 4 (a) For purposes of this Rule, "cooperative arrangement for instructional needs" means an arrangement between a
- 5 group of parents to provide care for their school-age children in one of the parent's homes for the purpose of
- 6 supervising and facilitating the children's online, virtual, or remote elementary or secondary education instruction.
- 7 (b) Pursuant to G.S. § 110-86(2)(i), cooperative arrangements for instructional needs are not child care and therefore
- 8 are exempt from licensure.

4 (a) There shall be at least 30 square feet inside space per child per the total licensed capacity and 75 100 square

5 feet outside space for one third of the total number of the capacity for which the center is licensed. each child

- 6 using the outdoor learning environment at any one time. In the alternative there shall be at least 35 square feet
- 7 inside space per child per the total licensed capacity and 75 square feet outside space per child for the total licensed
