Guest Speaker: Anthony "Ant" Atkinson, Jr. - Ant is a Wilson native that attended Greenfield School where he blossomed into a basketball player. As an All-American in his Senior season at Barton College, he made an unbelievable game winning shot in the 2007 NCAA Div-2 Championship game. This would cement his legacy as one of the greatest players at Barton College and would make the championship game one of the greatest comebacks in NCAA history. Ant's journey in basketball did not end there. In 2007 Ant joined the historic Harlem Globetrotters, traveling to over 85 countries and impacting the world for good. After 12 years, Ant retired from the Harlem Globetrotters. He is now the Varsity Basketball Coach at Wilson Preparatory Academy, where he also teaches personal finance and career management.
