The Rules Review Commission staff has completed its review of this rule prior to the Commission's next meeting. The Commission has not yet reviewed this rule and therefore there has not been a determination as to whether the rule will be approved. You may call this office to inquire concerning the staff recommendation.

In reviewing these rules, the staff determined that the following technical changes need to be made. Approval of any rule is contingent upon making technical changes as set forth in G.S. 150B-21.10.

In (a), line 4, is the word "additional" necessary? Consider deleting. Also, line 4, how does the regulated public provide "certification to the Board?"

In (a), line 5, which "General Statutes?"

In (a), line 6, add "of continuing education" after "hours."

In lines 6-7, it's not clear if 1 hour is required for controlled substances prescribing practices and 1 hour of controlled substances prescribing for chronic pain management or 1 hour total for both. Please redraft for clarity.

In (b), line 8, should "CME" be spelled out before only using the acronym?

In (b), line 11, consider replacing "that" with "if." In line 12, consider replacing "of" with "from."

In (b), line 16, consider replacing "updates" with "subsequent amendments and editions" to track the language used in 150B-21.6.

In (b), lines 16-17, add commas after "writing" and after "documentation."

In (b)(3), line 22, add a period after "system."

In (c)(1), line 6, add "G.S." before "90-202.11."

Travis Wiggs Commission Counsel In (c)(1), lines 6-7, consider changing "a listing of individuals attending its CME events and credits earned" to "a list of individuals who attended its CME events and earned credits."

In (c)(4), line 15, delete "either."

In (c)(5), lines 20-21, consider adding a comma after "States" and after "abroad."

In History Notes, how does G.S. 90-202.4 (g) grant authority for this rule? "Amended Eff. March 1, 2024" is not accurate.

1 21 NCAC 52.0208 is amended with changes as published in Volume 37:21 NCR 2045 as follows: 2 3 21 NCAC 52 .0208 CONTINUING EDUCATION 4 (a) An additional requirement for issuance of the annual renewal certificate shall be certification to the Board of proof 5 of compliance with the continuing education provisions of the General Statutes. The Board shall notify all podiatrists 6 that 25 hours are required annually, including one hour of controlled substances prescribing practices and controlled 7 substance prescribing for chronic pain management. 8 (b) General CME policy - 25 hours per year as follows: 9 (1) Completion of 25 hours of Continuing Medical Education (CME) is required per year (July 1-June 10 30) for renewal of licensure. CME credits shall not be carried over from the previous licensure year. 11 (2) It shall be the responsibility of the individual podiatrist to ascertain in advance that the courses he 12 or she attends have received proper approval of the certifying organizations, and comply with the Standards, Requirements, and Guidelines for Approval of Sponsors of Continuing Education in 13 14 **Podiatric** Medicine of the Council **Podiatric** Medical Education 15 (http://www.cpme.org/education/content.cfm?ItemNumber=2440&navItemNumber0=2249), 16 including updates. The website may be accessed at no charge. The Board shall respond in writing 17 within 45 days of receipt by the Board of all needed documentation with approval or denial to 18 individuals requesting approval of CME courses and credit hours. Decisions by the Board are the 19 final agency decision and may be appealed as set out in G.S. 150B-23. 20 (3) Certificates of completion of courses other than those sponsored by the NC Foot and Ankle Society 21 (NCF&AS) shall be submitted to the Board online using the Board's contracted electronic continuing education tracking system a CE Broker account which can be established at 22 23 www.cebroker.com and that submission shall be on or before the submission of on a form provided by the Board with the podiatrist's annual license renewal documents. Completion certificates shall 24 25 be typed and contain the following information: 26 (A) Podiatrist's name; 27 (B) Course name, location, and date; 28 (C) Number of hours CME completed; 29 (D) Signature of seminar chairperson; and 30 (E) Name of certifying or sponsoring agency.; and. Confirmation that the Course was either held in person or was synchronous virtual learning. 31 32 (4) A licensed podiatrist participating in the second or third year of a medical residency or fellowship 33 may submit a letter signed by the podiatric residency or fellowship director stating the podiatrist's 34 name and dates of residency. This shall substitute for the 25-credit hour requirement and CME

3	(c) Category 1:	Minimum requirement 20 hours per year, as follows:	
4	(1)	CME credit shall be granted for attendance at educational seminars offered by the NCF&AS. The	
5		number of qualifying hours of continuing education shall be determined and approved by the Board	
6		in advance based on the standards in 90-202.11. NCF&AS shall submit to the Board a listing of	
7		individuals attending its CME events and credits earned.	
8	(2)	CME credit shall be granted for attendance at educational seminars offered by other national, state,	
9		and podiatric education providers, as certified by the Council on Podiatric Medical Education	
10		(CPME) of the American Podiatric Medical Association (APMA). The number of qualifying hours	
11		of continuing education shall be determined and approved by the Board.	
12	(3)	Lecturers shall be granted one hour of credit for each hour of CPME- or APMA- approved lectures	
13		given, but such credit shall be limited to one hour for each discrete topic. A brief summary of the	
14		content of each lecture shall be submitted to the Board for approval.

3		children and other persons dependent upon the podiatrist for daily living supports; or	
4	(2)	An undue hardship (such as active military service or natural disaster).	
5	In such cases,	the Board shall issue a conditional license predicated on the licensee acquiring all of the required	
6	continuing education credits in a mutually-agreeable timeframe, but no later than 24 months after December 31 of the		
7	year following the latest year of license or renewal issuance. Requests for CME waiver shall be received by the Board		
8	before the end of the grace period deadline for license renewal. The Board may require additional information when		
9	necessary to confirm the need for exemption to support the licensee's claim. The Board shall notify the licensee of it		
10	decision in writing within 45 days of receipt by the Board of all needed documentation.
