Thanks for making the edits, and for getting this back to me by the deadline. I know you guys are busy over there. I just have a few follow ups for you.

Rule 52B .0214

In (h)(1), line 10, what do you mean by USDA accredited?

A USDA Accredited veterinarian is a professional veterinarian who has completed formal training from the National Veterinary Accreditation Program (NVAP) in the state in which they are licensed to practice veterinary medicine. This is a commonly used term in the industry.

It may be a common industry term, but that doesn't mean its unambiguous as written in the Rule. Is there a definition in one of your other rules of "USDA Accredited"? If so, a cross-reference would be fine. If not, please state what you mean by "USDA accredited" in the Rule.

Also, when you say "licensed and USDA accredited" do you mean someone licensed in the State of North Carolina, or licensed in any state?

In (h)(1), line 10, what does it mean to perform a "health assessment"?

Per USDA's official website, a welfare assessment conducted by a veterinarian involves 'examining the animals to ensure good health and well-being as well as monitoring for any signs of pain, distress, or suffering.' This is a common and well-understood practice within the industry, as it mirrors the practices used to obtain an official certificate of veterinary inspection for various forms of travel.

Again, just because it is a common industry term doesn't mean that it's clear in the Rule. The term needs to be defined, either in your own words, or with an incorporation by reference (pursuant to G.S. 150B-21.6) of a "code, standard, or regulation" adopted by USDA.

Rule 52J .0903

In (c)(1), line 9, this seems to repeat (b), and moreover, it doesn't seem to be a criteria for evaluation, given that an incomplete application is merely returned to the applicant, rather than denied.

Changes made.

The change was to say "the provision of the documents required by 02 NCAC 52J .0902(a)(3) when applicable". A few questions:

What do you mean by "the provision of the documents"?

Did you mean .0902(b)(3)?

When would those documents not be applicable? .0902(b)(3) requires the applicant to provide documentation related to either a violation or a disaster, the two bases for receiving funds. Is there a situation when that documentation wouldn't be required?

With respect to statutory authority, are rabbits considered livestock under Ch. 106? I see that G.S. 106-317 gives the Board the authority to establish a system of health certificated and permits "for the better protection of the swine and livestock of this State", but I am not sure whether rabbits fall under the definition of "livestock".

The Board has a historically recognized authority to require health certificates for the importation any animal into the State that poses a risk of disease to swine, poultry, or livestock within the State. This authority is not limited to regulating the importation of swine or livestock. G.S. 106-317 states "The North Carolina Board of Agriculture under the authority of this section may by regulation establish a system of health certificates and permits for the better protection of the swine and livestock of this State." This authority to require health certificates is not limited to requiring the permits for "swine and livestock," but instead requires only that this system of health certificates be "for the better protection of swine and livestock." Therefore, the Board has authority to require a health certificate or permit on any animal entering the state that may pose a risk of infectious disease and threaten the swine and livestock industries. This authority is both well established and critical to protecting both the essential food sources and economic benefits to the State represented by these industries.

The Board's authority to promulgate rules to eradicate and prevent animal disease in the State by limiting or restricting the import of animals into the State is well established. This rule addressing the importation of wild animals was adopted in 1984, with subsequent amendments in 1992, 1996, and 1998, as well as approved temporary and permanent amendment in 2002.

G.S. 106-348 states that "The Commissioner of Agriculture, by and with the consent of the State Board of Agriculture, shall have full power to promulgate and enforce such rules and regulations as may be necessary to control and eradicate tuberculosis."

- G.S. 106-361 states that "The Commissioner of Agriculture, by and with the consent of the State Board of Agriculture, shall have full power to promulgate and enforce such rules and regulations that may hereafter be necessary to complete tick eradication in North Carolina."
- G.S. 106-388 states that "It is hereby declared that the disease of animals known as brucellosis, or Bang's disease, is of an infectious and contagious nature, and <u>animals</u> affected with, or exposed to, or suspected of being carriers of the disease, shall be subject to quarantine and the rules and regulations of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services."
- G.S. 106-396 states that "The Commissioner of Agriculture, by and with the consent of the State Board of Agriculture, shall have full power to promulgate and enforce such rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of G.S. 106-388 to 106-398, and for the effective control and eradication of brucellosis, including the establishment of fees and charges for the collection of blood samples."
- G.S. 106-405.17 states that "The State Board of Agriculture shall have <u>full</u> <u>power</u> to promulgate and enforce such rules and regulations as it deems necessary for the control and eradication of equine infectious anemia."
- In (b), line 13, consider a cross reference to Rule .0202 for the contents and procedures for obtaining an official health certificate.

Yes, it is the date on the official health certificate which is written by an accredited veterinarian.

In (h), please correct several formatting errors. Please see 26 NCAC 02C .0108 for OAH's formatting rule. Specifically, the text should be 1.5 spaced and justified. Also, please fix the indents on (h)(1) and (2).

In (h)(1), line 10, what do you mean by USDA accredited?

A USDA Accredited veterinarian is a professional veterinarian who has completed formal training from the National Veterinary Accreditation Program (NVAP) in the state in which they are licensed to practice veterinary medicine. This is a commonly used term in the industry.

In (h)(1), line 10, what does it mean to perform a "health assessment"?

Per USDA's official website, a welfare assessment conducted by a veterinarian involves 'examining the animals to ensure good health and well-being as well as monitoring for any signs of pain, distress, or suffering.' This is a common and well-understood practice within the industry, as it mirrors the practices used to obtain an official certificate of veterinary inspection for various forms of travel.

In (h)(1), line 11, what does "other origins" mean? Other than what?

Changes made.

In (h)(1), line 12, is there a difference between a symptom that is "consistent with" the virus, and a symptom "of" the virus?

In the case of medical diagnoses and veterinary care, the term 'consistent with' in referring to symptoms means that the patient or animal is displaying symptoms commonly observed with said illness, but it has not been officially diagnosed. For example, lab cultures, blood or tissue samples, etc. may need to be taken to officially diagnose a specific illness, however, that animal can be observed as being 'unwell' with symptoms consistent with that illness, which warrant cautionary behavior so as to prevent the early onset of a sickness from spreading among others. This is a commonly utilized practice in veterinary care to minimize the potential spread of illness or disease when observed.

In (h)(1), line 12, add a hyphen between "RHDV" and "2".

I'm sorry I missed your call earlier. In answer to your question, yes, the deadline for your responses to my requests for changes is November 1. The 70 days mentioned in the statute binds the Commission, not the agency. So the Commission has to either approve, object, or hold a public hearing within 70 days of the extension.

If you can't make the November 1 deadline, you really have two options. You could withdraw the rules from Commission review. Otherwise, I will have to issue staff opinions recommending objection to any rules that don't meet the 150B-21.9 criteria.
