#### Hi Dennis,

Thanks for your edits. I have a few minor follow ups on several of these Rules. Also, with respect to the rules you're withdrawing, if you could, please just email me separately (copying Alex) saying that you'd like to withdraw those rules, so it's crystal clear to anyone reviewing our online agenda that these rules were withdrawn.

I'm recommending approval of Rules 06U .0101, .0107, .0109, .0110, 06Z .0102, .0104, .0105, .0107, .0108 (see below), and .0109.

#### 060.0201

I think the language in 060 .0101 addresses my concerns vis a vis "presumptive". I would urge you to change the citation to Chapter 86A in Rule .0101; I think this is something you can do through the Codifier under 150B-21.5(a).

Looking at your edits with respect to "owner or manager," I have some concerns with "manager". I don't see that term anywhere else in your statutes or rules. Especially given the Commission's objections over that term in the last batch of temporary rules, I think out of caution I'd suggest omitting it here. And in fact, I think I'd conform (b) to the rest of the rules and just say "the program" rather than "the owner or manager".

#### 06U .0106

To be clear, the program submits the application for a student permit, not the student? I had assumed the student would file the application, and in fact 06Z .0101(a) says the student will submit the application required by this Rule.

#### 06U .0108

With respect to (a)(3), I think I'm still unclear on what is being required, and maybe that's because my change request was unclear itself. The statute requires inspector applicants to have taken "at least one hour" of CE. You already require 10 CEUs per license period in 06Y .101. My question is, does the instructor applicant just need 11 CEUs in any topic, or does that 1 extra hour of CE to meet the statutory requirement have to be on any particular topic relevant to instructing?

#### 06Z .0101

This touches on 06U .0106 as well. There's a conflict here between (a) and (c). In (a), the Rule says the student will file the application, and in (c), the rule says the program will file the application. Please clarify and revise. Also check any other rule referring to this application to make sure they're consistent.

#### 06Z .0103

The incorporation by reference unfortunately has to follow the formula in 21.6 pretty closely. I'd suggest this: "No animals shall be permitted in an electrology facility except service animals as defined by 28 CFR 36.104, which is hereby

incorporated by reference including subsequent amendments and editions, and is available at [insert URL here] for no cost."

#### 06Z .0106

I think the word "authorization" is ok, but I was thinking more concretely. What is the thing that you're issuing? A letter? Verbal authorization? I think something like "the Board shall issue <u>written</u> authorization..." would work if you haven't decided what form you're going to use.

#### 06Z .0108

Just to clarify, the instructor has to make the monthly attestation that the hours are correct, but the instructor or the owner can make the final notarized statement that the hours are accurate, correct? As long as that's correct, I can recommend approval.

#### 06Z .0110

Just like in .0106, I was thinking more concretely about "an approval". What is the thing you're issuing? Like .0106, I think "the Board shall issue <u>written</u> approval" might work.
