The Rules Review Commission staff has completed its review of this Rule prior to the Commission's next meeting. The Commission has not yet reviewed this Rule and therefore there has not been a determination as to whether the Rule will be approved. You may email the reviewing attorney to inquire concerning the staff recommendation.

In reviewing this Rule, the staff recommends the following changes be made:

In Paragraph (a), please use an active verb. For instance, "Applicants who apply prior to July 1, 2022, shall complete a graduate counseling experience, which shall consist of the following separate courses:".

Is the requirement for 17 hours in Subparagraph (a)(3) in conflict with the requirement of 300 hours later in the same Paragraph?

Please bring Paragraph (b) over the left margin. Also, delete the space between "N." and "C.". Similar to the request above, use an active verb: "applicants who apply ... shall complete a graduate counseling experience, which shall...". Also, NC Gen. Stat. 90-336(b2) requires something different than what has been stated in Paragraph (b). Please explain how a difference is justified. Finally, the requirements in Subparagraph (b)(1) are unclear. If the current standards change after an applicant has finished his or her education, would they be held to the new standards?

On page 2, lines 1 through 4, the different items should be separated by simi-colons, except for "marriage, couple, and family practices". Otherwise this is unclear.

The final sentence of Paragraph (b), lines 4 through 7, appears to fit better in Paragraph (c) than (b). Also, it needs to be stated: "An applicant shall..."

If Paragraph (c) sets out the requirements for a Form, the contents of the form must be stated, along with what would happen if any part is left blank. Would that be regarded as an incomplete form? What happens then?

Please fix the formatting (tab) for Paragraph (c). It should be similar to Paragraph (a).

In the History Note, Authority, G.S. "90-334(h), (i)" should be split out into "90-334(h), 90-334(i)".

Please retype the rule accordingly and resubmit it to our office electronically.

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In reviewing this Rule, the staff recommends the following changes be made:

In the first paragraph, please use an active verb: "The Board shall grant a license..." Also, please delete "as applicable".

In Subitem (1)(b), things that "should be provided" are not requirements and do no belong in a rule. Either change the first sentence to a requirement or delete.

In Subitem (1)(h)(vii), page 4, line 8, move the comma from after "and" to after "interpreting".

Subitem (1)(i)(v), page 4, line 20, should end with a period, not "; or".

In Item (2), what happens if the requirements of this part of the Rule conflict with CACREP? Should this be incorporated by reference?

Each item in Subitems (2)(a) through (k) should begin with a lower-case letter. Also, add a comma after "theories" in Subitem (c).

Delete "; and" in both Subitem (2)(k) and Item (3).

The last paragraph of the Rule, if it merely states what is required by Rule .0208, is unnecessary and should be deleted.
