

EXPLANATION OF THE PUBLICATION SCHEDULE

This Publication Schedule is prepared by the Office of Administrative Hearings as a public service and the computation of time periods are not to be deemed binding or controlling. Time is computed according to 26 NCAC 2B .0103 and the Rules of Civil Procedure, Rule 6.

GENERAL

- The North Carolina Register shall be published twice a month and contains the following information submitted for publication by a state agency:
- (1) temporary rules;
 - (2) notices of rule-making proceedings;
 - (3) text of proposed rules;
 - (4) text of permanent rules approved by the Rules Review Commission;
 - (5) notices of receipt of a petition for municipal incorporation, as required by G.S. 120-165;
 - (6) Executive Orders of the Governor;
 - (7) final decision letters from the U.S. Attorney General concerning changes in laws affecting voting in a jurisdiction subject of Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as required by G.S. 120-30.9H;
 - (8) orders of the Tax Review Board issued under G.S. 105-241.2; and
 - (9) other information the Codifier of Rules determines to be helpful to the public.

COMPUTING TIME: In computing time in the schedule, the day of publication of the North Carolina Register is not included. The last day of the period so computed is included, unless it is a Saturday, Sunday, or State holiday, in which event the period runs until the preceding day which is not a Saturday, Sunday, or State holiday.

FILING DEADLINES

ISSUE DATE: The Register is published on the first and fifteen of each month if the first or fifteenth of the month is not a Saturday, Sunday, or State holiday for employees mandated by the State Personnel Commission. If the first or fifteenth of any month is a Saturday, Sunday, or a holiday for State employees, the North Carolina Register issue for that day will be published on the day of that month closest to (either before or after) the first or fifteenth respectively that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or holiday for State employees.

LAST DAY FOR FILING: The last day for filing for any issue is 15 days before the issue date excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays for State employees.

NOTICE OF RULE-MAKING PROCEEDINGS

END OF COMMENT PERIOD TO A NOTICE OF RULE-MAKING PROCEEDINGS: This date is 60 days from the issue date. An agency shall accept comments on the notice of rule-making proceeding until the text of the proposed rules is published, and the text of the proposed rule shall not be published until at least 60 days after the notice of rule-making proceedings was published.

EARLIEST REGISTER ISSUE FOR PUBLICATION OF TEXT: The date of the next issue following the end of the comment period.

NOTICE OF TEXT

EARLIEST DATE FOR PUBLIC HEARING: The hearing date shall be at least 15 days after the date a notice of the hearing is published.

END OF REQUIRED COMMENT PERIOD
(1) RULE WITH NON-SUBSTANTIAL ECONOMIC IMPACT: An agency shall accept comments on the text of a proposed rule for at least 30 days after the text is published or until the date of any public hearings held on the proposed rule, whichever is longer.

(2) RULE WITH SUBSTANTIAL ECONOMIC IMPACT: An agency shall accept comments on the text of a proposed rule published in the Register and that has a substantial economic impact requiring a fiscal note under G.S. 150B-21.4(b1) for at least 60 days after publication or until the date of any public hearing held on the rule, whichever is longer.

DEADLINE TO SUBMIT TO THE RULES REVIEW COMMISSION: The Commission shall review a rule submitted to it on or before the twentieth of a month by the last day of the next month.

FIRST LEGISLATIVE DAY OF THE NEXT REGULAR SESSION OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY: This date is the first legislative day of the next regular session of the General Assembly following approval of the rule by the Rules Review Commission. See G.S. 150B-21.3, Effective date of rules.

Dear Mr. Holec:

This refers to the September 9, 1996, annexation to the City of Lumberton in Robeson County, North Carolina, submitted to the Attorney General pursuant to Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act, 42 U.S.C. 1973c. We received your submission on September 19, 1996.

The Attorney General does not interpose any objection to the specified changes. However, we note that Section 5 expressly provides that the failure of the Attorney General to object does not bar subsequent litigation to enjoin the enforcement of the changes. In addition, as authorized by Section 5, we reserve the right to reexamine these submissions if additional information that would otherwise require an objection comes to our attention during the remainder of the sixty-day review period. See the Procedures for the Administration of Section 5 (28 C.F.R. 51.41 and 51.43).

Reason for Proposed Action: Medicaid pays Part B Premium for approximately 200,000 dual eligible recipients. Medicaid pays the co-insurance and deductible on claims filed to Medicare for this category of recipients. Medicare pays 80% of the cost of care on this category of recipients. Medicaid pays 20% (co-insurance and deductible) on this category of recipients. At the present Medicare makes recoupments from providers that serve this category of recipients using a Disproportionate Stratified Random Sampling Technique. Medicaid is unable to recoup the (20% co-insurance and deductible) on these claims because our present rule states that the "Agency will use a Disproportionate Stratified Random Sampling Technique in establishing provider overpayments only for repeat offenders." This needs to include first time offenders also. Approximately 65% of all Medicaid funds are federal moneys. These payments amount to millions of dollars.

SECTION .0700 - ADMINISTRATIVE SANCTIONS AND RECOUPMENT

.0707 TECHNIQUE FOR PROJECTING MEDICAID OVERPAYMENTS

(a) The Medicaid agency will seek restitution of overpayments made to providers by the Medicaid program.

(b) The agency will may use a Disproportionate Stratified Random Sampling Technique in establishing provider overpayments. overpayments only for repeat offenders.

(c) This technique is an extrapolation of a statistical sampling of claims used to determine the total overpayment for recoupment.

(d) The provider may challenge the validity of the findings in the SAMPLE itself in accordance with the provisions found at Rule .0402 and .0403.

SECTION .0200 - STRIPED BASS

**.0204 SEASON, SIZE AND HARVEST LIMIT:
ATLANTIC OCEAN**

(a) It is unlawful to possess striped bass taken from the Atlantic Ocean less than ~~28 inches total length~~ the size limit as determined by the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission in their Interstate Fisheries Management Plan for striped bass. The Fisheries Director shall issue proclamations necessary to bring North Carolina's size limit in compliance with the Interstate Fisheries Management Plan.

~~(b) It is unlawful to possess more than two striped bass per person per day taken from the Atlantic Ocean by hook-and-line.~~

~~(c)~~(b) It is unlawful to buy, sell, transport, or possess striped bass from the Atlantic Ocean by any means except that the Fisheries Director may establish an open season at any time, and is further empowered to impose any or all of the following restrictions:

- (1) Specify number of days,
- (2) Specify areas,
- (3) Specify means and methods which may be employed in the taking,
- (4) Specify time period,
- (5) Limit the quantity taken by commercial gear, and quantity, both commercially and recreationally, and
- (6) Provide for biological sampling of fish harvested.

Authority G.S. 113-134; 113-182; 113-221; 143B-289.4.

Notice is hereby given in accordance with G.S. 150B-21.2 that the North Carolina Wildlife Commission intends to amend rule cited as 15A NCAC 10B .0116. Notice of Rule-making Proceedings was published in the Register on September 16, 1996.

SUBCHAPTER 10B - HUNTING AND TRAPPING

SECTION .0100 - GENERAL REGULATIONS

.0116 PERMITTED ARCHERY EQUIPMENT

(a) Only longbows, recurved bows, and compound bows having a minimum pull of 45 pounds may be used for taking game. It is unlawful to use a crossbow or any other type of bow equipped with any device by which the bow can be set at full or partial pull and released by a trigger or any similar mechanism without a disabled sportsman's crossbow hunting permit issued by the Executive Director.

(b) Only arrows with a fixed minimum broadhead width of seven-eighths of an inch ~~or a mechanically opening broadhead with a width of at least seven-eighths inch in the open position~~ and that do not open mechanically upon impact may be used for taking bear, deer, wild boar or wild turkey. Blunt-type arrow heads may be used in taking small animals and birds including, but not limited to, rabbits, squirrels, quail, grouse and pheasants. Poisonous, drugged, barbed, or explosive arrowheads may not be used for taking any game.

(c) Crossbows used under a disabled sportsman's crossbow permit shall have a minimum pull rated at least 150 pounds. Heads on bolts used with crossbows shall conform to those described for arrows in Paragraph (b) of this Rule.

Reason for Proposed Action: 21 NCAC 54 .1802 - to amend educational requirements at the Psychological Associate level. 21 NCAC 54 .1803 - to amend educational requirements at the Licensed Psychologist level. 21 NCAC 54 .2001 - to clarify requirements for supervisors. 21 NCAC 54 .2002 - to clarify the nature of supervision. 21 NCAC 54 .2003 - to repeal contracting and reporting provisions. 21 NCAC 54 .2004 - to repeal time requirements. 21 NCAC 54 .2005 - to repeal provision for alternate supervision proposals. 21 NCAC 54 .2007 - to clarify supervision for applicants and other nonlicensed individual. 21 NCAC 54 .2008 - to establish supervision requirements for Psychological Associate licensure. 21 NCAC 54 .2009 - to establish supervision requirements for Psychologist licensure.

.1802 PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSOCIATE

(a) ~~Licensure for the level of psychological associate requires a master's degree in psychology.~~

(b) ~~Any person in the regular employ of the State of North Carolina or whose employment is included under the State Personnel Act who has served in a position involving the practice of psychology for five consecutive years by December 31, 1984, may apply under a master's equivalency provision. Ordinarily, 30 semester hours in graduate level psychology courses or courses documentable as psychological in nature will be considered to meet the equivalency requirement. A maximum of 6 semester hours will be allowed for dissertation/thesis and 6 semester hours for internship/practicum. If the graduate training did not include a practicum or internship, work experience supervised by a~~

licensed or licensable psychologist may be substituted for such. The master's equivalency is also further delineated in the following manner:

- (1) ~~12 semester hours in courses drawn from General Psychology, Social, Experimental, Physiological, Developmental, History or Systems);~~
- (2) ~~6 semester hours in Statistics and Research Design;~~
- (3) ~~12 semester hours in a Specialty Area, which includes course work in theories or methods relevant to practice in the specialty or area of emphasis and may include practicum and internship;~~

See 21 NCAC 54 .1801(c) for documentation information.

(a) Licensure for the level of psychological associate requires a master's degree or specialist degree in psychology from an institution of higher education. For individuals applying before January 1, 1999, the degree program shall be publicly identified and clearly labeled as a psychology program. For individuals applying on or after January 1, 1999, their degree program shall meet all of the following requirements:

- (1) The program shall be publicly identified and clearly labeled as a psychology program; such a program shall specify in pertinent institutional catalogues its intent to educate and train psychologists to engage in the activities which constitute the practice of psychology as defined in G.S. 90-270.2(8).
- (2) The program shall maintain clear authority and primary responsibility for the core and specialty areas whether or not the program crosses administrative lines.
- (3) The program shall have an identifiable body of students in residence at the institution who are matriculated in that program for a degree.
- (4) There shall be an identifiable full-time psychology faculty in residence at the institution, sufficient in size and breadth to carry out its responsibilities, employed by and providing instruction at the home campus of the institution.
- (5) There shall be a psychologist responsible for the applicant's program either as the administrative head of the program, or as the advisor, major professor, or committee chair for the individual applicant's program.
- (6) The program shall be an integrated, organized sequence of study in psychology as demonstrated by an identifiable curriculum track or tracks wherein course sequences are outlined.
- (7) The program shall encompass the equivalent of a minimum of one academic year of full-time graduate study in student residence at the institution from which the degree is granted. Residence requires interaction with psychology faculty and other matriculated psychology students. One year's residency is defined as 30 semester hours taken on a full-time or part-time basis at the insti-

tion.

- (8) The program shall include internship, externship, practicum, or other field experience appropriate to the area of specialty and the practice of psychology. This experience shall meet all of the following criteria:
 - (A) It shall have been a planned and directed program of training in the practice of psychology, in contrast to on-the-job training, and shall have provided the trainee with a planned and directed sequence of training integrated with the educational program in which the individual was enrolled. This training shall have been planned by the program's faculty, rather than the student.
 - (B) The training site shall have had a clearly designated and appropriately licensed or certified psychologist who was responsible for the integrity and quality of the training program.
 - (C) The training shall have been a minimum of 12 weeks and 500 hours of supervised training. At least 50% of the training shall have been spent in the practice of psychology.
 - (D) The training program shall have had a written program description detailing its functioning and shall have been approved by the applicant's educational program prior to its occurrence.
 - (E) The training site staff shall have provided a minimum of one hour per week of individual face-to-face, regularly scheduled supervision with the specific intent of overseeing the practice of psychology.
 - (F) Supervision may have been provided in part by psychiatrists, social workers, or other related professionals qualified by the training site, but at least 50% of supervision shall have been provided by an appropriately licensed or certified psychologist or psychological associate, or other psychologist who is exempt from licensure under the North Carolina Psychology Practice Act.
 - (G) Persons enrolled in the training shall have been designated as "interns", "externs", or "practicum students", or hold other designation which clearly indicated training status.
- (9) The program of study shall include a minimum of 45 semester hours of graduate study in standard psychology courses, including courses drawn from academic psychology (e.g., social, experimental, physiological, developmental, history and systems), statistics and research design, and a specialty area. Of the required 45 semester program hours, not more than 6 semester hours shall be credited for internship/practicum and not more

than 6 semester hours shall be credited for thesis/dissertation.

(b) (c) An applicant whose credentials have been approved by the Board for examination at the practicing licensed psychologist level may be issued a license as a psychological associate if the applicant fails an examination at the practicing licensed psychologist level but passes such at the psychological associate level. To receive this license, the applicant must shall make a written request to the Board for licensure at the psychological associate level within 30 days from the date on which the applicant is notified of his/her examination score.

.1803 LICENSED PSYCHOLOGIST

(a) This rule applies to all practicing psychologist applicants making application after July 1, 1989, except those applicants who meet all the following requirements:

- (1) were enrolled in doctoral training programs on or before December 31, 1987, and
- (2) received their doctoral degree after July 1, 1987, but on or before July 1, 1993, and
- (3) make application on or before July 1, 1993.

Practicing Psychologist applicants meeting all the requirements specified in Subparagraphs (a)(1), (a)(2), and (a)(3) of this Rule shall be considered under Rule .1801 Practicing Psychologist Requirements as of June 30, 1987.

(a) (b) Licensure for the level of psychologist requires a doctoral degree based on a planned and directed program of studies in psychology from an institution of higher education, accredited by one of the regional accrediting bodies recognized by the Council on Postsecondary Accreditation is required. For individuals applying before January 1, 1999, their doctoral program shall meet the requirements of Paragraph (b) of this Rule. For applicants applying on or after January 1, 1999, their doctoral program shall meet the requirements of Paragraph (c) of this Rule.

(b) The For an individual applying before January 1, 1999, the applicant's doctoral program must shall be one which was fully accredited by the American Psychological Association throughout the period of the applicant's enrollment in at the time of the applicant's graduation from the program, one which was designated by the Joint Designation Committee of the Association of State and Provincial Psychology Boards and National Register of Health Service Providers in Psychology at the time of the applicant's graduation from the program, or one which meets all of the following requirements: requirements, as determined by the board and documented in a format specified by the board:

- (1) The program program, wherever it may be administratively housed, must shall be publicly identified and clearly labeled as a psychology program; such a program must shall specify in pertinent institutional catalogues and brochures its intent to educate and train psychologists, to engage in the activities which constitute the practice of psychology as defined in G.S. 90-270.2(8).

- (2) The program must stand as a recognizable, coherent organizational entity within the institution.
- (2) (3) The program must shall maintain clear authority and primary responsibility for the core and specialty areas whether or not the program crosses administrative lines.
- (3) (4) The program must shall have an identifiable body of students in residence at the institution who are matriculated in that program for a degree.
- (4) (5) There must shall be an identifiable full-time psychology faculty in residence at the institution, sufficient in size and breadth to carry out its responsibilities, employed by and providing instruction and/or program coordination at the home campus of the institution.
- (5) (6) There must shall be a psychologist responsible for the applicant's program either as the administrative head of the program, or as the advisor, major professor, or committee chair for the individual applicant's program.
- (6) (7) The program in psychology must shall be an integrated, organized sequence of study in psychology as demonstrated by an identifiable curriculum track or tracks wherein course sequences are outlined.
- (7) (8) The program must shall encompass the equivalent of a minimum of three academic years of full-time graduate academic study, two years of which are at the institution from which the degree is granted, and one year of which is in residence at the institution from which the degree is granted, granted, or its equivalent. Residence requires interaction with psychology faculty and other matriculated psychology students, students, one One year's residence or its equivalent are is defined as follows: 30 semester hours taken on a full-time or part-time basis at the institution.
 - (A) 30 semester hours taken on a full-time or part-time basis at the institution, or
 - (B) a minimum of 300 hours of student-faculty contact involving face-to-face individual or group educational meetings. Such educational meetings must include both faculty-student and student-student interaction; be conducted by the psychology faculty of the institution at least 90% of the time, be fully documented by the applicant and the institution, and relate substantially to the program components specified in Subparagraphs (b)(9), (b)(10), and (b)(11) of this Rule. The institution must clearly document how the applicant's performance is assessed and evaluated.
- (8) (9) The program must shall include practicum, internship, field experiences, or laboratory training appropriate to the area of specialty and the practice of psychology; this experience must shall be

supervised by a psychologist.

(9) ~~(10)~~ The program of study must shall include a minimum of ~~60~~ 75 semester hours of graduate study in standard psychology courses ~~except as allowed in this Subparagraph. These hours will include~~ including instruction in scientific and professional ethics and standards, research design and methodology, statistics and psychometrics, and the specialty area. Of the required 75 semester program hours, not more than 6 semester hours shall be credited for internship/practicum and not more than 6 semester hours shall be credited for thesis/dissertation. No credit shall be allowed for audited courses or courses taken at an institution which does not meet the definition of an "institution of higher education" as defined by G.S. 90-270.2(5). A maximum of six semester hours will be allowed for internship/practicum and a maximum of six semester hours will be allowed for thesis/dissertation. If the applicant wishes to utilize selected course work from other than psychology departments or programs toward meeting the minimum course hour requirements and/or curricular requirements specified in this Subparagraph and in Subparagraph (b)(11), evidence must be provided, in a form specified by the board, that such courses are relevant to the applicant's organized sequence of study or that they are psychological in nature. This evidence shall consist of:

(10) ~~(11)~~ Ordinarily, the The program must shall include demonstrated competency in the four substantive content areas identified in this Subparagraph; typically, this will shall be met through a minimum of three semester hours in each of these content areas:

- (A) biological bases of behavior (e.g., physiological psychology, comparative psychology, neuropsychology, sensation and perception, psychopharmacology);
- (B) cognitive-affective bases of behavior (e.g., cognition, memory, learning, thinking, motivation, emotion);
- (C) social bases of behavior (e.g., social psychology, group processes, organizational and systems theory, cultural and ethnic bases, sex roles);

(D) individual differences (e.g., personality theory, human development, abnormal psychology, individual differences).

- (1) a licensed practicing psychologist, permanent;
- ~~(2) professionals other than psychologists, in keeping with Rule .2005 in this Section;~~
- ~~(2)~~ (3) any person who was in a psychology position with the State of North Carolina on December 31, 1979, and who is still so employed, provided that such supervision is, and was on December 31, 1979, within the psychologist's regular job description and is only for activities which are part of the regular duties and responsibilities of the supervisee within ~~his/her~~ his or her regular position at a state ~~State~~ agency or department; or
- ~~(3)~~ (4) a doctoral level licensed psychologist who is licensed in the state or province ~~jurisdiction~~ where the supervisee is practicing psychology. ~~psychology; or~~
- ~~(5) an individual who, although not licensed as a psychologist, is, in the opinion of the Board, trained as a psychologist;~~

(b) The Board may disapprove an otherwise qualified supervisor for the following reasons: ~~any psychological associate or practicing psychologist, temporary, if the potential supervisor, in the opinion of the Board, is not acceptable. Reasons for which a proposed supervisory relationship may be disapproved shall include, but not be limited to:~~

- (1) evidence that the potential supervisor is not competent or qualified to supervise the supervisee;
- (2) evidence that the supervisor has failed to adhere to legal or ethical standards;
- (3) evidence that there is a lack of congruence between the potential supervisor's training, experience, and area of practice and the supervisee's proposed area(s) of practice; or

- (4) evidence that the supervisor has an encumbered license.

~~(c) It is the supervisor's responsibility to provide the best possible professional guidance which is mutually beneficial to both the supervisee and to the public which he/she ultimately serves. It is the supervisor who serves as a primary professional guardian of the supervisee, the profession, and the public. Supervisors are to carefully assess their own ability to meet the particular needs of potential supervisees. It is expected that the professional expertise and experience of the supervisor will parallel the expected practice of the supervisee. Should there be some areas in which the supervisor does not feel so qualified, adjunct supervisors shall be sought, although this additional supervision is, in no way, to replace the overall responsibility of the primary supervisor. Clear professional goals shall be set by the supervisor and supervisee for, and during, the period of supervision and these goals must be evaluated on a regular basis.~~

~~(c) Each supervisor shall:~~

- ~~(1) serve as a primary professional guardian of the supervisee, the profession, and the public;~~
- ~~(2) carefully assess his or her own ability to meet the supervisory needs of potential supervisees;~~
- ~~(3) offer and provide supervision only within the supervisor's own area(s) of competence and assure that the professional expertise and experience of the supervisor parallel the practice of the supervisee;~~
- ~~(4) enter into a written agreement with the supervisee on a Board adopted supervision contract form which details the supervisee's obligations as well as the supervisor's responsibilities to the supervisee;~~
- ~~(5) direct the supervisee to practice psychology only within areas for which he or she shall be qualified by education, training, or supervised experience;~~
- ~~(6) determine that the supervisee has given notice as appropriate to clients or patients that he or she shall be supervised as a trainee, applicant, or licensee, has given indication that clinical information may be discussed with the supervisor, and has given indication of the means by which the supervisor may be contacted;~~
- ~~(7) establish and maintain a level of supervisory contact consistent with established professional standards, be accessible to the supervisee, and be accountable in the event that professional, ethical, or legal issues are raised pertaining to the supervised practice;~~
- ~~(8) direct the supervisee to keep the supervisor informed of services performed by the supervisee;~~
- ~~(9) advise the Board if any complaints about the supervisee are received which indicate problems in the supervisee's competence to practice psychology or adherence to ethical standards or legal requirements, or if the supervisor has reason to believe~~

that the supervisee is practicing in a manner which indicates that ethical or legal violations have been committed;

- ~~(10) maintain supervisory records including dates of supervision, length of sessions, and issues discussed;~~
- ~~(11) report on the required form to the Board that agreed upon supervision has occurred; and~~
- ~~(12) file a final supervision report within two weeks of termination of supervision.~~

~~(d) In order to To maintain the professional nature of the supervision, a familial or strongly personal relationship shall not exist between the supervisor and supervisee, except in extra-ordinary extraordinary circumstances, such as the unavailability lack of availability of any other qualified supervisor. In such cases, the Board may shall require documentation that no other supervision is available and reference letters from colleagues commenting on the appropriateness of the proposed supervisory relationship.~~

(a) The nature of mandated supervision shall depend depends on the specific areas of practice, experience, and training germane to the area of specialty of the supervisee. The purpose of required supervision shall not be for training the supervisee in additional skills, methods, or interventions. ~~(b) Each supervisee shall:~~

- ~~(1) attend scheduled supervision sessions;~~
- ~~(2) provide the supervisor with a disclosure of psychological services being offered or rendered by the supervisee;~~
- ~~(3) cooperate with the supervisor to assure that all conditions in Paragraph (c) of Rule .2001 of this Section are met;~~
- ~~(4) notify the Board if he or she has reason to believe that the supervisor has behaved in a manner which shall indicate that the supervisor has committed an ethical or legal violation; and~~
- ~~(5) file a revised supervision contract form within 30~~

days of the change in the conditions specified in the supervision contract form on file with the Board.

(c) The supervisee and his/her supervisor are ~~expected to shall~~ determine jointly which cases, issues, and techniques are most appropriate and necessary for supervision. ~~supervision, although both parties are fully accountable for all professional activities in terms of adequate standards of care and adherence to other relevant ethics principles. Specific supervision is shall not be mandated for each person evaluated or treated, or for every treatment, evaluative technique, or professional activity undertaken. Contract supervisors Supervisors are shall not be required to sign or co-sign reports, treatment plans, letters, or other clinical documents for which the supervisee may shall be fully or in part responsible; neither is shall it be necessary that such clinical documents reflect the supervisory process. Agencies shall not are not, of course, be precluded from requiring supervisor signatures or co-signatures.~~

A new contract form must be filed within 30 days after a substantial change concerning supervision occurs.~~

(b) ~~It is the responsibility of a supervisor to report on the appropriate form to the Board that agreed upon supervision has occurred. In addition, a supervisor must inform the Board when supervision terminates and file a final report. If not receiving supervision, it is the responsibility of the psychological associate or practicing psychologist, temporary, to report such on the appropriate form to the Board. Reports are required annually at license renewal time for psychological associates and semiannually during June and at license renewal time for practicing psychologists, temporary.~~

(c) ~~Additional monitoring and reporting to the Board may be required in cases where previous evaluations or other information (e.g. reference letters, ethical complaints, etc.) suggest possible problems in the supervisee's competence or adherence to ethical standards. Additional documentation or an interview may be required when questions arise regarding the supervisee's practice due to information supplied or omitted on supervision contract forms and reports or when required forms are not filed with the Board.~~

additional activities that require supervision:

(c) Exemptions. The following licensees are exempt from requirements specified in this Rule:

- (1) practicing psychologists, temporary, who are not presently involved in the practice of psychology. When such is the case, the Board will place the psychologist on inactive status, during which time the license must be kept renewed. In order to reactivate the license, the practicing psychologist, temporary, must arrange to receive supervision and file the appropriate section of a supervision contract form with the Board;
- (2) psychological associates whose professional practice is limited to activities other than overall personality appraisal or classification, personality counseling or personality readjustment techniques;
- (3) psychological associates who are employed by the State Department of Public Instruction or local boards of education, and whose professional activities are limited only to those for which they are employed by those agencies. This exemption does not apply to those individuals who contract with the Department of Public Instruction or local boards of education for the delivery of psychological services in the schools.

.2005 ALTERNATE SUPERVISION REQUIREMENTS

(a) In lieu of the requirements for supervision of psychological associates stated in Rule .2004 in this Section, governmental agencies and/or private organizations involved in the practice of psychology may submit alternative supervision plans for one or more psychological associates. To be approved by the Board, the applicant agency or organization must demonstrate that such alternative supervision plans meet one of the following conditions:

- (1) that compliance with the standard supervision requirements would constitute a significant hardship; or
- (2) that the alternative plan would provide significantly superior supervision;

(b) If one of the conditions stated in Paragraph (a) of this Rule can be met, then supervision from another psychological associate, a licensed practicing psychologist, temporary, or a professional from a related discipline may be acceptable if the Board concurs that this supervision would be comparable in quantity and quality to the individual supervision requirement under Rule .2004 of this Section. The following guidelines must be met:

- (1) at least 50 percent of the supervision must be provided in individual sessions;
- (2) supervision in groups is credited on a ratio basis, with the number of hours of group supervision divided by the number of those participating

equaling the amount of supervision time credited to each psychological associate;

- (3) staff meetings, quality assurance meetings, and similar groupings will not be considered as supervision for these purposes;
- (4) the alternative supervision plan must be reviewed, approved, and monitored by a licensed practicing psychologist, permanent, who is familiar with the agency's purposes and functions, and agrees to assume responsibility for the quality, suitability, and implementation of the plan throughout its duration;
- (5) the applicant agency or organization must submit individual contracts for all psychological associates under the plan, specifying the nature and extent of their participation in plan components.

.2007 APPLICANTS AND OTHER NONLICENSED INDIVIDUALS

(a) Except as provided for in this Rule, in 21 NCAC 54 .1610, and in 21 NCAC 54 .1703, applicants Applicants and individuals who have yet to apply shall not practice or offer to practice psychology without supervision. With the exception of those activities which are exempt from licensure as stipulated in G.S. 90-270.4, all All activities comprising the practice of psychology are shall be subject to review by a supervisor. A minimum of one hour per week of regularly scheduled face-to-face individual supervision is shall be required; required in any week in which an applicant or nonlicensed individual practices psychology. Supervision must shall be provided by an individual who may shall be recognized as an appropriate supervisor of licensees as defined in Rule .2001 of this Section.

(b) An applicant or a nonlicensed individual who is not practicing or offering to practice psychology in North Carolina is shall not be required to receive supervision.

(c) An applicant must shall keep a written, notarized supervision contract form on file in the Board's's office at all times. A supervision contract form shall document documents that either that supervision is required and is being shall be received, or that supervision is not required.

(d) An initial written, notarized supervision contract form must shall be filed along with the application form. A new supervision contract form is shall be required to be filed within 30 days of a change in the conditions specified in the supervision contract form on file with the Board: Board and within 30 days after receiving written notification from the Board that the filing of a new form is necessary to provide for the protection of the public or the regulation of the practice of psychology.

(e) Supervision reports must shall be submitted at any time when the supervisor has concerns regarding the supervisee's performance, upon termination of supervision, and when there is a change in the conditions specified in the supervision contract form on file with the Board. Additional

monitoring and reporting to the Board may be required in cases where previous evaluations or other information (e.g., reference letters, ethical complaints, etc.) suggests possible problems in the supervisee's competence or adherence to ethical standards. Additional documentation or an interview with the Board or its designated representative may be required when questions arise regarding the supervisee's practice due to information supplied or omitted on supervision contract forms and reports or when required forms are not filed with the Board.

(f) Contract and report forms ~~are~~ shall be provided by the Board.

.2008 PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSOCIATE

(a) Except as provided in this Rule, a Psychological Associate practicing psychology in North Carolina shall receive supervision for activities specified in G.S. 90-270.5(e) and 21 NCAC 54 .2006.

(b) A Psychological Associate whose professional practice is limited to those activities other than those specified in G.S. 90-270.5(e) and 21 NCAC 54 .2006 as requiring supervision shall not be required to receive supervision.

(c) A Psychological Associate who is a regular salaried employee of the State Department of Public Instruction or a local board of education, and whose professional activities are limited only to those for which he or she is employed by that agency, shall not be required to receive supervision. This exemption shall not apply to individuals who contract with the Department of Public Instruction or local boards of education for the delivery of psychological services which otherwise require supervision in the schools.

(d) A Psychological Associate who engages in the practice of psychology in a jurisdiction other than North Carolina shall not be required to receive supervision for those services rendered in another jurisdiction so long as said services are rendered in a manner consistent with the jurisdiction's legal requirements.

(e) A written, notarized supervision contract form shall be filed within 30 days of a change in the conditions specified in the supervision contract form on file with the Board and within 30 days after receiving written notification from the Board that the filing of a new form is necessary to provide for the protection of the public or the regulation of the practice of psychology. A supervision contract form shall document either that supervision is required and shall be received, or that supervision is not required. A separate supervision contract form shall be filed for each separate work setting and, if receiving supervision from more than one supervisor to meet the minimum requirements, a separate supervision contract form shall be filed with each individual supervisor.

(f) A supervisor shall report to the Board that agreed upon supervision has occurred and shall file a final report upon termination of supervision. If not receiving supervision, it shall be the responsibility of the Psychological Associate to

report such to the Board. A report shall be submitted to the Board within 30 days after receiving written notification from the Board that such is due, within 2 weeks of termination of supervision, and within 2 weeks of a change in the conditions specified in the supervision contract form on file with the Board.

(g) Additional supervision and reporting to the Board may be required in cases where previous evaluations or other information (e.g. reference letters, ethical complaints, etc.) suggests possible problems in the supervisee's competence or adherence to ethical standards. Additional documentation or an interview with the Board or its designated representative may be required when questions arise regarding the supervisee's practice due to information supplied or omitted on supervision contract forms and reports or when required forms are not filed with the Board.

(h) Supervision shall be provided in individual, face-to-face, sessions which shall last no longer than 2 hours or less than 30 minutes by an individual who shall be recognized as an appropriate supervisor as defined in Rule .2001 of this Section. A Psychological Associate shall receive a minimum of one hour per month of individual supervision in any month during which he or she engages in activities requiring supervision. The rates of supervision specified in this Paragraph shall be provided for each separate work setting in which the Psychological Associate engages in the activities requiring supervision. Minimum hours of supervision required for each work setting shall not be split between more than two supervisors. The term "post-licensure" in this Paragraph shall refer to a Psychological Associate license issued by the North Carolina Psychology Board. The term "supervised practice" in this Paragraph shall refer to activities specified in G.S. 90-270.5(e) and 21 NCAC 54 .2006. Except as provided in Paragraph (g) of this Rule, minimum supervision requirements shall be as follows:

(1) Level 1. For a Psychological Associate with less than 3 years and 4500 hours of post-licensure supervised practice, minimum supervision shall be provided as follows:

1 - 10	1
11 - 20	2
21 - 30	3
31 plus	4

(2) Level 2. After 3 years and 4500 hours of post-licensure supervised practice, minimum supervision may be provided as follows:

<u>No. of hours per month engaging in activities that require supervision</u>	<u>No. of hours of required individual supervision per month</u>
1 - 20	1
21 plus	2

To be approved for this level of supervision, a Psychological Associate shall:

(A) make application on an application form

provided by the Board:

- (B) document that all performance ratings for the preceding 3 years and 4500 hours of post-licensure supervised practice have been above average;
 - (C) have received at least one year of supervision from the most recent supervisor; and
 - (D) have the recommendation of the most recent supervisor for this level of supervision.
- (3) Level 3. After 5 years and 7500 hours of post-licensure supervised practice, a minimum of 1 hour per month individual supervision may be provided to a Psychological Associate who engages in activities requiring supervision. To be approved for this level of supervision, a Psychological Associate shall:
- (A) make application on an application form provided by the Board;
 - (B) document that all performance ratings for the preceding 5 years and 7500 hours of post-licensure supervised practice have been above average;
 - (C) have received at least one year of supervision from the most recent supervisor; and
 - (D) have the recommendation of the most recent supervisor for this level of supervision.

(i) The frequency and comprehensiveness of supervision may, at the discretion of the supervising psychologist, be modified if the minimum rate of supervision as defined in Paragraph (h) of this Rule is provided. The supervising psychologist of record may review, approve, and monitor additional individual or group supervision to be provided to the supervisee by a Licensed Psychological Associate, Licensed Psychologist holding a permanent or provisional license, or a professional from a related discipline. Such supervision shall not substitute for the minimum requirements specified in Paragraph (h) of this Rule.

(j) Contract and report forms shall be provided by the Board.

.2009 LICENSED PSYCHOLOGIST

(a) Except as provided in 21 NCAC 54 .1707, to be issued a permanent license at the Psychologist level, an applicant shall document a minimum of 2 calendar years and 3000 hours of supervised practice which shall meet the requirements specified in Paragraphs (i) and (j) of this Rule. A minimum of 1 calendar year and 1500 hours of this supervised practice shall be accrued at the postdoctoral level.

(b) A psychologist who shall meet all other requirements for a permanent license except the two years of supervised experience shall be issued a provisional license at the Psychologist level and shall comply with supervision requirements specified in this Rule.

(c) If practicing psychology in North Carolina, a provisional licensee shall receive at least one hour per week of

face-to-face individual supervision by an appropriate supervisor as defined in Rule .2001 of this Section until permanent status shall be approved by the Board.

(d) A provisional licensee who is not practicing psychology shall not be required to receive supervision.

(e) A provisional licensee who engages in the practice of psychology in a jurisdiction other than North Carolina shall not be required to receive supervision for those services rendered in another jurisdiction so long as said services shall be rendered in a manner consistent with the jurisdiction's legal requirements.

(f) A written, notarized supervision contract form shall be filed within 30 days of a change in the conditions specified in the supervision contract form on file with the Board and within 30 days after receiving written notification from the Board that the filing of a new form is necessary to provide for the protection of the public or the regulation of the practice of psychology. A supervision contract form shall document either that supervision is required and shall be received, or that supervision is not required. A separate supervision contract form shall be filed for each separate work setting and, if receiving supervision from more than one supervisor, a separate supervision contract form shall be filed with each individual supervisor.

(g) A supervisor shall report to the Board that agreed upon supervision has occurred and shall file a final report upon termination of supervision. If not receiving supervision, it shall be the responsibility of the provisional licensee to report such to the Board. A report shall be submitted to the Board within 30 days after receiving written notification from the Board that such is due, within 2 weeks of termination of supervision, and within 2 weeks of a change in the conditions specified in the supervision contract form on file with the Board.

(h) Additional supervision and reporting to the Board may be required in cases where previous evaluations or other information (e.g. reference letters, ethical complaints, etc.) suggests possible problems in the supervisee's competence or adherence to ethical standards. Additional documentation or an interview with the Board or its designated representative may be required when questions arise regarding the supervisee's practice due to information supplied or omitted on supervision contract forms and reports or when required forms are not filed with the Board.

(i) One year of supervised experience shall meet all of the following criteria for a training program in psychology:

- (1) The training shall be a planned and directed program in the practice of psychology, in contrast to "on the job" training, and shall provide the trainee with a planned, programmed sequence of training experience.
- (2) The training site shall have a written statement or brochure which describes its training program and is made available to prospective trainees.
- (3) Trainees shall be designated as "interns," fellows," or "residents," or shall hold other designation which clearly indicates training status.

- (4) The training shall be completed within a consecutive period of 24 months.
- (5) The training shall consist of at least 1500 hours of practice in psychology as defined by G.S. 90-270.2(8).
- (6) The training site shall have a minimum of two doctorally trained licensed, certified, or license eligible psychologists at the training site as supervisors who shall have ongoing contact with the trainee.
- (7) The training shall be under the direction of a licensed, certified, or license eligible doctorally trained psychologist who shall be on the staff of the training site, who shall approve and monitor the training, who shall be familiar with the training site's purposes and functions, who shall have ongoing contact with the trainee, and who shall agree to assume responsibility for the quality, suitability, and implementation of the training experience.
- (8) The training shall provide a minimum of two hours per week of individual face-to-face discussion of the trainee's practice, with the specific intent of overseeing the psychological services rendered by the trainee. Supervision may be provided in part by psychiatrists, social workers, or other related professionals qualified by the training site, but at least 50% of supervision shall be provided by licensed, certified, or license-eligible doctorally trained psychologists.
- (9) In addition to individual supervision, the training site shall provide a minimum of two hours per week of instruction which may be met by group supervision, assigned reading, seminars, and similarly constituted organized training experiences. Internships accredited by the American Psychological Association and other internships which meet all of the specified criteria in this Paragraph shall be deemed to meet the requirements in this Paragraph.
 - (j) One year of supervised experience shall meet all of the following criteria:
 - (1) A minimum of one hour per week of face-to-face, individual supervision shall be provided.
 - (2) The experience shall consist of a minimum of 1 calendar year, shall include 1500 hours of practice, and shall be completed within a consecutive 4-year period.
 - (3) Supervision shall be provided for the practice of psychology as defined by G.S. 90-270.2(8).
 - (4) Supervision shall be provided by an individual who shall be recognized as an appropriate supervisor of licensees as defined in Rule .2001 of this Section.
 - (k) Contract and report forms shall be provided by the Board.

Reason for Proposed Action:

15A NCAC 3M .0503 - The joint MAFMC-ASMFC Summer Flounder Fishery Management Plan contains a compliance requirement that states manage their annual quota without exceeding it. Establishment of a trip limit and the ability to close the season when 100% of the quota is taken is necessary in order to comply with these requirements. Compliance with requirements of Fisheries Management Plans are also required by the Atlantic Coastal Fishery Cooperative Management Act.

15A NCAC 3M .0506 - The Black Sea Bass Fishery Management Plan has been amended to require compliance measures be instituted by states for waters north of Hatteras. Amendment of this Rule to establish proclamation authority in order to assure compliance with this plan is necessary. Compliance with requirements of Fisheries Management Plans are also required by the Atlantic Coastal Fishery Cooperative Management Act.

15A NCAC 3M .0514 - Recent approval of the Scup Fishery Management Plan by the Secretary of Commerce and the ASMFC requires North Carolina to implement several provisions in order to be in compliance. Adoption of this Rule allows the Fisheries Director to take measures to assure compliance with this plan. Compliance with requirements of Fisheries Management Plans are also required by the Atlantic Coastal Fishery Cooperative Management Act.

.0503 FLOUNDER

(a) It is unlawful to possess flounder less than 13 inches in length.

(b) Between October 1 and April 30, it shall be unlawful to use a trawl in the Atlantic Ocean within three miles of the ocean beach from the North Carolina/Virginia state line (35° 33' N) to Cape Lookout (34° 36' N) unless each trawl has a cod end (tailbag) mesh length greater than 5 ½ inches diamond mesh (stretched) or 6 inches square mesh (stretched) applied throughout the cod end for at least 75 continuous meshes forward of the terminus (end) of the net, or the terminal one-third portion of a net, measured from the terminus of the cod end to the head rope for cod ends with less than 75 meshes, except as provided in Paragraphs (i) and (j) of this Rule.

(c) License to Land Flounder from the Atlantic Ocean:

- (1) It is unlawful to land more than 100 pounds per trip of flounder taken from the Atlantic Ocean unless the vessel has been issued a License to Land Flounder from the Atlantic Ocean.
- (2) It is unlawful for a fish dealer to purchase or offload more than 100 pounds of flounder taken from the Atlantic Ocean by a vessel that has not first procured a valid North Carolina License to Land Flounder from the Atlantic Ocean.
- (3) To qualify for a North Carolina License to Land Flounder from the Atlantic Ocean, a vessel shall have:
 - (A) been licensed under G.S. 113-152 or 113-153 during any two of the 1992-93, 1993-94, or 1994-95 license years, and
 - (B) landed in North Carolina at least 1,000 pounds of flounder each year from the Atlantic Ocean during any two of the 1992-93, 1993-94, or 1994-95 license years for which the vessel was licensed to land in North Carolina.
- (4) At least 10 days prior to issuance, applicants for the license shall complete an application form provided by the Division of Marine Fisheries and submit it to the North Carolina Division of Marine Fisheries, Post Office Box 769, 3441 Arendell Street, Morehead City, North Carolina 28557. The following information is required:

- (A) Valid documentation papers or current motor boat registration or copy thereof;
- (B) Proof of required licenses and flounder landings data for that vessel during the years the vessel was licensed.

Licenses shall be issued to qualifying vessels at no fee and only from the Morehead City Office of the Division of Marine Fisheries.

- (5) Licenses may only be transferred:
 - (A) with the transfer of the ownership of a vessel holding a License to Land Flounder from the Atlantic Ocean to the new owner of that vessel, or
 - (B) by the owner of a vessel to another vessel under the same ownership. The vessel owner is only eligible for the same number of Licenses to Land Flounder from the Atlantic Ocean for which his boats qualify,
 - (C) any transfer of license under this Paragraph must be facilitated through the Division of Marine Fisheries Morehead City Office only.
- (6) It is unlawful for any individual to land flounder from the Atlantic Ocean without having ready at hand for inspection a valid License to Land Flounder from the Atlantic Ocean, except as specified in Subparagraph (c)(1) of this Rule.
- (7) Suspension or Revocation:
 - (A) A License to Land Flounder from the Atlantic Ocean issued under this Rule shall be subject to suspension or revocation pursuant to the provisions of 15A NCAC 3P, except that this license shall be subject to revocation pursuant to the provisions of G.S. 113-166 when the licensee is convicted of a criminal offense within the jurisdiction of the Department under the provisions of Subchapter IV of G.S. 113, or of the rules of the Marine Fisheries Commission adopted under the authority of that Subchapter.
 - (B) The Division may commence proceedings under 15A NCAC 3P, for suspension or revocation of a License to Land Flounder from the Atlantic Ocean if it finds:
 - (i) the license was obtained by providing any false information or willfully omitting required information when the information is material to the securing of the license; or
 - (ii) the license was falsified, fraudulently altered, or counterfeited; or
 - (iii) the licensee practices any fraud or deception designed to evade the provisions of this Rule or reasonable administrative directives made under the authority of this Rule or G.S.

113-182(b)(3).

- (d) It is unlawful to transfer flounder taken from the Atlantic Ocean from one vessel to another.
- (e) It is unlawful to possess flounder less than 14 inches total length taken by hook-and-line or gig from the Atlantic Ocean.
- (f) It is unlawful to possess more than 8 flounder per person per day taken by hook-and-line or gig from the Atlantic Ocean.
- (g) Persons with a vessel endorsement to sell or a nonvessel endorsement to sell are exempt from the possession limit in Paragraphs (e) and (f) of this Rule.
- (h) Tailbag liners of any mesh size, the multiple use of two or more cod ends, or other netting material that in any way could restrict the legal size mesh required by this Rule, shall not be used or possessed on the deck of a vessel in the Atlantic Ocean between October 1 and April 30 from the North Carolina/Virginia state line (36° 33' N) to Cape Lookout (34° 36' N).
- (i) Trawls with a cod end mesh size smaller than described in Paragraph (b) of this Rule may be used or possessed on the deck of a vessel provided not more than 100 pounds of flounder per trip from May 1 through October 31 or more than 200 pounds from November 1 through April 30 is possessed aboard or landed from that vessel.
- (j) Flynets are exempt from the flounder trawl mesh requirements if they meet the following definition:
 - (1) The net has large mesh in the wings that measure 8 inches to 64 inches;
 - (2) The first body section (belly) of the net has 35 or more meshes that are at least 8 inches; and
 - (3) The mesh decreases in size throughout the body of the net to as small as 2 inches or smaller towards the terminus of the net.
- (k) Season.
 - (1) The North Carolina season for landing ocean-caught flounder shall open January 1 each year. If 70 percent of the quota allocated to North Carolina in accordance with the joint Mid-Atlantic Fisheries Management Council-Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission Fishery Management Plan for Summer Flounder is projected to be taken, the Fisheries Director shall, by proclamation, close North Carolina ports to landing of flounder taken from the ocean.
 - (2) The season for landing flounder taken in the Atlantic Ocean shall reopen November 1 if any of the quota allocated to North Carolina in accordance with the joint Mid-Atlantic Fisheries Management Council-Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission Fishery Management Plan for Summer Flounder remains. If after reopening, 100 percent of the quota allocated to North Carolina in accordance with the joint Mid-Atlantic Fisheries Management Council-Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission Fishery Management Plan for Summer Flounder is projected to be taken prior

to the end of the calendar year, the Fisheries Director shall, by proclamation, close North Carolina ports to landing of flounder taken from the ocean. During the closed season, vessels may land up to 100 pounds of flounder per trip taken from the Atlantic Ocean.

- (3) During any closed season prior to November 1, vessels may land up to 100 pounds of flounder per trip taken from the Atlantic Ocean. The season for landing flounder taken in the Atlantic Ocean shall reopen November 1.

(l) The Fisheries Director may, by proclamation, establish trip limits for the taking of flounder from the Atlantic Ocean to assure that the individual state quota allocated to North Carolina in the joint Mid-Atlantic Fisheries Management Council-Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission Fishery Management Plan for Summer Flounder is not exceeded.

.0506 SNAPPER-GROUPER

(a) The Fisheries Director may, by proclamation, impose any or all of the following restrictions in the fishery for species of the snapper-grouper complex listed in the South Atlantic Fishery Management Council Fishery Management Plan for the Snapper-Grouper Fishery of the South Atlantic Region: Region and for sea bass north of Cape Hatteras in order to comply with or utilize conservation equivalency to comply with the management requirements incorporated in the Fishery Management Plan for Sea Bass developed cooperatively by the Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council and the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission:

- (1) Specify size;
- (2) Specify seasons;
- (3) Specify areas;
- (4) Specify quantity;
- (5) Specify means/methods; and
- (6) Require submission of statistical and biological data.

The species of the snapper-grouper complex listed in the South Atlantic Fishery Management Council Fishery Management Plan for the Snapper-Grouper Fishery of the South Atlantic Region is hereby incorporated by reference and copies are available at the Division of Marine Fisheries, P.O. Box 769, Morehead City, North Carolina 28557 at no cost.

(b) It is unlawful to possess black sea bass less than eight inches total length taken south of Cape Hatteras (35° 15' N, Latitude).

(c) It is unlawful to possess gag grouper (gray grouper)

less than 20 inches total length.

(d) It is unlawful to possess black grouper less than 20 inches total length.

(e) It is unlawful to possess red snapper less than 20 inches total length.

(f) It is unlawful to possess red grouper less than 20 inches total length.

(g) It is unlawful to possess yellowfin grouper (fireback grouper) less than 20 inches total length.

(h) It is unlawful to possess scamp less than 20 inches total length.

(i) It is unlawful to possess yellowmouth grouper less than 20 inches total length.

(j) Greater amberjack:

(1) It is unlawful to possess greater amberjack less than 36 inches fork length except that persons fishing under the bag limit established in Subparagraph (2) of this Paragraph may possess a minimum 28 inch amberjack.

(2) It is unlawful to possess more than three greater amberjack per person per day.

(k) Vermilion Snapper:

(1) It is unlawful to possess vermilion snapper (beeliner) less than 12 inches total length except that persons fishing under the bag limit established in Subparagraph (2) of this Paragraph may possess 10 inch vermilion snapper.

(2) It is unlawful to possess more than 10 vermilion snapper per person per day taken for non-commercial purposes.

(l) It is unlawful to possess silk snapper (yelloweye snapper) less than 12 inches total length.

(m) It is unlawful to possess blackfin snapper (hambone snapper) less than 12 inches total length.

(n) It is unlawful to possess red porgy (pink or silver snapper) less than 12 inches total length.

(o) Speckled hind (Kitty Mitchell) and Warsaw grouper:

(1) It is unlawful to sell or offer for sale speckled hind or Warsaw grouper.

(2) It is unlawful to possess more than one speckled hind or one Warsaw grouper per vessel per trip.

(p) Combined Bag Limit for Snapper. It is unlawful to possess more than 10 vermilion snappers and 10 other species of snappers, of which no more than two may be red snapper, taken in any one day unless fishing aboard a vessel holding a federal vessel permit for snapper-grouper authorizing the bag limit to be exceeded.

(q) Combined Bag Limit for Grouper:

(1) It is unlawful to possess more than five grouper taken in any one day unless fishing aboard a vessel holding a federal vessel permit for snapper-grouper authorizing the bag limit to be exceeded.

(2) Vessels holding a federal permit authorizing the bag limit to be exceeded may not possess more than one speckled hind or one Warsaw grouper.

(r) It is unlawful to possess Nassau grouper or jewfish.

(s) Fish Traps/Pots:

- (1) It is unlawful to use or have on board a vessel fish traps for taking snappers and groupers except sea bass pots as allowed in Subparagraph (2) of this Paragraph.
- (2) Sea bass may be taken with pots that conform with the federal rule requirements for mesh sizes and pot size as specified in 50 CFR Part 646.2 and openings and degradable fasteners specified in 50 CFR Part ~~646-22(c)(2)(i)~~; 646-22(c)(2)(i) and rules published in 50 CRF pertaining to sea bass north of Cape Hatteras (35° 15' N Latitude).

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

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
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
