## TITLE 15A - DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT and Natural resources

NTotice is hereby given in accordance with G.S. 150B-21.2 that the N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission intends to amend the rule cited as 15A NCAC 10F.0330. Notice of Rulemaking Proceedings was published in the Register on December 1. 1998.

Proposed Effective Date: July 1, 2000
A Public Hearing will be conducted at 10:00 a.m. on February 16, 1998 at the Archdale Building, Room 332, 512 N. Salisbury Street, Raleigh, NC 27603.

Reason for Proposed Action: The Carteret County Board of Commissioners initiated the no-wake zones pursuant to G.S. 75A-15. to protect public safety in the area by restricting vessel speed. The Wildlife Resources Commission may adopt this as a temporary rule pursuant to S.L. 1997-0403 following the abbreviated notice as indicated in the Notice of Rule-Making Proceedings or following the public hearing and public comment period as indicated in this notice.

Comment Procedures: Interested persons may present their views either orally or in writing at the hearing. In addition. the record of hearing will be open for receipt of written comments from February 1, 1999 to March 3, 1999. Such written comments must be delivered or mailed to the NC Wildlife Resources Commission, 512 N. Salisbury Street, Raleigh, NC 27604-1188.

## SECTION . 0300 - LOCAL WATER SAFETY REGULATIONS

The proposed changes in (a)(7), (a)(9), (a)(10), (a)(11) and portions of (c), all in bold letting, were previously published in the NC Register Volume I3, Issue 7, page 596.
. 0330 CARTERET COUNTY
(a) Regulated Areas. This Rule applies to the following waters in Carteret County:
(1) the waters of Money Island Slough beginning at the east end of Money Island near the Anchorage Marina Basin and ending at the west end of Money Island where Brooks Avenue deadends at the slough;
(2) the waters of Taylor Creek located within the territorial limits of the Town of Beaufort;
(3) the waters of Pelletier Creek beginning at the entrance to Pelletier Creek at the Intracoastal Waterway and ending at U.S. Highway 70;
(4) the waters of Bogue Sound in Morehead City between Sugar Loaf Island and the seawall on the south side of Evans, Shepard and Shackleford Streets and bounded on the east by the State Ports Authority and on the west by the eastern right-of-way margin of South 13th Street extended;
(5) the waters of Gallant's Channel from the US 70 crossing over the Grayden Paul bridge to Taylor's Creek;
(6) the waters of Cedar Island Bay and Harbor from U.S. 70 to Cedar Island Bay Channel Light 8;
(7) the waters of Radio Istand Creek; the waters of the small cove on the west side of Radio Island immediately south of the B \& M Railroad and US 70 Bridges across the Intracoastal Waterway in which Radio Island Marina and Morehead Sports Marina are located as delineated by appropriate markers;
(8) the waters of the Newport River beginning at the north side of the Beaufort Drawbridge and ending at marker \#6:
(9) the waters of Spooners Creek within the territorial limits of the Town of Morehead City as delineated by appropriate markers; beginning 100 feet south of the bulkhead-area in the entrance to Spooners Creek and extending approvimately 500 feet up Spooners Creek to a point on the north-side of the first fork to the east as indieated by the appropriate markers;
(10) the waters of Taylor's Creek from the eastern end of the current no wake zone eastward to Channel Marker \#1A. \#1A;
(11) the waters of the Newport River at Bogue Sound including all waters surrounding the Port of Morehead City to Brandt Island as delineated by appropriate markers;
(12) the waters of Morgans Creek as delineated by appropriate markers.
(b) Speed Limit. It is unlawful to operate a motorboat or vessel at a speed greater than no-wake speed while on the waters
of the regulated areas designated in Paragraph (a) of this Rule.
(c) Placement and Maintenance of Markers. The Board of Commissioners of Carteret County, with respect to the regulated areas designated in Subparagraphs (1), (3), (5), (6), (7), (8). (9) and (10) (10) and 12 of Paragraph (a) of this Rule, and the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Beaufort, with respect to the regulated area designated in Subparagraph (2) of Paragraph (a) of this Rule, and the Board of Commissioners of Morehead City, with respect to Subparagraph (4) and (9) of Paragraph (a) of this Rule, and the North Carolina Sate Ports Authority, with respect to the regulated area designed in Subparagraph (11) of Paragraph (a) of this Rule are designated as suitable agencies for placement and maintenance of the markers implementing this Rule, subject to the approval of the United States Coast Guard and the United States Army Corps of Engineers.

## SUBCHAPTER 16G - DENTAL HYGIENISTS

## SECTION. 0100 - DENTAL HYGIENISTS

## . 0101 FUNCTIONS WHICH MAY BE DELEGATED

A dental hygienist may be delegated appropriate functions to be performed under the direct control and supervision of a dentist who shall be personally and professionally responsible and liable for any and all consequences or results arising from performance of such acts and functions. Functions In addition to the functions set out in G.S. $90-221$ (a), functions which mas be delegated to a dental hygienist include:
(1) Taking impressions for stud models and opposing casts which will not be used for construction of dental appliances;
(2) Applying sealants to teeth that do not require mechanical alteration prior to the application of such sealants, provided that a dentist has examined the patient and prescribed the precedure procedure:
(3) Insert matrix bands and wedges;
(4) Place cavity bases and liners;
(5) Place and/or remove rubber dams;
(6) Cement temporary restorations using temporary cement;
(7) Apply acid etch materials/rinses;
(8) Apply bonding agents:
(9) Remove periodontal dressings;
(10) Remove sutures:
(11) Place gingival retraction cord;
(12) Remove excess cement:
(13) Flush dry and temporarily close root canals;
(14) Place and remove temporary restorations:
(15) Place orthodontic ligature wires or lock pins;
(16) Insert spacer wires or springs;
(17) Fit (size) orthodontic bands or brackets;
(18) Apply dentin desensitizing solutions;
(19) Perform periodontal screening;
(20) Perform periodontal probing;
(21) Perform subgingival exploration for hard or soft deposits;
(22) Perform sulcular irrigation; and
(23) Application of resorbable antimicrobial agents.

. 0102 FUNCTIONS WHICH SHALL NOT BE DELEGATED
Those functions which shall not be delegated are:
(H) Examination, diagnesis and freatment planning;
(2) Eutting-or-surgical procedures on-hard-and-seft tissues;
(3) Those restorative, prosthetic, orthodontic, and other procedures which require the professional education and stitl of the dentist and which direetly affeet the dental health and physiologic-well-being of the patient.

## . 0103 PROCEDURES PROHIBITED

Those procedures which de require the professional education and skill of a dentist and may not be delegated to a dental hygienist shall specifieatly include. but shall not be limited to:
(1) Any-intra-oral-procedure which-would affeet the function or efficiency of an appliance which. when wom by the patient-would come in direct contact with hard or soft tissue and which could result in tissue infitation:
(2) The placing of permanent type-restorations in-or on teeth:
(3) Taking of impressions and jaw registrations other than study models and opposing costs which will not be tused for construetion of dental appliances;
(4) Any and all correction of malformation of teeth or the jaws;
(5) Decisions as drugs and their dosage, prescription writing, and werk awthorizations;
(6) Any and all administration of loeal or general anesthesia, except application of topical anestheties.
(1) Comprehensive examination, diagnosis and treatment planning;
(2) Surgical or cutting procedures on hard or soft tissues, including laser or micro-abrasion procedures;
(3) Placement or removal of antimicrobial impregnated fibers:
(4) The issuance of prescription drugs, medications or work authorizations;
(5) Taking of impressions for final fixed or removable restorations or prostheses;
(6) Final placement or intraoral adjustment of a fixed or removable appliance;
(7) Intra-oral occlusal adjustments or extra-oral adjustments which affect function, fit, or occlusion of any permanent restoration or appliance;
(8) Performance of direct pulp capping or pulpotomy;
(9) Placement or finishing of any final restoration;
(10) Placement of sutures;
(11) Final placement or cementation of orthodontic bands or brackets;
(12) Formation of orthodontic arch wires;
(13) Placement finishing or cementation of final restorations;
(14) Administration of any local anesthetic, parenteral, intravenous (IV) sedation, inhalation; and Use of a high speed handpiece.

## SUBCHAPTER 16H - DENTAL ASSISTANTS

## SECTION . 0100 - CLASSIFICATION AND TRAINING

## . 0103 DENTAL ASSISTANT I]

A Dental Assistant 11 is a dental assistant who has-suecessfully completed an education and training program-approved by the North Carelina State-Board of Dental-Examiners-or-whe qualifies by experience. an expanded duty assistant who has completed training in accordance with Rule .0104 of this Section. Under direct control and supervision. a Dental Assistant 11 may be delegated intra-oral procedures the supervising dentist deems appropriate, with the dentist personally and professionally responsible for any and all consequences or results arising from the performance of said acts. All delegated procedures must be performed properly and safely and must be reversible in nature.

## . 0104 APPROVED EDUCATION AND TRAINING PROGRAMS

Education and training programs approved by the North Garolina-State-Board-of Dental-Examiners and experience requirements qualifying Dental Assistafts as Dental Assistant H include: To be classified as a Dental Assistant II, an assistant must meet one (1) of the following criteria:
(1) satisfactory completion of one academic year or longer in a Dental Assistant or Dental Hygiene program approved by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association; or
(2) full-time employment and experience as a chairside assistant (Mental Assistant 1) by a dentist licensed in North Carolina for three consectitive years of the preceding five, for two years of the preceding five (during which time the dental assistant may be trained to perform the duties of a Dental Assistant II under the direct control and supervision of a licensed dentist), plus completion of training in radiology consistent with G.S. 90-29(c)(12), and completion of didactic training in dental assisting course approved by the Board that metrst-inelude asepsis. Boardapproved courses in sterilization/infection control and dental office emergencies; or
(3) successful completion of the certification examination administered by the Dental Assisting National Beaft: and Board.
(4) experience working as a chairside assistant for five of the preceding seven years and completion of training in radiography consistent with G.S. $90-29(\mathrm{c})(12)$.

## SECTION . 0200 - PERMITTED FUNCTIONS OF DENTAL ASSISTANT

## . 0201 GENERAL PERMITTED FUNCTIONS OF DENTAL ASSISTANT I

(a) A Dental Assistant I may do and perform those functions generally ascribed to Dental Assistants, such as reception. telephome and appointment services, business management, and taboratory procedures.
(b)A Dental Assistant 1 may assist a dentist in-operatory procedures as a chairside assistant as long as the acts and functions of the Dental Assistant $\underline{1}$ do not constitute the practice of dentistry dentistry or dental hygiene and are not functions assigned to a Dental Assistant II.

## . 0202 SPECIFIC PERMITTED FUNCTIONS OF DENTAL ASSISTANT I

A Dental Assistant I may do and perform the following acts and functions, after maining and qualification, under the direct eontrel and supervision of a dentist. which dentist shall be personally responsible and liable for any and all consequences of results arising from the-performance of these-ats and functions:
(H) take radiograph of the mouth, gums, jaws, teeth or any portion thereof for dentat diagnostic purposes
provided, however, that the assistant can show evidence of having completed training in fadiography eensistent-with G.S. 90-29(e)(12) before being permitted to take radiographs:
(2) apply topical flurides directly to the teeth of any person the dentist is treating: and
(3) apply topical anestheties of other topieal medications within the oral cavily of any person the dentist-is treating:
only routine dental assisting procedures such as oral hygiene instruction; chairside assisting; application of topical fluorides, topical anesthetics or other topical medications; and exposure of radiographs, provided that the assistant can show evidence of compliance with radiography training consistent with G.S. 9029(c)(12).

## . 0203 PERMITTED FUNCTIONS OF DENTAL ASSISTANT II

A Dental Assistant 11 may perform any and all acts or functions procedures which may be done or performed by a Dental Assistant I. Additionally, In addition, a Dental Assistant H. after adequate fraining and qualifieation as provided in 21 NCAC 164.0104 , 11 may be delegated approprite the following functions to be performed under the direct control and supervision of a dentist who shall be personally and professionally responsible and liable for any and all consequences or results arising from the performance of such acts and functions. functions: A Dental Assistant H-may:
(1) Take impressions for study models and opposing casts which will not be used for construction of dental appliances:
(2) Apply sealants to teeth that do not require mechanical alteration prior to the application of such seatants. provided a dentist has examined the patient and prescribed the procedure; and
(3) Insert matrix bands and wedges;
(4) Place cavity bases and liners;
(5) Place and/or remove rubber dams;
(6) Cement temporary restorations using temporar cement;
(7) Apply acid etch materials/rinses;
(8) Apply bonding agents;
(9) Remove periodontal dressings;
(10) Remove sutures;
(11) Place gingival retraction cord;
(12) Remove excess cement;
(13) Flush dry and temporarily close root canals:
(14) Place and remove temporary restorations;
(15) Place orthodontic ligature wires or lock pins;
(16) Insert spacer 11 ires or springs:
(17) Fit (size) orthodontic bands or brackets:
(18) Apply dentin desensitizing solutions;
$(3)(19)$ Polish the clinical crown using only a combination of a slow speed handpiece (not to exceed $10,000 \mathrm{rpm}$ ), rubber cup or bristle brush and appropriate polishing agents. after completing a formal educational course
in coronal polishing consisting of at least seven hours. This procedure shall in no way be represented to the patient as a prophylaxis and no specific charge shall be made for such a procedure.

(2) Eutling or surgieal proeedures-on hard and-soft tisstes:
(3) Those restorative, prosthetic, orthodontic, and other procedures which require the professional education and skill of the dentist and which directly affeet the dental health and physiologic-well-being of the patient.

## . 0205 SPECIFIC PROHIBITED FUNCTIONS OF DENTAL ASSISTANTS I AND II

Those specific functions which shall not be delegated to either a Dental Assistant I or a Dental Assistant II include those procedures prohibited in 21 NCAC 16G, Rule .0003 for Dental Hygienists. In addition, neither a Dental Assistant 1 nor a Dental Assistant II shall perform a prophylaxis. prophylaxis, or shall perform periodontal screening. periodontal probing, subgingival exploration for hard or soft deposits, or sulcular irrigation.

## SUBCHAPTER 16Q-GENERAL ANESTHESIA AND SEDATION

## SECTION. 0200 - GENERAL ANESTHESIA

## . 0201 CREDENTIALS AND PERMIT

(a) No dentist shall employ or use general anesthesia on an outpatient basis for dental patients unless the dentist possesses a permit issued by the Board. A dentist holding a permit shall be subject to review and such permit must be renewed annually.
(b) Within one year of the effective date of these ruter, any Any dentist who wishes to administer or contintue administer general anesthesia to patients must apply to the Board for the required permit on a prescribed application form, submit an application fee of fifty dollars ( $\$ 50.00$ ), and produce evidence showing that he:
(1) Has completed a minimum of one year of advanced training in anesthesiology and related academic subjects (or its equivalent) beyond the undergraduate dental school level in a training program approved by the Board; or
(2) Has graduated from a program certified by the American Dental Association in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery; or
(3) Is a Diplomate of or eligible for examination by the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery; or
(4) Is a Fellow of the American Dental Society of Anesthesiology; or
(5) Is a dentist who has been administering general anesthetics in a competent manner for the five years preceding the effective date of this Rule.
(c) A dentist who is qualified to administer general anesthesia in accordance with this Section and holds a general anesthesia permit is also authorized to administer sedation without obtaining a separate sedation permit.
(d) The dentist and auxiliary personnel involved with the administration of general anesthesia shall be trained in and capable of administering advanced cardiac life support and auxiliary personnel shall be trained in and capable of administering basic life support.

## . 0202 EQUIPMENT

A dentist administering general anesthesia shall maintain a properly equipped facility for such administration. in the State of North Carolina, staffed with auxiliary personnel who shall have the capacity to effectively manage the procedure as well as any problems or emergency incidents that may occur as a result of the general anesthetic or secondary to an unexpected medical complication.

## SECTION 0300 - SEDATION

## .0301 SEDATION CREDENTIALS AND PERMIT

(a) A dentist may administer or employ a certified registered nurse anesthetist to administer sedation to dental patients on an outpatient basis provided he obtains a permit from the Board by submitting the appropriate information on an application form provided by the Board and pays a fee of fifty dollars ( $\$ 50.00$ ).
(b) A dentist applying for a permit to administer sedation must meet at least one of the following criteria:
(1) Satisfactory completion of a minimum of 60 hours of didactic training and instruction in intravenous conscious sedation and satisfactory management of a minimum of 10 patients, under supervision, using intravenous sedation in a training program approved by the Board; or
(2) Satisfactory completion of an undergraduate or postgraduation program which included intravenous conscious sedation training equivalent to that defined in Subparagraph (1) of this Rule; or
(3) Satisfactory completion of an internship or residency which included intravenous conscious sedation training equivalent to that defined in Subparagraph (1) of this Rule; or
(4) Authorization for the use of general anesthetics by holding a permit for the same issued by the Board; or
(5) Utilization of a certified registered nurse anesthetist under his supervision to administer intravenous sedation to dental patients.
(c) To be eligible for a sedation permit, a dentist must be operating within a facility, which includes the capability of delivering positive pressure oxygen, staffed with supervised auxiliary personnel capable of handling procedures, problems and emergencies incident thereto.
(d) The dentist seeking a permit must be trained in and capable of administering basie life support: advanced cardiac life support.
(e) The Board may, based upon formal application, grant a permit authorizing the use of sedation to a dentist who has been utilizing sedation in a competent and effective manner for the past five years. years preceding the effective date of this Rule, but who has not had the benefit of formal training as outlined in Paragraph (b) of this Rule, provided that said dentist meets the requirements of Paragraphs (c) and (d) of this Rule.

## SUBCHAPTER 16S - IMPAIRED DENTIST PROGRAM

## SECTION . 0200 - GUIDELINES FOR PROGRAM ELEMENTS

## . 0205 MONITORING REHABILITATION AND PERFORMANCE AFTER TREATMENT

(a) Program members shall monitor dentists following treatment. Testing for impairment shall be conducted until rehabilitation has been accomplished.
(b) Treatment sources shall submit reports to the Director concerning a dentist's rehabilitation and performance.
(c) Impaired dentists shall submit to periodic personal interviews before the Director or Program members designated by the Director; or, for those referred to the Program by the Board, before the Board's agents. The frequency of personal interviews shall be determined by the dentist's ability to accomplish rehabilitation and adequately perform after treatment.
(d) Complete records shall be maintained by the Program on all dentists reporting for assistance, treatment. or monitoring and such records shall remain confidential in accordance with G.S. 90-48.2(e).
(e) The Program shall maintain statistical information regarding impairment. to be reported to the Board periodically. but no less than once a year.
(f) The Program shall compile and report information periodically to the Board regarding investigations, reports. complaints, intervention, treatment, referral, rehabilitation and follow up care of impaired dentists. Such reports shall not identify the subject dentist unless the dentist was referred by the Board or a determination under Rule .0203(b) of this Section has been made.
(g) An audit of the Caring Dentist Program funds shall-be conducted in conjunction with the Board's anmual audit.

## SUBCHAPTER 16V - UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT

. 0101 DEFINITION: UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT
Unprofessional conduct by a dentist shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
(1) Having a license to practice dentistry revoked. suspended, or otherwise acted against. including the denial of licensure, by the licensing authority of another state, territory: or country: (For purposes of this Section. the surrender of a license under threat of disciplinary action shall be considered the same as if the licensee had been disciplined.)
(2) Intentionally presenting false or misleading testimony. statements. or records to the Board or the Board's investigator or employees during the scope of any investigation, or at any hearing of the Board;
(3) In connection with the practice of dentistry. making or filing a report or record which the licensee knows to
be false, failing to file a report or record required by state or federal law, or knowingly impeding or obstructing the filing of a report or record, or inducing another person to do so;
(4) Committing any act which would constitute sexual assault or battery in connection with the provision of dental services;
(5) Violating provision of G.S. 90-41 or any administrative rule, Violating any lawful order of the Board previously entered in a disciplinary hearing, or failing to comply with a lawfully-issued subpoena of the Board;
(6) Conspiring with any person to commit an act, or committing an act which would tend to coerce, intimidate, or preclude any patient or witness from testifying against a licensee in any disciplinary hearing, or retaliating in any manner against any patient or other person who testifies or cooperates with the Board during any investigation under the Dental Practice or Dental Hygiene Acts;
(7) Failing to identify to a patient, patient's guardian or the Board the name of an employee, employer, contractor, or agent who renders dental treatment or services upon request;
(8) Prescribing, procuring, dispensing, or administering any controlled substance for personal use except those prescribed, dispensed, or administered by a practitioner authorized to prescribe them;
(9) Pre-signing blank prescription forms or using preprinted or rubber stamped prescription forms containing the dentist's signature or the name of any controlled substance;
(10) Forgiving the co-payment provisions of any insurance policy, insurance contract, health prepayment contract, health care plan, or nonprofit health service plan contract by accepting the payment received from a third party as full payment, unless the dentist discloses to the third party that the patient's payment portion will not be collected:
(11) Failing to provide radiation safeguards required by the Radiation Protection Section of the State Department of Environment, Health. and Natural Resources:
(12) Having professional connection with or lending one's name to the unlawful practice of dentistry; and
(13) Using the name of any deceased or retired and licensed dentist on any office door, directory, stationery, bill heading, or any other means of communication any time after one year following the death or retirement from practice of said dentist: dentist:
(14) Upon request by the Board, failing to cooperate in a timely manner with a Board investigation;
(15) Performing professional dental services without first informing the patient or the patient's legal representative of the proposed treatment and obtaining consent for treatment, except in the case of an emergency or other circumstances where the patient is incapable of providing consent; or
(16) Failing to comply with any provision of any contract or agreement with the Caring Dentist Program.

## .0102 DEFINITION: UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT BY A DENTAL HYGIENIST

Unprofessional conduct by a dental hygienist shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
(1) Having a license to practice dental hygiene revoked, suspended, or otherwise acted against, including the denial of licensure, by the licensing authority of another state, territory, or country; (For purposes of this Section, the surrender of a license under threat of disciplinary action shall be considered the same as if the licensee had been disciplined.)
(2) Presenting false or misleading testimony, statements, or records to the Board or a Board employee during the scope of any investigation or at any hearing of the Board:
(3) In connection with the practice of dental hygiene, making or filing a false report or record, failing to file a report or record required by state or federal law, knowingly impeding or obstructing the filing of a report or record or inducing another person to do so;
(4) Committing any act which would constitute sexual assault or battery in connection with the provision of dental hygiene services:
(5) Violating a lawful order of the Board previously entered in a disciplinary hearing or failing to comply with a lawfully-issued subpoena of the Board;
(6) Conspiring with any person to commit an act, or committing an act which would tend to coerce, intimidate, or preclude any patient or witness from testifying against a licensee in any disciplinary hearing, or retaliating in any manner against any person who testifies or cooperates with the Board during any investigation of any licensee;
(7) Failing to identify to a patient, patient's guardian, or the Board the name of any person or agent who renders dental treatment or services upon request;
(8) Procuring, dispensing, or administering any controlled substance for personal use except those prescribed, dispensed, or administered by a practitioner authorized to prescribe them:
(9) Acquiring any controlled substance from any pharmacy or other source by misrepresentation, fraud or deception; and
(10) Having professional connection with or lending one's name to the illegal practice of dental hygiene. hygiene;
(11) Upon request by the Board, failing to cooperate in a timely manner with a Board investigation.

## CHAPTER 1 - DEPARTMENTAL RULES

## SUBCHAPTER 1I-INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT FUND

SECTION . 0100 - PURPOSE AND DEFINITIONS

## . 0101 BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVES

(a) BASIC-The purpose of the North Carolina Industrial Development Fund tals to be known the Industrial Building and Remoration Fund) is to assist town. city or county governments with incentive industrial financing fecated in the most economically depressed counties in the state. in areas of the state that have been designated as eligible tier areas by NC General Statutes. This assistance ill-be is intended to help those-units of eovernment create new jobs by providing financing for the renovation or improvement and expansion of manufacturing of industrial butildings-so as to induce "private profit making "entities to ocetpy. by lease of purehase. and to operate manufaeturing of industrial businesses units of government offer to its new and expanding industr, new or improved infrastructure, or funds for building renovation and equipment in exchange for commitments to create new, full-time jobs in industries currently eligible under NC General Statutes.
(The fund is not designed to be used for the acquisition of land and buildings or constructing new buildings.) If the assistance is used for infrastructure, it shall be granted to local governments with no repayment: however, if it is used to purchase equipment or to renovate industrial buildings, then the funds must be repaid. But whether a grant or a loan, the amount of funds to be made available for a project shall be determined by the number of new jobs committed, with a maximum job limit and project limit as currently authorized for the program by NC General Statutes.
(b) The objective of this program will be to provide new futltime jobs for North Carolina cilizens. The Department will necessarily determine that the renorations and improvements are a necessary part of the private firms decision 10 provide the new jobs. If it is determined that the private firm would have (or has atready begun-to)-spend private-meney-to-make-these fenorations and create these jobs. no funds from this program will be expended.
(b) EMERGENCY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE-This special assistance from the Industrial Development Fund, which is used at the discretion of the Secretary, is available to units of government that have, or shall imminently experience, a loss of 500 or more manufacturing jobs in the county, or a number of manufacturing jobs equal to at least 10 percent of the manufacturing workforce in the county. Where a unit of government relies on the 500 jobs loss as the threshold for obtaining this special assistance. it must submit convincing evidence that the loss seriously impacts the county's economy, taking into account the county's tier ranking under Rule 0701 of this Subchapter. The funding obtainable under this emergency assistance categon shall not necessarily be determined by the number of new jobs to be created, although the project should lead to new jobs, or save jobs, or both, and help alleviate a jobs dislocation problem. The Secretary shall determine the amount of funds for a project. up to the maximum currently authorized for the program by NC General Statutes. This assistance shall be in the form of a low interest loan to the governmental unit, amortized over five sears uith reparment beginning at the end of the second vear.
(c) UTILITY ACCOUNT-Within the IDF structure, the Utility Account provides financing to units of government for jobs creation and investment in the tier area(s), and for benefiting firms currently authorized bv NC General Statutes. Funds mav be used for construction or improvements to water. sewer, gas, or electrical utilit lines and equipment for existing or proposed industrial buildings. There is no specific amount of funding specified for each new job or project but the impact of the funding should lead to the creation of new jobs and new investment. As with basic IDF financing, if Utility Account funds are spent for public propert. the assistance shall be a grant: for private property: it shall be a loan.
(d) CLEAN WATER BONDS PROCEEDS = Clean Water
bonds proceeds from the IDF shall be used to make grants to local government units to pay the cost of clean water projects for economic development with regard to the locating of industry to, and the expansion of industry in the State. These funds shall be administered in the manner permitted in the Basic IDF and the Utility Account except the following limitations shall apply:
(1) The funds shall be used for grants; not loans.
(2) Grants shall be made only for projects that will have a favorable impact on the clean water objectives of the State.
(3) Projects shall be located in economically distressed counties or those that have a population of less than 50,000 determined from the data derived at the time of the last December ranking of economically distressed counties.
(4) Grants may be made only with respect to the industries specified by the Clean Water and Natural Gas Critical Needs Bond Act of 1998 as amended.
(5) The water or sewer utility lines or facilities for which bond funds are disbursed shall not necessarily be located on the site of a building or proposed building at which an industrial activity occurs if the utility lines or facilities will further the clean water objectives of the State.

## . 0102 DEFINITIONS

These definitions apply to all parts of the Industrial Development Fund including the Basic Emergency Economic Development Assistance, Utility Account and Clean Water Bonds for Economic Development:
(a) "Department" means the Department of Eememic and Eommunity Development, or its Secretary.
(1) "Department" means the North Carolina Department of Commerce, or its Secretary.
(b) "Aet" means Section 111 Part XXII of the ensolidated budget aet edified as Chapter 830 of the 1987 Session Laws and amended by G.S. 143B-437A, 1989.
(2) "Applicant" means a North Carolina unit of government that applies for IDF funds.
(e) ""Applieant" means a unit of cify government located in a qualified county or a unit of county government Which meets the definition of qualified county.
(3) "Industrial Development Fund" as referenced in G.S. 143B-437.01 means the fund within the Department's fiscal structure in which the appropriation of monies for industrial development projects is received and disbursed.
(d) "Industrial-Development Fund" means the appropriation of monies given to the Department for these purposes. This fund will also be known as and referred to as the Industrial Building Renovation and Improvement Fund.
(4) "IDF" means the Industrial Development Fund.
(e) "Qualified Couny" means-one of the 50 mest economically depressed counties in the-state. The

Secretary of the Departmen-shall determine which eounties are the mest conemically depressed counties in the state based on: rate of unemployment, per capita ineome, and relative population and work force growth or lack of growth, as determined by the Secretary. The figures used in making this comparison and the delineation of "mest" and "least" will be the tatest available per capita ineome figures by county, as documented in a published form by-any State or Federal-Agency-generally recegnized as having expertise-and-creditability in these fieds.
(5) "Eligible tier areas" means the aggregation of North Carolina counties into groups in which certain economic benefits apply, as currently authorized by G.S. 105-129.3.
(円) "Emergency Assistance Qualified Coumy" means any eounty which is facing the-threat of, of which is experiencing a major economic distocation. A major economic distocation would mean the actuat or imminent less of manufacturing jobs caused by one or more plant elosing(s) or one or mere anneunced plant tayeff(s) which affect:
(a) at least 500 jobs; or
(b) a number of jobs which is equal to or exceeds ten percent of the existing manufacturing work foree. -In the case f Subparagraph (f)(2) of the Rute, the number jobs impacted must exceed 50.
(6) "Unit of Government" means a town, city or county of the state.
(g) "Project" means one or more activities proposed for funding, or for partial funding, under this Rule. Such a-project will be-deseribed in a narrative and recompanied by a preliminary se flawines which set out the exact factul situation and a detalied schedule of costs from a contractor or engineer. The sehedule must constitute an ability to complete such project with no more than a ten percent eontingeney. All steh project material will provide evaluations of potential for untsual site characteristies which might influence construction or operating costs. In each ease, the project deseription will doeument the direet relationship between the project and the jobs created.
( ${ }^{(1)}$ Project expenditures for existing buildings may include:
(2) In the case of counties designated as "severely depressed", project expenditures may inelude construction of or improvement to new-or existing water, sewer, gas, or electrical utility distribution lines or equipment to serve new or propesed industrial buildings to be used for manufaeturing and industrial operations. Sueh infrastruture shall be located on the site of the building-or direetly related to the specific manufaeturing activify.
(7) "Full-time Job" means a job that requires at least 1600 hours of work in a vear.
(h) "Renovation" shall have the same meaning as project,
as described in Paragraph (g) of this Rute.
(8) "Infrastructure" means utilities, typically referred to as "public utilities," or a rail spur where there is public ownership of the rail property.
(i) "Secretary" means the Seeretayy of the Department. of his designee.
(9) "Grant" means money given to a unit of government to pay for an economic development project and does not have to be repaid, if the terms of the grant are fulfilled, i.e. the jobs commitment is met.
(j) "State" means the State of North Carolina.
(10) "Loan" means money loaned to a unit of government to pay for an economic development project, to be repaid by the borrower based on an amortization schedule approved by the Department.
( $k$ ) "Severely Depressed" counties means those counties so designated under G.S. 105-130.40(e) or G.S. 105151.17 (c) of units of governments within these eounties.
(11) "Project" means an activity proposed for IDF funding. It shall be described narratively in an application and accompanied by a preliminary set of drawings, or sketches, or other data that present the project in factual detail, together with a schedule or itemization of costs from an engineer or contractor. The schedule of costs shall constitute the ability to complete a project with no more than a 10 percent contingency. Project expenditures may include:
(a) For basic IDF-
(i) the construction of, or improvements to existing water, sewer, gas or electrical utility systems, distribution lines, or required storage facilities, or a rail spur when either is publicly owned and operated, and or;
(ii) the renovation of buildings to-inelude including structural repairs, structurat improvements-such as roof repairs, repairs, addition of docks, or the erection of walls, or speciat structural supports to suppont cranes: for heavy equipment, electrical upgrades, or HVAC upgrades:
(iii) improvements the building that are necessary to make the a building suitable for the occupancy of the building by the-oceupant-and the operator of the project. Such improvements may include mechanical equipment such as heating or and air conditioning equipment. plumbing, pipes or trenching to handle effluents or process water, special electrical additions necescafy for-ovens, furnaces or other processors and lighting. If a renovation or an improvement is critical to the operation of a particthar manufacturing or industrial businesses:
business, or, if stre improvements are or is critical to the decision making process pertinent to the creation of such jobs, the actual improvement need not be located on the site of the industrial main project building. If, however, a grant of funds is involved, the improvement must be constructed on public right-of-ways or on property which the unit of government has an easement to treat as it normally would do as if it ouned the property. However. when extending infrastructure to a firm, IDF assistance ends at the private property line. Still In either situation, the application must document the exact relationship of between the jobs and the project. An example of a fundable project would be the case where a the unit of government must construct an elevated water tank and service water lines to provide water to a building so as to provide sprinkler water to a buitding where such service is directly required to operate the an industrial or manufacturing business. An example of an unfundable project would be where a unit of government seeks to expand or to repair its water utility (or other infrastructure) system and where the relationship to the creation of jobs is fairly general or indireet yague. The project witt shall be described in from the perspective of employment to be created in the and its impact area of to the project: Direct and indirect jobs witt be treated reparately in the diseussion. The operator of the project will provide details as to the nature of direct jobs ereated. including the-skills required. work conditions. wages paid and seasonal influences-on the number-of Work days per year.
(D) the installation of or ptrfehase of manufacturing equipment or process productions equipment:
(iv) the purchase and installation of equipment that is associated with the industrial classification of the project.
(b) For Emergency Economic Development Assistance Loans to local units of government for economic development projects designed to create jobs, lead to the creation of jobs. or save jobs, and to assist in alleviating the economic dislocation created by the loss of jobs.
(c) For the Utilit Account-
(i) the construction of or improvements to
water, sewer, gas or electrical utility systems, distribution lines, or required storage facilities, or a rail spur or rail line when either is publicly owned and operated, and or;
(ii) equipment for existing or proposed industrial buildings for operations in the industrial classifications that are currently eligible to receive Utility Account funding within the tier area.
(d) For Clean Water Bonds-
(i) the construction of or improvements to new or existing water or sewer distribution lines or equipment;
(ii) the construction or improvements to new or existing wastewater treatment facilities; or
(iii) improvements that will expand the capacity of existing wastewater treatment facilities or water supply systems.
(13) "State" means the State of North Carolina.
(14) "Application" means the pages of documents in which an applicant for 1DF funds identifies itself. describes a project, specifies the funds required, provides a breakdown of project costs, and submits the benefiting firm's commitment to create jobs and evidence of its credit worthiness.
(15) "Local Matching Funds" means funds of a unit of government contributed to an economic development project for the purpose of assisting in a total financing package and earning (or winning) other funds by doing so. Matching is usually expressed as a ratio, i.e. one local dollar for three state dollars, or one for three.
(16) "Local Matching Requirement." The Department requires local matching in grant projects except for Emergency Economic Development Assistance projects and those located in a tier area that has been exempted from matching by NC General Statutes. The required rate shall be one for three or one local dollar for each three state dollars.
(17) "Participation Loan" means a loan between at least three parties to wit: $\underline{\text { A bank or financial institution, }}$ the private firm. and the unit of government. The essence of a participation loan is that the bank, or financial institution, and the unit of government shall share at least equally in the lending arrangements. meaning the money loaned and the risk involved and collateral shared.
(18) "Borrower" means the private firm identified in a participation loan for building improvement or equipment in the basic $I D F$, or the unit of government when the money is spent for emergency economic dislocation assistance or when the money is reloaned in a utility account project. Additionally, the unit of government shall be the borrower when IDF is used to assist local matching, or in other cases when the
artment believes the project can be more prudently structured as a loan rather than a grant. "Preapplication Conference" means a meeting held at the Department to discuss a proposed IDF application and includes: a representative of Commerce Finance Center; the applicant: an official of the benefitting firm; and a banker, if a participation loan is involved. A preapplication conference may be waived when the total IDF expenditures are expected to be fifty thousand dollars $(\$ 50,000)$ or less.
(20) "Clean Water Objectives of the State" include:
(a) Reducing the reliance on wells, septic tanks and similar facilities:
(b) Allowing residences, businesses, or local governments not otherwise served by water or sewer or wastewater infrastructure to connect into a distribution line or system (for water supply, sewer, or wastewater) being furnished in an economic development project for new or expanding industry.

(4) industrial and mantufaturing facilities owned by private "nem-profit" entities such as "Community Development Corporations" or Committee of $100^{\prime \prime}$ funded and/or endorsed by the elected leadership of the unit of Government: and
(5) industrial and mantuaturing facilities owned by" "for profit" entities be improved by funds loaned to the private "profit-makitig" entity by a unit of city-or eounty government.

(b) There is no set minimum grant amount of funding which applicants may request or to be awarded. If there are practical difficulties about a small amount or cost disadvantages, these shall be discussed with the applicant in a preapplication conference. Grant IDF awards shall not exceed the total amount speiffed appropriated by the General Assembly in its appropriation process. Chapter 830 of the 1987 Session Laws, in Section 111, Paragraph (2), limited the maximum grant io a sum not to exceed the lesser amount the two hundred fifty theusand dollars ( $\$ 250.000$ ). or a total of twelve hundred dollars $(\$ 1,200)$ for each job created. For basic IDF, Emergency Economic Development Assistance, and Clean Water Bonds Proceeds, per job or per project maximum funding limitation shall be the amounts established under current law. There is no maximum set for Utility Account funding; but the amount of awards shall be determined by the Secretary. For the purpose of this Section basic IDF, the per job limitation shall be imposed applied on the basis of requiring a commitment from the oceupying-industriat or manufacturing firm operator of the business as to the number of jobs it will ereate that shall be created over a reasonable period of time, not to exceed three years. The number of jobs created will inelude only these people directly employed in permanent or seasenal jobs by the operator whe occupies the facility: indirect and temporafy jobs will not be included. (c) When a-project-renovation-or-improvement is-to-be aceomplished to a building or on a site owned by a private entity, Whether the private entity is conducted on a "for profit" or on a "not for profit" basis, the project will be financed by a loan to that private entity. This tean will be made to the private entity by the toeal unit of government with funds made available from this program. In each case the toeat unit of government will establish its own awherity 10 do that-finaneing. The applicant will-require and provide to the Department of Commerce satisfactory documentation that all costs are reasonable and that all funds are to be expended with regard to the conflict of interest statutes regulating-business transactions between government officials and other involved parties. The applicamt will propese a plan of project administration which is stisfactory for the Department of Commerce.
(d) All funds expended which direetly assist participating private entities must be repaid to grant recipients and then returned to the Deparment of Commerce as such repayments are feseived. Such repaid funds will not be retumed to the General Fund, but set aside to fund new projects approved under this Subchapter.-Generally, project grants elassified under Rule 0202 (a) ( 1 ) will not be repaid. Repayment for projects otherwise classified may be given subordinate collaterat
positions, interest costs which are at less than market rates, of amortization which defers cash flow. in so long as requests are documented as necessay to the creation of jobs and the success of the project.
(e) A project will be-subject to review by the Department of Commeree at any-time-during the first three vears after the project begins. For a project ctassified under Rule 0202 (a) (2) (3) (4) and (5) of this Rule. any repayment batance that it owes the local unit of government may be partially or fully accelerated if the business has closed, or if the operating company has not made reasomable progress towards its jobs creation goat.
(d) Under basic IDF, improvements to building properties and equipment purchases (either of which becomes private property) shall be loan projects and shall be accomplished with participation loans. The three parties to a participation loan shall be: the borrower's North Carolina bank, the borrower, and the unit of government. The bank and the unit of government (using IDF funds) shall be at least equal participants, sharing equally in the funds provided and in the risk and collateral involved. The bank, however, may supply more money than just matching IDF; in this case, the bank's pro rata share is larger. Also. in the matter of sharing equally this means that if the bank takes a certain collateral position, the unit of government shall share in that position. If either an out-of-state bank or a financial institution other than a bank is used in a participation loan, that must be approved by the Department.
(e) IDF funds may be provided to a unit of government to meet matching funds requirements. In this case the Department shall furnish a loan repayment schedule to the mavor, city manager or county manager, which, in addition to the award letter and application. shall establish the responsibility for repayment and times and amounts of repayment.
(f) Loans for Emergenct Economic Development projects shall be accomplished as in Paragraph (d) of this Rule.
(g) Loans for Utility Account projects shall be accomplished as in Paragraph (d) of this Rule except for building improvements or equipment that the operator shall own. In that case, the loan shall be a participation loan as in Paragraph (c) of this Rule.
(h) With either grants or loans, the Department shall require financial information from the project owner or operator to establish financial capability. The usual requirement shall be the preceding three years financial and operating statements: for new businesses, at least three years pro forma statements and a business plan. In any case, the Department mav use credit reports. bank information, or other data that it deems appropriate to establish the credit worthiness of the borrower.
(i) A project shall be subject to review by the Department at any time during the first three vears after the project begins.
(i) The Department mav require a unit of government to partially or fully accelerate loan repayments if the operator's business has closed, moved, or if the company has not made reasonable progress toward its jobs creation commitment. The Department may require reparment of a grant, partiall or fulls: if the operating company has moved, closed, or has not made satisfactory progress towards its jobs creation commitment: and. in the case of Emergency Economic Development Assistance or the Utility Account. if funds are not spent in the manner for
which they were approved.

The Department shall consider an abandonment statement as prima facie proof of lack of abandonment.

(g) For Clean Water Bonds projects, the Department shall make a finding that the proposed project will have a favorable impact on the Clean Water Objectives of the State.

Each year, on or before December 3I, the Secretary of the Department of Commerce shall rank each of the 100 counties of the state according to criteria currently set by NC General Statutes. The highest numerically ranked county shall reflect the most adverse economic data, whereas the lowest ranked county shall reflect the most favorable data. This listing of all counties shall then be divided into groups or tier areas. The Secretary shall designate at that time those counties and their tier areas that are eligible to participate in the Industrial Development Fund using the priority specified under current statutes. This designation is effective for the following year: however, a Tier One county retains its designation for at least two consecutive years.

## SECTION 0300 - LOCAL WATER SAFETY REGULATIONS

## . 0310 DARE COUNTY

(a) Regulated Areas. This Rule applies to the following waters and portions of waters:
(1) Manteo. Doughs Creek adjacent to Shallowbag Bay and all canals situated within the territorial limits of the Town of Manteo.
(2) Hatteras.
(A) The waters of Hatteras Harbor and Muddy Creek bounded on the north and south by the high-water mark, on the west by a straight line between channel markers number 20 and 17. and on the east by the mouth of Muddy Creek at Sandy Bay.
(B) The waters of Hatteras Inlet North Dock ferry basin and the Hatteras Landing channel, including the vicinity of Coast Guard Beacon

Number One in the approach channel as delineated by appropriate markers.
(3) Mann's Harbor. The waters of Ferry' Dock Road Canal.
(4) Nags Head:
(A) Those waters contained within the canals of Old Nags Head Cove Development:
(B) The Roanoke Sound inlets at Pond Island on either side of Marina Drive extending north from US 64-264.
(5) Wanchese:
(A) The waters of Wanchese Harbor:
(B) The Canal from its beginning where it connects with the Roanoke Sound south of the dead end road SR 1141 extending northwest roughly parallel to SR 1141 and $\operatorname{SR}$ 1142, then westward roughly parallel to NC 345, and finally curving to the southwest roughly parallel to the C.B. Daniels Road to its end.
(6) Stumpy Point Canal. That portion of Stumpy Point Canal beginning at the Wildlife Resources Commission boating access area and extending inland for a distance of 3.600 feet.
(7) Stumpy Point Basin. That portion of the Stumpy Point Basin, at the head of the Stumpy Point Bay, which is next to Highway 264 in the dock area and designated by the appropriate markers.
(8) Town of Southern Shores. The waters contained in the canals and lagoons within the territorial limits of the Town of Southern Shores.
(9) Colington Harbour. The waters contained in the canals of Colington Harbour.
(10) Kitty Hawk. Those waters contained in the canals of Kitty Hawk Landing Subdivision.
(11) Washington Baum Bridge. Those waters of the Roanoke Sound from marker 24B north of the bridge to marker 24 A south of the bridge. and 50 yards east of the navigation span west to the shore as designated by the appropriate markers.
(12) Colington Island. The waters contained in an area beginning at the bath house and recreation center on the western shore of Colington Island, running 600 feet in a northerly direction and extending 300 feet into Albemarle Sound as marked.
(13) The waters of Baum Bay Harbor.
(14) The waters of High Bridge Creek.
(15) Mill Creek - The waters of Pamlico Sound at Mill Creek near Avon as delineated by appropriate markers.
(16) Ginguite Creek - The waters of Ginguite Creek from Highway 158 north to Lot 15 in Martins Point Subdivision.
(17) Marina Canal - The waters of Marina Canal starting at the mouth of the canal from the Pamlico Sound to the boat basin adjoining Palmetto Shores Subdivision.
(b) Speed Limit. No person shall operate any motorboat or vessel at greater than no-wake speed within any of the regulated areas described in Paragraph (a) of this Rule.
(c) Restricted Swimming Area. No person operating or responsible for the operation of any vessel, surfboard, water skis, or jet skis shall permit the same to enter any marked swimming area described in Subparagraph (12) of Paragraph (a) of this Rule.
(d) Placement and Maintenance of Markers. Subject to the approval of the United States Coast Guard and the United States Army Corps of Engineers. the following agencies are designated suitable agencies for placement and maintenance of markers implementing this Rule as to the regulated areas listed in the several Subparagraphs of Paragraph (a) of this Rule:
(1) the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Manteo as to the areas indicated in Subparagraph (1);
(2) the Board of Commissioners of Dare County as to the areas indicated in Subparagraphs (2) through (7), (9), (11), (13), and (15).(15), (16) and (17).

## . 0330 CARTERET COUNTY

(a) Regulated Areas. This Rule applies to the following waters in Carteret County:
(1) the waters of Money Island Slough beginning at the east end of Money Island near the Anchorage Marina Basin and ending at the west end of Money Island where Brooks Avenue deadends at the slough;
(2) the waters of Taylor Creek located within the territorial limits of the Town of Beaufort;
(3) the waters of Pelletier Creek beginning at the entrance to Pelletier Creek at the Intracoastal Waterway and ending at U.S. Highway 70;
(4) the waters of Bogue Sound in Morehead City between Sugar Loaf Island and the seawall on the south side of Evans, Shepard and Shackleford Streets and bounded on the east by the State Ports Authority and on the west by the eastern right-of-way margin of South 13th Street extended;
(5) the waters of Gallant's Channel from the US 70 crossing over the Grayden Paul bridge to Taylor's Creek:
(6) the waters of Cedar Island Bay and Harbor from U.S. 70 to Cedar Island Bay Channel Light 8;
(7) the waters of the small cove on the west side of Radio Island immediately south of the B \& M Railroad and US 70 Bridges across the Intracoastal Waterway in which Radio Island Marina and Morehead Sports Marina are located as delineated by appropriate markers;
(8) the waters of the Newport River beginning at the north side of the Beaufort Drawbridge and ending at marker \#6;
(9) the waters of Spooners Creek within the territorial limits of the Town of Morehead City as delineated by
appropriate markers;
(10) the waters of Taylor's Creek from the eastern end of the current no wake zone eastward to Channel Marker \#1A;
(11) the waters of the Newport River at Bogue Sound including all waters surrounding the Port of Morehead City to Brandt Island as delineated by appropriate markers. markers;
(12) the waters of Morgans Creek as delineated by appropriate markers.
(b) Speed Limit. It is unlawful to operate a motorboat or vessel at a speed greater than no-wake speed while on the waters of the regulated areas designated in Paragraph (a) of this Rule.
(c) Placement and Maintenance of Markers. The Board of Commissioners of Carteret County, with respect to the regulated areas designated in Subparagraphs (1), (3), (5), (6), (7), (8), and (10) (10) and (12) of Paragraph (a) of this Rule, and the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Beaufort, with respect to the regulated area designated in Subparagraph (2) of Paragraph (a) of this Rule, and the Board of Commissioners of Morehead City, with respect to Subparagraph (4) and (9) of Paragraph (a) of this Rule, and the North Carolina Sate Ports Authority, with respect to the regulated area designed in Subparagraph (11) of Paragraph (a) of this Rule are designated as suitable agencies for placement and maintenance of the markers implementing this Rule, subject to the approval of the United States Coast Guard and the United States Army Corps of Engineers.

## . 0342 CATAWBA COUNTY

(a) Regulated Areas. This Rule applies to the following waters of Lake Hickory:
(1) the public fishing pier located at the old Wildlife Club off 12th Street Drive. NW. City of Hickory:
(2) the shores of the Dixie Boat Club, Inc.;
(3) that area within 50 yards of the Moore's Ferry Boat Marina and Boathouse on 44th Avenue, Circle NW;
(4) the cove entering the Lake Hickory RV ResortMarina as delineated by appropriate markers.
(b) Speed Limit. No person shall operate a vessel at greater than no-wake speed in the waters of the regulated areas specified in Paragraph (a) of this Rule.
(c) Placement and Maintenance of Markers. The governing board of the City of Hickory and the Catawba County Board of Commissioners are designated suitable agencies for placement and maintenance of the markers implementing this Rule, subject to the approval of the United States Coast Guard and the United States Army Corps of Engineers.

## SWEARING IN OF NEW MEMBERS

## APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at $10: 05$ a.m. with Chairman Powell presiding. He asked for any discussion, comments, or corrections concerning the minutes of the November 19, 1998 meeting. There being none, the minutes were approved.

## FOLLOW-UP MATTERS

4 NCAC $3 \mathrm{~B} .0101, .0102$, and .0103 : COMMERCE/Banking Commission - No response was received from the agency on these rules.

4 NCAC 3H . 0002: COMMERCE/Banking Commission - No response was received from the agency on this rule.
10 NCAC 3R.6112: DHHS/Medical Care Commission - The rewritten rule submitted by the agency was objected to due to lack of statutory authority and ambiguity. The rewritten rule did not cure any of the earlier objections and in addition is either an improper attempt to incorporate the agency"s own materials by reference or is unnecessary in that it attempts to merely tell the agency to do what it is already legally required to do.
$10 \mathrm{NCAC} 3 \mathrm{U} .0305 .1601, .2805, .2806$, and .2810 : DHHS/Child Care Commission - The rewritten rules submitted by the agency were approved by the Commission.

10 NCAC 20C .0206: DHHS/Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Services - The rewritten rule submitted by the agency was approved by the Commission.

11 NCAC 8.0912 - INSURANCE/Manufactured Housing Board: The rewritten rule submitted by the agency' was approved by the Commission.

12 NCAC 7D . 1201, .1202, .1301, .1302, .1303,.1304, .1305,.1306, and .1307: JUSTICE/NC Private Protective Services Board - No response was received from the agency on these rules.

12 NCAC 9B .0301: JUSTICE/Criminal Justice Education \& Training Standards Commission - The rewritten rule submitted by the agency was approved by the Commission.

15A NCAC $1 \mathrm{~N} .0403, .0604, .0701$, and .0703 : DENR - The rewritten rules submitted by the agency were approved by the Commission.

15A NCAC 2D .1208: DENR/Environmental Management Commission - The rewritten rule submitted by the agency was approved by the Commission.

15A NCAC 3P .0202: DENR/Marine Fisheries Commission - The rewritten rule submitted by the agency was approved by the Commission.

15A NCAC 8G . $0401, .0402, .0403, .0404, .0405, .0406, .0407$, and .0409 : DENR/Water Pollution Control Systems Operators Certification Commission - The rewritten rules submitted by the agency were approved by the Commission.

15A NCAC 18A .2804: DENR/Commission for Health Services - The rewritten rule submitted by the agency was approved by the Commission.

21 NCAC $46.1612, .2306, .2502, .2609$, and .2611 : N C Board of Pharmacy - The rewritten rules submitted by the agency were approved by the Commission with the exception of .2306 which was withdrawn by the agency.

21 NCAC 57A .0305: N C Appraisal Board - The agency requested additional time to look at this rule.

## LOG OF FILINGS

Chairman Powell presided over the review of the $\log$ and all rules were unanimously approved with the following exceptions:
4 NCAC 1E .0104: COMMERCE/Commerce Finance Center - The Commission objected to this rule due to ambiguity. In (c), it is not clear what information has been prescribed by the secretary. This objection applies to existing language in the rule.

4 NCAC 11 Rules: COMMERCE/Commerce Finance Center - These rules were returned to the agency for failure to comply with the APA. The rules were adopted only 15 days after publication of the notice of text.

4 NCAC 1 K .0102 : COMMERCE/Commerce Finance Center - The Commission objected to this rule due to lack of statutory authority. In $(\mathrm{p})(2)$, there is no authority for the agency to require calculations to be done in accordance with an agency policy which has not been adopted as a rule.

4 NCAC 1K.0103: COMMERCE/Commerce Finance Center - The Commission objected to this rule due to ambiguity. In (a), it is not clear who designates or what the standards are for designating counties as urban counties or cities as entitlement cities or urban county cities. This objection applies to existing language in the rule.

4 NCAC 1K.0302: COMMERCE/Commerce Finance Center - The Commission objected to this rule due to ambiguity. It is unclear what is meant by "certain" criteria. This objection applies to existing language in the rule.

4 NCAC 1K.0402: COMMERCE/Commerce Finance Center - The Commission objected to this rule due to lack of statutory authority. The last sentence amounts to a waiver provision by allowing the Commerce Finance Center to give special instructions. No guidelines are provided so there is no authority for the rule.

10 NCAC 26H.0304: DHHS/Division of Medical Assistance - The Commission objected to this rule due to ambiguity. In $(k)(1)(C)(i)$, it is not clear what standards the Division of Medical Assistance will use in specifying salary levels. In (1)(4)(D), it is not clear what standards the Division will use in granting permission to continue cost settlement. In (u), it is not clear what constitutes "just cause." In $(y)(1)(B)$, it is not clear what standards the Division of Facility Services is to use to verify that a sprinkler system is needed. In $(y)(1)(C)$, it is not clear who are "appropriate authorities." In $(y)(1)(E)$, it is not clear what standards DMA will use in granting prior approval for installation. This objection applies to existing language in the rule.

Commissioner Sugg abstained from voting on all the Environmental Management Commission rules.
15A NCAC 2B . 0250 and . 0251 : DENR/Environmental Management Commission - The Commission listened to extensive presentation and then voted to approve these rules with changes previously submitted by the EMC to satisfy staffs concerns.

15A NCAC 7H .0308: DENR/Coastal Resources Commission - The Commission objected to the original rule due to ambiguity in (d)(1). It is unclear which alternative is more or less restrictive, who is to make the decision, or the standards for making the decision. A rewritten rule submitted by the agency was approved by the Commission and any existing objections were removed..

15A NCAC 7O.0202: DENR/Coastal Resources Commission - The Commission objected to the original rule due to lack of statutory authority. In (4) there is a prohibition against camping. DCM can give written permission, amounting to a waiver of the rule. However there are no standards for granting or denying the waiver, as required by $150 \mathrm{~B}-19(6)$. The rewritten rule submitted by the
agency was approved by the Commission.
17 NCAC 6B.0118: DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE - The Commission objected to this rule due to ambiguity. In (1) it is unclear what the distinction is between (2) and (3). The first cites a participant who has been issued a "letter of waming due to noncompliance with program requirements. The seemingly more serious "Probation" status in (3) simply requires that the participant has been issued a "warning letter." Is there a distinction between a "letter of warning" and a "warning letter?" If not then how is it determined whether someone is in (2) or (3)? Does "noncompliance with program requirements" in (2) have some specific meaning? Is there anything a participant could do that would result in a warning that is not coming from "noncompliance with program requirements?"

21 NCAC 8 N .0302 : NC State Board of Certified Public Accountant Examiners - The Commission objected to the original rule due to ambiguity: It is unclear in (b) whether firms organized under G.S. 55B or 57C shall not have any non-CPA ("minority") ownership or whether such ownership (non-CPAs) may be a majority. The rewritten rule submitted by the agency was approved by the Comnission.

21 NCAC 32S . 0105 : NC Medical Board - The Commission objected to the original rule due to lack of statutory authority. There is no authority to require applicants for renewal to submit any previously unspecified information desired by the Board as set out in (2) that may or may not be related to qualifications for licensure and renewal. Presumably the Board may seek any information required to comply with registration or renewal statutes or rules and this would be already included on the registration form, set out in item (1). The rewritten rule submitted by the agency was approved by the Commission.

21 NCAC 32S .0113: NC Medical Board - The Commission objected to the original rule due to lack of statutory authority and necessity. G.S. 90-14 specifies the grounds that the Board may use to revoke a license. If this rule expands those grounds (it used different wording in a number of cases) then there is no authority for such expansion. If it does not add anything to the statutory grounds, then it is unnecessary. The rewritten rule submitted by the agency was approved by the Commission contingent upon receiving a technical change. The technical change was received.

21 NCAC 32S .0114: NC Medical Board - The Commission objected to this rule due to lack of necessity: Except for (c) this rule does not seem to add anything that is not already set out in statute. The rule was withdrawn by the agency.

2] NCAC 32S .0117: NC Medical Board - The Commission objected to the original rule due to lack of statutory authority. There is no proper authority cited for these fees. The rewritten rule submitted by the agency was approved by the Commission.
2) NCAC 46.1804: NC Board of Pharmacy - The Commission objected to this rule due to lack of statutory authority and ambiguity: This rule amendment either goes bevond the Board's authority or is unclear. It is unclear what is meant by "the alteration" of a prescription order at the end of (a). Aside from the lack of clarity in the rule, it nonetheless seems the board is exceeding its regulatory authority. The board has no authority to direct third parties in how to act or to refrain from acting. The rule is unclear as to the action that is required or forbidden. It seems to be directed towards persons over whom the board has no authority:

21 NCAC 46.2506 : NC Board of Pharmacy - The Commission objected to this rule due to lack of statutory authority: The rule on its face is not ambiguous and allows pharnacists to choose to work over the limit specified in the rule. If this is so. there is no necessity for the rule. Even if it were necessary: there is no authority for this rule as to how pharmacies are to conduct their business. (This rule regulates the pharmacy permit holder, not the pharmacist.) The authority cited simply provides that a pharmacy must register with the board and supply certain limited information (the identity of the pharmacist manager and all pharmacist personnel). If that information is provided, the board has no authority to deny the permit. Beyond that there is no additional authority over a pharmacy. The substantive authority cited. G.S. 90-85.32, is authority to set rules governing the "filling. refilling. and transfer of prescriptions"." This is authority over the pharmacists, not the pharmacy. The activity that is regulated in 90-85.32 constitutes the practice of pharmacy, which requires a licensed person, a pharmacist, to fullill (G.S. 90-85.3(p) - (r)). The rule. as written. is unnecessary and beyond the board's authority.
