EXPLANATION OF THE PUBLICATION SCHEDULE

GENERAL

The North Carolina Register shall be published twice a month and contains the following information submitted for publication by a state agency:

- (1) temporary rules;
- (2) text of proposed rules;
- (3) text of permanent rules approved by the Rules Review Commission;
- (4) emergency rules
- (5) Executive Orders of the Governor;
- (6) final decision letters from the U.S. Attorney General concerning changes in laws affecting voting in a jurisdiction subject of Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as required by G.S. 120-30.9H; and
- (7) other information the Codifier of Rules determines to be helpful to the public.

COMPUTING TIME: In computing time in the schedule, the day of publication of the North Carolina Register is not included. The last day of the period so computed is included, unless it is a Saturday, Sunday, or State holiday, in which event the period runs until the preceding day which is not a Saturday, Sunday, or State holiday.

FILING DEADLINES

ISSUE DATE: The Register is published on the first and fifteen of each month if the first or fifteenth of the month is not a Saturday, Sunday, or State holiday for employees mandated by the State Personnel Commission. CHAPTER 20 - STATE FAIR

SUBCHAPTER 20B - REGULATIONS OF THE STATE FAIR

SECTION .0100 - GENERAL PROVISIONS

02 NCAC 20B .0103 **ADVERTISING MATTER**

(a) Distribution of advertising material or matter of any kind, nature, or description by concessionaires, exhibitors, patrons attending annual exhibitions on the State Fairgrounds, political parties, or by any other person or persons whomsoever, shall be, and the same hereby is, prohibited on the State Fairgrounds unless such distribution shall be within and from the assigned and designated space and shall have been first duly authorized by the State Fair Manager upon application thereto, and that advertising material or matter of any kind, nature or description shall be on the counter or display area and shall not be handed out unless a fair patron requests such materials. Promiscuous handing out of such material, even from designated areas, is strictly forbidden.

(b) The distribution in any manner of advertising material having a gummed or adhesive backing, such as labels, lapel badges, car bumper or window stickers, etc., whether such distribution shall be from a contracted exhibit or concession space or elsewhere, is prohibited upon the State Fair grounds. Persons or firms found distributing such materials shall immediately forfeit all space right and, in addition, may be held financially responsible for any and all damage done to or occasioned by the State Fair as a result of these materials being affixed to State Fair property by third parties.

(c)(b) Operation of a sound truck or other mobile vehicle equipped with a public address system or sign, whether such vehicle is in motion or parked on the fair grounds, whether within or without the fenced-off area thereof, is hereby prohibited.

(d)(c) For the purpose of enforcing the provisions of this Section, it is hereby determined that the State Fair grounds shall consist of and constitute that certain area of land in Wake County bounded on the south by Hillsborough Street, on the east by Blue Ridge Boulevard, on the north by Trinity Road, and on the west by the Gov. James B. Hunt, Jr. Horse Complex, and includes the area without as well as within the fenced portion thereof.

(e)(d) The prohibitions and restrictions relating to advertising in these regulations shall not be construed as being applicable to lettered service trucks advertising a concern or its products while making necessary deliveries of merchandise or service to

concessionaires or exhibitors on the State Fair grounds, or the normal small advertising on bumpers and windows of vehicles.

SUBCHAPTER 43L - MARKETS

SECTION .0300 - FEES: WESTERN NORTH CAROLINA HORSE AND LIVESTOCK FACILITY FEE SCHEDULE

02 NCAC 43L .0337 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

(a) <u>A person shall not possess any alcoholic beverage on</u> <u>Agricultural Center property except as permitted by the</u> <u>Agricultural Center Manager and in compliance with the rules of</u> <u>the North Carolina Alcoholic Beverage Control Commission. The</u> <u>possession, sale, or consumption of any alcoholic beverage shall</u> <u>be in compliance with the state alcoholic beverage control laws</u> <u>set forth in G.S. 18B and rules set forth in 14B NCAC 15.</u>

(b) Alcoholic beverages shall not be sold during the annual North Carolina Mountain State Fair. The sampling or sale of alcoholic beverages at an event on the Western NC Agricultural Center, including the Mountain State Fair, shall require approval by the Manager of the Western NC Agricultural Center or his or her designee in negotiation and at the time of the signing of the contract to rent the premises. In making this determination, the Manager of the Western NC Agricultural Center Manager shall consider the following factors:

- (1) the nature of the event;
- (2) the time of the event;
- (3) the number of attendees at the event;
- (4) the age of the attendees at the event;
- (5) prior history of the event;
- (6) <u>other events on Western NC Agricultural</u> <u>Center property at that time;</u>
- (7) security needed and available at the time of the event; and
- (8) the health, safety and welfare of all patrons on State Fair property.

SUBCHAPTER 06F – BARBER SCHOOL

SECTION .0100 – BARBER SCHOOL

21 NCAC 06F .0101 PHYSICAL STRUCTURE

(a) For the purpose of this Rule, "practical area" means the area of the school where barbering services are provided.

(b) The physical structure of barber schools in North Carolina shall conform to the following criteria:

- (1) be a minimum of 14 linear feet wide;
- (2) be equipped with a minimum of <u>three barber</u> <u>chairs for barber schools within jail or prison</u> <u>facilities or 10 barber chairs for all other</u> <u>schools, and these chairs shall that</u> meet the sanitary conditions required by G.S. 86A-15(a)(2);
- (3) have a minimum of 896 square feet in the practical area for the first 10 chairs; area;

- have an additional 70 square feet in the practical area for each additional barber chair over the required 10; 10 chairs;
- (5) have at least five linear feet of space between each chair, center to center;
- (6) have no more than two students enrolled per barber chair;
- (7) be equipped with toilet facilities with handwashing sink or basin;
- (8) have concrete or wood floors covered with smooth, nonporous materials;
- (9) have instructional materials, such as blackboard space or slide programs;
- (10) have a workstand, with a mounted mirror with minimum dimensions of 36 inches tall and 20 inches wide, for each barber chair in the practical area, constructed of material that can be washed and cleansed;
- (11) have a tool cabinet for each barber chair, with a door to limit exposure of the tools to the open air;
- (12) have a towel cabinet, or other method of storage, so that clean towels are stored separate from used towels;
- (13) have at least one fully functional sink or lavatory, with hot and cold water, for each two barber chairs, located within seven unobstructed linear feet of each barber chair. This sink distance requirement does not apply to schools permitted on or before September 1, 2009;
- (14) have the school separate from any other place or type of business, except for a business allowed by G.S. 86A-15(a)(1)(b), by a wall of ceiling height;
- (15) have a classroom area, separate from the practical area, with desk chairs sufficient to serve the number of students enrolled, and a desk and chair for the instructors;
- (16) have a means for electronic recordation of student hours;
- (17) have a sign displayed in each practical area of the school stating that all barbering services are performed by students; and
- (18) have a bulletin board hanging in each classroom area with a posting of the sanitation rules in this <u>Subchapter</u> and <u>the</u> minimum school curricula as set forth in 21 NCAC 06F .0120.

This Paragraph applies to barber schools permitted on or after December 1, 1994 or which undergo structural renovations after that date.

(c) All barber schools seeking a new permit shall receive a satisfactory building inspection by the jurisdiction having authority prior to obtaining a shop inspection pursuant to 21 NCAC 06L .0105.
