Page: 6-1 A. Site Level Administrator Licensure and Credentials

Keep rules (a) Administrator of NC Pre-K sites shall have:

- (1) A NC Principal's License or
- (2) A North Carolina Early Childhood Administrator Credential (NCECAC) Level III or
- (3) Hold a bachelor's degree in any field with 18 semester hours in early Childhood education and child development, and complete six semester hours in child care administration or nine semester hours in business administration or a combination of child care administration and business administration.
- (4) If the site level administrator does not meet subparagraphs (a)(1), (2), or (3) of this rule, the following shall apply:
 - (A) A provisional approval shall be given for four years from the time the site began participation with the NC Pre-K program for he administrator to attain an NC Principals license, or NCECAC III, or complete a Bachelor's Degree in any field with 18 semester hours in early childhood education and child development, and complete 6 hours in child care administration or nine semester hours in business administration or a combination of child care administration and business administration; and
 - (B) Progress toward this requirement shall be considered a minimum of six documented semester hours per year in early childhood education, child development, child care administration and business administration course work.

Or Propose to add: Option (C) Existing Sites (established those that have been opened more than 4 years) may have a NCECAC II and 10 years experience or hold a NCECAC III or complete a Bachelor's Degree in any field with 18 semester hours in Early Childhood education and child development, and complete 6 semester hours in child care administration or nine semester hours in business administration or a combination of child care administration and business administration.

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I am Mary Myers and I have been in the Early Childhood and Education field since 1970. I earned AAS degree in 2010. I started out in my licensed childcare with 23 children and now own two businesses; currently Mary Myers Children's Center and Mary Myers Day Care. Within my 50 years; I have owned up to 5 child care centers. The reason for this proposal is that I have noticed over the years especially during the global pandemic; the child care business is volatile and we are in unprecedented times; Administrators are finding it extremely hard to meet the education requirements put forth by the legislators. In my proposal; I am asking for experience to be added as an option.

I have spoken to others directors in my community; we all could lose/close our centers if these rules are not adapted to fit during these difficult times. The cost of paying staff with the higher education is not attainable for the owners of the child care facilities.

In my experience; I have hired teachers with BS/BA degrees; but they do not know how to build relationships with the children, they may be great at making lesson plans but they do not know how to apply it in the classroom. Within the BS/BA degree they do not always get the hands-on experience in the classroom with the children and this makes it very hard for the teachers to deal with children with special needs or children with challenging behaviors.

I would almost guarantee if you created a poll to ask Administrators what is the one thing that is their biggest challenge and it would be finding educated teachers and paying them at the rate of the school system; it is just not feasible for Early Education Facilities to do this. I am fighting for these changes because I feel it is in the best interest of Early Childhood programs across the state and the School systems. Thank you for your consideration.
