In (4), line 15, please delete the comma after "but" If you wish to mirror the language in (9), line 30, insert a comma after "inserted"

On line 18, consider replacing "is" with "shall be"

And so that I'm clear – what is the difference between (4) and (9)? Does (9) not involve a resampling?

In (7), who will collect, process, and analyze this? The Division?

In (10), Page 2, line 2, please end the sentence after "amendments."

In (14), why are you defining this term? I don't see it used elsewhere within the Section. Is the intent to make it clear that these months are not part of the swimming season?

In the History Note, line 13, why are you citing to G.S. 113-182?

And on lines 5-6, why are you adding "of Marine Fisheries" here, given the definition of "Division" in Rule .3401?

In (a), lines 12-13, (b), lines 18-19, (c), lines 28-29 and lines 33-34, (d), Page 2, lines 2-3, and (e), lines 8-9, what authority are you relying upon for this sign to cite to the authority of the Office of the State Health Director, rather than DEQ?

In (c), line 21, and elsewhere you refer to a "drain" – is that the "pipe" in the sign? If so, then how will the sign in (c), lines 30 - 34 work, as this Paragraph also applies to storm water discharge? Or will storm water discharge also come from a pipe?

In (e), Page 2, line 5, I take it your regulated public knows what "dredge material" is?

In the History Note, line 11, why are you citing to G.S. 113-182?
