Explain:

Due to the serious and unforeseen threat to the public health and safety caused by COVID-19, the State Board of Environmental Health Specialist Examiners adopted temporary rules simultaneously adopted as emergency rules. The Board adopted emergency rules without prior notice or hearing or upon any abbreviated notice or hearing the agency found practical, because adherence to the notice and hearing requirements of this part would be contrary to the public interest, and the immediate adoption of the rule is required by a serious and unforeseen threat to the public health, safety, or welfare. On 3/10/20, the Governor of North Carolina issued Executive Order No. 116, declaring a state of emergency to coordinate a response and enact protective measures to help prevent the spread of COVID-19. Additional Executive Orders prohibited mass gatherings and implemented a stay-at-home order for NC residents from 3/30/20 until 4/29/20, at the earliest. COVID-19, a respiratory disease, spreads easily from person to person and can result in serious illness or death. The Board seeks to contribute towards social isolation efforts directed by the Federal and State Government and assist registrants who are unable to complete required training within the timelines outlined in 21 NCAC 62 .0407(e), 21 NCAC 62 .0407(f), 21 NCAC 62 .0407(k) and 21 NCAC 62 .0411.

In reviewing this Rule, the staff recommends the following technical changes be made:

At line 7, please review the website link to ensure it is accurate.

In (e), who is required to complete the health law course? Is it registered environmental health specialists and registered environmental health specialist interns? If so, please consider adding that to the Rule to make it clear. Please also consider writing this sentence in active voice by saying who shall do what.

In (e), line 18, do environmental health specialists renew their registration annually? If so, what do you mean by "shall be completed within the first four years after the date of the most recent registration by the Board?" Please clarify.

At line 20, do you mean "and" instead of "or?"

At lines 28 and 38, consider changing "job related" to "job-related."

In (j), lines 17-18, did you intend to say "registered environmental health specialist or registered environmental health specialist's specialist intern's?"

In (k), as I read this, the Rule does not require the standard 15 clock hours before the additional 5 to roll over, is that correct? If so, consider: "Up to five clock hours of approved continuing education completed in the year ending December 31, 2020 may be applied toward the continuing education requirements for the following year."

Compare lines 17, 21, and page 2, line 21. What is the difference between a "contact hour," an "instructional clock hour," and a "clock hour?" Does your regulated public know?

In your history note, why is 90A-67 listed?

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21 NCAC 62 .0407 RENEWAL

- 4 (a) Applications for renewal shall be filed with the Board on a form provided by the Board and available from the
- 5 Board website at: www.rsboard.com or from the Division of Environmental Health, 1630 Mail Service Center,
- 6 Raleigh, NC 27699-1630. The renewal form may also be generated by the Registered Sanitarian Training and
- 7 Authorization (RSTAS) computer system at: http://apps.bluelizard.com/RSTAS/.
- 8 (b) The renewal application shall be completed and signed by the applicant.
- 9 (c) Renewal fees shall be paid in accordance with Rule .0405(a)(5) of this Section. The renewal application shall be
- posted on the Board's website at www.rsboard.com by October 1 of each year. The individual shall download and
- 11 submit the application for renewal to the Board. Individuals may also contact the Board at the Division of
- 12 Environmental Health, 1630 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, NC 27699-1630 for a copy.
- 13 (d) Registered environmental health specialists or registered environmental health specialists interns who fail to renew
- by December 31 shall be notified by the Board that their registration has expired and that they may not practice as a
- 15 registered environmental health specialist or a registered environmental health specialists intern until they have met
- the requirements for renewal.
- 17 (e) An environmental health law course based on North Carolina laws and rules with at least 15 contact hours approved
- by the Board shall be completed within the first four years of the date of most recent registration by the Board. This
- 19 <u>timeframe shall be extended by one additional year for anyone whose fourth year occurs in 2020.</u>
- 20 (f) Registered environmental health specialists or registered environmental health specialists interns shall complete a
- 21 minimum of 15 instructional clock hours of continuing education acceptable to the Board each year, except the 15
- 22 <u>hours shall not be required for the year ending December 31, 2020</u>. Continuing education acceptable to the Board
- 23 includes:

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- 24 (1) the specialized training course required in Rule .0411 of this Section;
- 25 (2) District Environmental Health Section Educational meetings;
 - (3) professional association courses and educational meetings;
- 27 (4) seminars or courses offered by the North Carolina State of Practice Committee;
- 28 (5) completion of a job related course offered by a college or university accredited by the Council of 29 Higher Education Accreditation with the hours credited for the year that the course is completed;
 - (6) successful completion of a job related course offered by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the Food and Drug Administration, or the Environmental Protection Agency;
- 32 (7) other practice-related training which:
 - (A) is technical in nature, related to the environment, environmental health or improving the practice of environmental health;
 - (B) is relevant to the actual job being performed by the participants or applicant;
 - (C) includes a method for determining the number of hours spent;
 - (D) includes a method of documentation for verification of completion;

1		(E) is available to all registered environmental health specialists and environmental health
2		specialist interns; and
3		(F) has been granted approval by the Board based on the above standards; and
4	(g) Registration	s that have expired may be renewed within 12 months after expiration upon submittal of application
5	and payment of	the renewal fee. The applicant shall provide verification to the Board that continuing education clock
6	hours were obtain	ned during the year since the expiration to comply with the requirements of this Section. Registrations
7	that have expire	d for more than 12 months may not be renewed.
8	(h) Interns that	are no longer employed in the field of environmental health in North Carolina may not renew.
9	(i) A registered	environmental health specialist or a registered environmental health specialist intern in good standing
10	whose active mi	litary service has impaired their ability to obtain the continuing education requirements in Paragraph
11	(f) of this Rule	are exempt from the continuing education requirement if written orders from their military unit are
12	provided to the I	Board. In addition, the renewal fee is waived for each calendar year the environmental health specialist
13	is on active duty	·.
14	(j) A registered	environmental health specialist or registered environmental health specialist intern who is disabled
15	may request a va	ariance in continuing education hours during the period of the disability. The Board may grant or deny
16	requests for vari	ance in continuing education hours based on a disabling condition on a case by case basis, taking into
17	consideration the	e particular disabling condition involved and its effect on the registered environmental health specialist
18	or registered en	vironmental health specialist's ability to complete the required hours. In considering the request, the
19	Board may requ	ire additional documentation substantiating any specified disability.
20	(k) A maximum	of five clock hours of approved continuing education, that is in excess of the required 15 clock hours,
21	may be applied t	oward the continuing education requirements for the following year. A maximum of five clock hours
