Dear Ms. Waggett:

At its May meeting, the Rules Review Commission objected to 02 NCAC 09L .1913 in accordance with G.S. 150B-21.10.

The Commission objected to Rule 02 NCAC 09L .1913 for lack of clarity and lack of necessity. The Rule is repetitive of the effective date contained in the history note and is therefore unnecessary. The Rule also does not specify whether the term "these Rules" refers to the rules of this Section or the rules of this Subchapter, making it unclear.

Please respond to this objection in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 150B-21.12.

At its meeting, the Rules Review Commission also extended the period of review for Rules 02 NCAC 09L .0101-.0103; .0308, .0310, .0317, .0318; .0402; .0502-.0505, .0509, .0515, .0516, .0519, .0520, .0522-.0527, .0529; .0602, .0603; .0701-.0703, .0705, .0707; .0810; .1001-.1003, .1005, .1006, .1009; .1102-.1105, .1107-.1109, .1111; .1201, .1202; .1302, .1303, .1305, .1306; .1401, .1402, .1404; .1805, .1806; .1901, .1902, .1905-.1909; .1914; .2001-.2004; and .2201-.2203. The Commission did so in response to a request from the agency to extend the period in order to allow the agency to address the requested technical changes and submit the revised rules at a later meeting.

At line 6, the rule says "in general." Are there exceptions to (1)? If so, are the exceptions (2) and (3)? If yes, please make that clear. If no, what are the exceptions?

At line 17, what is the purpose of the language "additional considerations?"

At line 23, please format (2) so it is aligned with (1) and (3).

At line 24, consider deleting "be expected to."

In (3), please consider deleting "that."

At line 30, what are "overages?" The other words in this rule in quotations are "passed" and "deficient," which I took to be the decision on whether to allow or approve a pesticide. Why is "overage" in quotations?

In (3)(b) and (c), please delete or define "significant."

At line 36, do you mean "and" or "or?"

At line 8, what other "similar reasons" are you referring to?

Under what circumstances does a modification or change in design warrant "the use or placement of equipment in lieu of that specified herein?" How does the Board make this determination? What factors are considered?

At line 9, by "in lieu of that specified herein" what equipment are you referring to? Is it the equipment in Paragraphs (a) and (b)? If so, please make that clear.

At line 9, do you mean "may" or "shall?" If you mean "may," under what circumstances does the Board allow these changes? What factors are considered?

At line 11, please refer to "this Rule."

At line 12, do you mean "may" or "shall?"

At line 15, please change "and/or" to either "and" or "or."

At lines 14-16, I take it the stop use order will specify the types of repairs required?
