TEMPORARY RULES REQUEST FOR TECHNICAL CHANGE

AGENCY: Manufactured Housing Board

RULE CITATION: 11 NCAC 08 .0913

The Rules Review Commission staff has completed its review of this rule prior to the Commission's next meeting. The Commission has not yet reviewed this rule and therefore there has not been a determination as to whether the rule will be approved. You may call this office to inquire concerning the staff recommendation.

In reviewing these rules, the staff determined that the following technical changes need to be made:

The comment period for this temporary adoption ended May 12, and the earliest date the Board could adopt is May 22. Why did the Board take until July 21 to adopt this temporary rule? To coincide with a regularly scheduled Board meeting?

Also, I note that the Board made changes from what was published on the OAH website. Please note, substantial change does not apply to temporary rules, but I am curious about the reason for the changes. Please address this in your Findings of Need form.

In the Findings of Need form:

In Box 2, this name (using the word "Emergency") is not the name used on the Rule submitted. Please either amend this Box or the Rule so that the name matches.

In Box 4, there is supposed to be a box for the effective date of the Emergency Rule, which was April 20, 2020. Please insert that.

In Box 5(e), give the date that you sent notice of this temporary rulemaking to the interested persons as required by G.S. 150B-21.1(a3).

In Box 7, I think you are missing language here. Specifically, the last sentence is incoherent. Pease revise this explanation.

In the Rule:

In the Introductory Statement, line 1, this is Rule .09<u>1</u>3. And please state that this temporary amendment is "with changes"

In (a), line 6, replace "which" with "that"

Amanda J. Reeder Commission Counsel Date submitted to agency: August 13, 2020 So that I'm clear – the temporary licensure in Rule .0911 is granted pursuant to G.S. 143-143.11(g)?

On lines 8 and 9, I don't see that this class is required by Rule .0911. Is this required by another rule?

In (b), line 14, replace "temporary rule" with "Rule"

Why do you need to restate the passing score here? Isn't that addressed by Rule .0911(a)?

On lines 15-16, replace "set forth above," with "in Paragraph (a) of this Rule,"

In the History Note, line 18, separate the serial citations to the same statute thusly: "G.S. 143-143.10(b)(1); 143-143.10(b)(4);"

Please insert that this is an expired emergency rule.

Insert a Temporary Adoption Eff. date – the earliest possible date is August 28, 2020.

In summation, your History Note will look like this:

History Note: Authority G.S. 143-143.10(b)(1); 143-143.10(b)(4); 143-143.11; Emergency Adoption Eff. April 20, 2020; Emergency Adoption Expired June 30, 2020; Temporary Amendment Eff. August 28, 2020.
