8		along with a written request to conduct the "Concealed Carry Handgun Training" course for
9		approval by the Commission prior to delivery of any instruction required by G.S. 14-415.12;
10	(3)	file a copy of all modifications;
11	(4)	be issued by Commission staff a quantity of certificates as requested by the instructor for course
12		participants which that shall bear the instructor's name, the instructor's assigned number, be
13		sequentially numbered, and bear the raised seal of the Commission;
14	(5)	if a Concealed Carry Handgun Instructor relinquishes his or her certification and wants to transfer
15		his or her assigned participants' certificates, certificates to another Concealed Carry Handgun

35		(a) The student fires 30 rounds of ammunition at a bulls-eye or silhouette target from three,
36		five five, and seven yard distances;
37		(b) At each yard distance the student shall fire <u>a minimum</u> ten rounds; and

1		(c) 21 of the 30 rounds fired by the student hit the target. target: and
2		(d) If the proficiency examination includes additional rounds, [rounds] the student shall also
3		pass with a minimum score of 70% on the total rounds fired.
