7		leave. Volunteer Service and Child Involvement Leave. The agency may require that the leave be
8		taken at a time other than the one requested, based on the needs of the agency. The agency may
9		require proof that community service leave taken is being utilized within the purpose of this
10		Subchapter Section.
11	(2)	Leave shall only be requested and approved for community service Volunteer Service that occurs
12		during the employee's regularly scheduled hours of work. Agencies with shift employees regularly
13		scheduled to work evening or night shift with a shift schedule in excess of eight hours-may allow the
14		use of community service leave Volunteer Service and Child Involvement Leave in situations where
15		the employee's participation in community service Volunteer Service and Child Involvement Leave
16		outside of the normal work schedule significantly impacts the employee's normal sleep period.

18	(3)	Reasonable travelTravel time may be included in approved time for community service, Volunteer
19		Service and Child Involvement Leave, but only for the time that intersects the employee's regular
20		work schedule.
21	(4)	If an employee transfers to another State agency, any balance of the community service
22		leave Volunteer Service and Child Involvement Leave not used shall be transferred to the new
23		agency. Under the tutoring and mentoring or literacy leave option, the employee shall secure
24		approval from the new supervisor to continue with that option prior to the transfer.
25	(5)	Leave not taken in a calendar year is forfeited; it shall not be carried over into the next calendar year.
26	(6)	Employees shall not be paid for this leave upon separation from State government.
27	(7)	The use of community service leave Volunteer Service and Child Involvement Leave shall be
28		reported separately from all other paid leave. Employees and supervisors are responsible for accurate
29		reporting of the use of community service leave Volunteer Service and Child Involvement Leave on
