9	(a) Definitions.	For purposes of this Rule, the following definitions shall apply:
10	<u>(1)</u>	Claim of Specialization: any use of the designations listed in this Rule or any representation stating
11		or implying that, by virtue of additional training, a licentiate possesses greater expertise in any aspect
12		of health care than is possessed by chiropractic physicians who have not had additional training.
13		The mere recitation of academic degrees awarded to a licentiate does not constitute a claim of
14		specialization.
15	<u>(2)</u>	Publication: representations regarding any claim of specialization made by a licentiate which may
16		include representations made in advertising, whether printed or broadcast; written representations
17		appearing on professional stationery, business cards, curriculum vitae, or office signage; and oral
18		representations made in judicial proceedings.
19	(b) Recognized	Specialties. The Board of Examiners recognizes the specialties in the following fields of practice:

30	of this Rule. A	licentiate shall not publish the specialty designation until the Board has approved, in writing, the
31	specialty design	ation requested.
32	(d) Criteria for	approval. In order to publish a claim of specialization as set forth in Paragraph (b) of this Rule or
33	upon request of	a specialty pursuant to Paragraph (c) of this Rule, a licentiate shall demonstrate the following:
34	<u>(1)</u>	Evidence of completion of a post-graduate course of study in the specialty requested at least 300
35		hours in length and offered by a college approved by the Council on Chiropractic Education; and

1	<u>(2)</u>	Evidence that the licentiate has passed an examination offered by a 501(c)(3) organization whose
2		testing for specialization is recognized by the House of Delegates of the American Chiropractic
3		Association or an exam deemed by the Board to be an equivalent.
4	<u>(e)</u> Claim of S	pecialty. Any published claim of specialization outside the recognized specialties or any published
5	claim of special	ization made by or at the behest of a licentiate who has not satisfied all applicable provisions of this
6	Rule constitutes	false or misleading advertising.
