At its meeting this morning, the Rules Review Commission declined to approve the above-captioned temporary rules in accordance with G.S. 150B-21.1(b).

The Rules Review Commission found the Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission (CJETS) did not meet the requirements for temporary rules as set forth in G.S. 150B-21.1(a)(1). Specifically, the Commission found that CJETS had not shown that COVID was "unforeseen" at this time, which is required by that subsection in order to engage in temporary rulemaking.

12 NCAC 09B .0202 is amended under temporary procedures as follows:

12 NCAC 09B .0202 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SCHOOL DIRECTOR

(a) In planning, developing, coordinating, and delivering each Commission-certified criminal justice training course, the School Director shall:

- (1) Formalize and schedule the course curriculum in accordance with the curriculum standards established in this Subchapter;
- (2) Select and schedule instructors who are certified by the Commission;
- (3) Provide each instructor with a current Commission course outline and all necessary additional information concerning the instructor's duties and responsibilities;
- (4) Notify each instructor that he or she shall comply with the Basic Law Enforcement Training Course Management Guide and provide him or her access to the most current version of the Course Management Guide;
- (5) Ensure each instructor utilizes Commission approved lesson plans and instructional materials;
- (6) Arrange for the availability of appropriate audiovisual aids and materials, publications, facilities, and equipment for training in all topic areas;
- (7) Develop, adopt, reproduce, and distribute any supplemental rules and requirements determined by the school to be necessary or appropriate for:
 - (A) effective course delivery;
 - (B) establishing responsibilities and obligations of agencies or departments employing or sponsoring course trainees; and
 - (C) regulating trainee participation and demeanor, ensuring trainee attendance, and maintaining performance records;
- (8) If appropriate, recommend housing and dining facilities for trainees;
- (9) Administer the course delivery in accordance with Commission approved lesson plans and course management guides;
- (10) Maintain direct supervision, direction, and control over the performance of all persons to whom any portion of the planning, development, presentation, or administration of a course has been delegated. The comprehensive final examination shall be administered by the Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission; and
- (11) Report the completion of each presentation of a Commission-certified criminal justice training course to the Commission, utilizing forms required for submission, which are located on the Agency's website: <https://ncdoj.gov/law-enforcement-training/criminal-justice/forms-and-publications/>.

(b) In addition to Paragraph (a) of this Rule, in planning, developing, coordinating, and delivering each Commission-certified Basic Law Enforcement Training Course, the School Director shall:

- 1 (1) Deliver training in accordance with the most current version of the Basic Law Enforcement Training
- 2 Course Management Guide as published by the North Carolina Justice Academy;
- 3 (2) Schedule course presentation to include 12 hours of instruction each week during consecutive
- 4 calendar weeks, except that there may be as many as three one-week breaks until course
- 5 requirements are completed; if the Governor declares a State of Emergency pursuant to N.C.G.S.
- 6 166A-19.3(19), the Director of the Criminal Justice Standards Division ~~may~~ shall allow additional
- 7 breaks in a specific course delivery when the Director determines that doing so is necessary based
- 8 on ~~circumstances~~ consideration of the following factors: ~~[related to a lawfully declared State of~~
- 9 Emergency,]
- 10 (A) Whether instruction has begun in the course or whether course initiation may be postponed;
- 11 (B) The risk of harm to students which may be caused by continuation of the course;
- 12 (C) Whether those enrolled in the course have been or will likely be called on action to help
- 13 address the State of Emergency;
- 14 (D) The specific need for the waiver; and
- 15 (E) The degree of benefit to the public in allowing a break in instruction.
- 16 Notice of waivers granted pursuant to the Section shall be posted on the CJETS (or Sheriffs) website

- 18 Section shall only apply to courses which began during the effective period of the State of

- 20 (3) Schedule only specialized instructors certified by the Commission to teach those high-liability areas
- 21 as specified in Rule .0304(a) of this Subchapter as either the lead instructor or as assistant instructors
- 22 or role players;
- 23 (4) With the exception of the First Responder, Physical Fitness, Explosives and Hazardous Materials,
- 24 and topical areas outlined in Rule .0304(a) of this Subchapter, schedule one specialized instructor
- 25 certified by the Commission for every six trainees while engaged in a practical performance
- 26 exercise;
- 27 (5) Schedule one specialized instructor certified by the Commission for every eight trainees while
- 28 engaged in a practical performance exercise in the topical area "Subject Control Arrest Techniques";
- 29 (6) Schedule no single individual to instruct more than 35 percent of the total hours of the curriculum
- 30 during any one delivery of the Basic Law Enforcement Training Course presentation;
- 31 (7) Not less than 30 days before commencing delivery of the Basic Law Enforcement Training Course,
- 32 submit to the Commission a Pre-Delivery Report of Training Course Presentation pursuant to 12
- 33 NCAC 09C .0211. The Pre-Delivery Report (Form F-10A) shall indicate a requested date and
- 34 location for the administration of the State comprehensive exam, and include the following
- 35 attachments:
- 36 (A) a course schedule showing the arrangement of topical presentations and proposed
- 37 instructional assignments; and

- 1 (B) a copy of any rules and requirements for the school. A copy of those rules shall also be
2 given to each trainee and to the executive officer of each trainee's employing or sponsoring
3 agency or department at the time the trainee enrolls in the course;
- 4 (8) Monitor, or designate an instructor certified by the Commission to monitor, a presentation of each
5 instructor once during each three year certification period in each topic taught by the instructor and
6 prepare a written evaluation on the instructor's performance and suitability for subsequent
7 instructional assignments. The observations shall be of sufficient duration to ensure that the
8 instructor is using the Instructional System Design model, and that the delivery is objective-based,
9 documented by, and consistent with a Commission-approved lesson plan. For each topic area, the
10 School Director's evaluation shall be based upon the course delivery observations, the instructor's
11 use of the approved lesson plan, and the results of the student evaluations of the instructor. For
12 probationary instructors, the evaluations conducted by another instructor shall be prepared on the
13 Criminal Justice Instructor Evaluation (Form F-16) and forwarded to the Commission. Based on
14 this evaluation, the School Director shall recommend approval or denial of requests for General
15 Instructor Certification. For all other instructors, these evaluations shall be prepared on the Criminal
16 Justice Instructor Evaluation (Form F-16), be kept on file by the school for a period of three years,
17 and shall be made available for inspection by a representative of the Commission upon request. In
18 the event the evaluation of an instructor indicates that his or her performance was less than
19 acceptable, the School Director shall forward a copy of the evaluation to the Commission. Any
20 instructor who is evaluating the instructional presentation of another instructor shall hold
21 certification in the same instructional topic area as that for which the instructor is being evaluated;
- 22 (9) Administer or designate a staff person to administer course specific tests during course delivery:
- 23 (A) to determine and record the level of trainee comprehension and retention of instructional
24 subject matter;
- 25 (B) to provide a basis for a final determination or recommendation regarding the minimum
26 degree of knowledge and skill of each trainee to function as an inexperienced law
27 enforcement officer; and
- 28 (C) to determine subject or topic areas of deficiency for the application of Rule .0405(a)(3) of
29 this Subchapter; and
- 30 (10) Not more than 10 days after the conclusion of a school's offering of Basic Law Enforcement
31 Training, submit to the Commission a Post-Delivery Report of Training Course Presentation (Form
32 F-10B) that shall include:
- 33 (A) a "Student Course Completion" form for each individual enrolled on the day of orientation;
- 34 (B) a "Certification and Test Score Release" form;
- 35 (C) the "Police Officer Physical Ability Test (POPAT) Post-Course" final form; and
- 36 (D) the orientation class enrollment roster.

(c) In addition to Paragraph (a) of this Rule, in planning, developing, coordinating, and delivering each Commission-certified "Criminal Justice Instructor Training Course," the School Director shall:

- (1) Schedule course presentation pursuant to Rule .0209 of this Subchapter;
- (2) Schedule evaluators as follows:
 - (A) each evaluator, as well as the instructors, shall have completed a Commission-certified instructor training course or an equivalent instructor training course utilizing the Instructional Systems Design model, an international model with applications in education, military training, and private enterprise; and
 - (B) each instructor and evaluator shall document successful participation in a program presented by the North Carolina Justice Academy for purposes of familiarization and supplementation relevant to delivery of the instructor training course and trainee evaluation;
- (3) Not fewer than 30 days before commencing delivery of the course, submit to the Commission a Pre-Delivery Report of Training Course Presentation [Form F-10A(ITC)] with the following attachments:
 - (A) a course schedule showing the arrangement of topical presentations and proposed instructional assignments;
 - (B) the names and last four digits of the social security numbers of all instructors and evaluators; and
 - (C) a copy of any rules and requirements for the school; and
- (4) Not more than 10 days after course completion, submit to the Commission a Post-Delivery Report [Form F-10B(ITC)] containing the following:
 - (A) class enrollment roster;
 - (B) a course schedule with the designation of instructors and evaluators utilized in delivery;
 - (C) scores recorded for each trainee on the 70 minute skill presentation; and
 - (D) designation of trainees who completed the course in its entirety and whom the School Director finds to be competent to instruct.

(d) In addition to Paragraph (a) of this Rule, in planning, developing, coordinating, and delivering each Commission-certified RADAR, RADAR and Time-Distance, Time-Distance, or LIDAR speed measurement operator training course or re-certification course, the School Director shall:

- (1) select and schedule speed measurement instrument instructors who are certified by the Commission as instructors for the specific speed measurement instruments in which the trainees are to receive instruction as follows:
 - (A) provide to the instructor the Commission form(s) for motor skill examination on each trainee;
 - (B) require the instructor to complete the motor skill examination form on each trainee indicating the level of proficiency obtained on each specific instrument; and

(C) require each instructor to sign each individual form and submit the original to the School Director;

- (2) not fewer than 30 days before the scheduled starting date, submit to the Director of the Standards Division a Pre-Delivery Report of Speed Measuring Instrument Course Presentation [Form F-10A (SMI)] that shall contain a period of course delivery including the proposed starting date, course location, requested date and location for the administration of the State exam, and the number of trainees to be trained on each type of approved speed measurement instrument. The Director of the Standards Division shall review the request and notify the School Director within thirty business days if the request is approved or denied; and
- (3) upon completing delivery of the Commission-certified course, and not more than 10 days after the conclusion of a school's offering of a certified RADAR, RADAR and Time-Distance, Time-Distance, or LIDAR speed measurement operator training course or re-certification course, the School Director shall notify the Commission regarding the progress and achievements of each trainee by submitting a Post-Delivery Report of Training Course Presentation [Form F-10B (SMI)]. This report shall include the original motor-skill examination form(s) completed and signed by the certified instructor responsible for administering the motor-skill examination to the respective trainee.

12 NCAC 09B .0209 is proposed for amendment under temporary procedures as follows:

12 NCAC 09B .0209 CRIMINAL JUSTICE INSTRUCTOR TRAINING

(a) The Instructor Training course required for General Instructor certification shall consist of a minimum of 40 hours of classroom instruction, plus the time required to conduct practical exercises, student presentations, and post testing presented during a period of no more than 15 business days. If the Governor declares a State of Emergency pursuant to N.C.G.S. 166A-19.3(19), the Director of the Criminal Justice Standards Division ~~may~~ shall allow additional breaks in a specific course delivery when the Director determines that doing so is necessary based on ~~circumstances~~ consideration of the following factors: ~~related to a lawfully declared State of Emergency,~~

(A) Whether instruction has begun in the course or whether course initiation may be postponed;

(B) The risk of harm to students which may be caused by continuation of the course;

(C) Whether those enrolled in the course have been or will likely be called on action to help address the State of Emergency;

(D) The specific need for the waiver; and

(E) The degree of benefit to the public in allowing a break in instruction.

Notice of waivers granted pursuant to the Section shall be posted on the CJETS (or Sheriffs) website <https://ncdoj.gov/law-enforcement-training/criminal-justice/>. The waiver granted pursuant to this Section shall only apply to courses which began during the effective period of the State of Emergency.

(b) Each Instructor Training course shall be designed to provide the trainee with the skills and knowledge to perform the functions of a criminal justice instructor.

(c) Each Instructor Training course shall include the following identified topic areas and minimum instructional hours for each area:

(1)	Orientation and Pre-Test	1 Hour
(2)	Instructional Systems Design (ISD)	5 Hours
(3)	Law Enforcement Instructor Liabilities and Legal Responsibilities	2 Hours
(4)	Criminal Justice Instructional Leadership	4 Hours
(5)	Lesson Plan Preparation: Professional Resources	2 Hours
(6)	Lesson Plan Development and Formatting	3 Hours
(7)	Adult Learning	2 Hours
(8)	Instructional Styles and Platform Skills	5 Hours
(9)	Classroom Management	3 Hours
(10)	Active Learning: Demonstration and Practical Exercises	3 Hours
(11)	The Evaluation Process of Learning	4 Hours
(12)	Audio Visual Aids	5 Hours
(13)	Course Closing and Post-test	1 Hour

(14) Completion of tasks associated with practical exercises, student presentations, and post testing; the number of hours required to complete this portion of the curriculum shall be based on the number of enrolled students, available facilities, and number of instructors.

12 NCAC 09B .0210 RADAR INSTRUCTOR TRAINING COURSE

(a) The radar instructor training course shall be designed to provide the trainee with the skills and knowledge to proficiently perform the function of a criminal justice radar instructor. This course shall be for a period not to exceed six consecutive weeks. If the Governor declares a State of Emergency pursuant to N.C.G.S. 166A-19.3(19), the Director of the Criminal Justice Standards Division ~~may~~ shall allow additional breaks in a specific course delivery when the Director determines that doing so is necessary based on ~~circumstances~~ consideration of the following factors: ~~[related to a lawfully declared State of Emergency.]~~

(A) Whether instruction has begun in the course or whether course initiation may be postponed;

(B) The risk of harm to students which may be caused by continuation of the course;

(C) Whether those enrolled in the course have been or will likely be called on action to help address the State of Emergency;

(D) The specific need for the waiver; and

(E) The degree of benefit to the public in allowing a break in instruction.

Notice of waivers granted pursuant to the Section shall be posted on the CJETS (or Sheriffs) website <https://ncdoj.gov/law-enforcement-training/criminal-justice/>. The waiver granted pursuant to this Section shall only apply to courses which began during the effective period of the State of Emergency.

(b) The radar instructor training course required for radar instructor certification shall include the topic areas and minimum number of hours as outlined in the Radar Instructor Training Course. To qualify for radar instructor certification, an applicant shall meet the requirements as outlined in the Radar Instructor Training Course and meet the requirements of 12 NCAC 09B .0408 and .0409.

(c) Each applicant for radar instructor training shall:

(1) Present the endorsement of a Commission-recognized school director or agency executive officer or his designee.

(2) Possess full criminal justice general instructor certification as required in 12 NCAC 09B .0302.

(3) Possess a current and valid radar operator certification.

(d) The "Radar Instructor Training Course" as published by the North Carolina Justice Academy shall be applied as basic curriculum for the radar instructor training course for radar instructors as administered by the Commission. (c) The "Time-Distance Instructor Training Course" as published by the North Carolina Justice Academy shall be applied as basic curriculum for the criminal justice time-distance speed measurement instrument instructor training course for time-distance speed measurement instructors as administered by the Commission. COMMENT:

The Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission (CJETS) filed 18 temporary rules in 12 NCAC 09B and 09G. CJETS stated in each of the Temporary Rulemaking Findings of Need forms that the agency is relying upon G.S. 150B-21.1(a)(1) as its basis to engage in temporary rulemaking.

G.S. 150B-21.1(a)(1) states:

- (a) Adoption. - An agency may adopt a temporary rule when it finds that adherence to the notice and hearing requirements of G.S. 150B-21.2 would be contrary to the public interest and that the immediate adoption of the rule is required by one or more of the following:
 - (1) A serious and unforeseen threat to the public health, safety, or welfare.

The agency's rationale to justify this basis states:

Explain: The Governor of North Carolina issued Executive Order No. 228, authorizing the extension of time to complete Criminal Justice Training Courses as need to ensure the completion of training to certify trainees, officers, and instructors. Also, to coordinate a response and enact protective measures to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 and other variants. The COVID-19 is a respiratory disease that can result in severe illness or death. Once an outbreak of the COVID-19 begins, it isn't easy to contain. North Carolina Community Colleges and agencies facilitate many of the Criminal Justice Training Courses. To preserve the health and well-being of the staff, students, and community, training courses began to close for 2-3 weeks. Training closures exceeding the requirements set forth in the NCAC 12 09B, 09C, and 09G impact the completion of training, certification of criminal justice officers and instructors' carry out their respective professional duties. In addition, Executive Order No. 228 expired on October 27, 2021. Criminal Justice Officers per code are required to complete specific training to maintain their certification. Failure to comply with the requirements results in delayed or loss of officers' certification to serve their communities and enforce the law. To prepare for any further potential unforeseen threat to public health or safety CJETS is pursuing rulemaking.

Based upon the explanation offered by the agency, it appears that the agency is relying upon the COVID-19 pandemic and variants as its basis for temporary rulemaking. While staff agrees that the pandemic does present a serious threat to public health, staff does not believe that at this point, it is "unforeseen," given that the pandemic began in the spring of 2020. The agency has not offered any explanation as to why the rulemaking was not needed until now, rather than last year when the pandemic began.

The agency refers to an Executive Order, EO 228, which was issued on August 27, 2021, in its explanation. As noted by the agency, that Executive Order expired October 27, 2021. Staff notes that Executive Orders are not a ground for engaging in temporary rulemaking pursuant to G.S. 150B-21.1.

In addition, in several rules, the agency is proposing what appear to be "clean up" amendments, such as capitalizing initialisms or updating the agency's address. Pursuant to G.S. 150B-21.5(a), the agency can update its address without notice, comment, or review by the RRC by notifying the Codifier. It does not appear that any of these "clean up" amendments meet the temporary rulemaking threshold set forth in G.S. 150B-21.1(a).

Therefore, staff does not believe that the agency has shown that the proposed temporary rules comply with G.S. 150B-21.1(a)(1), as it has not shown that the circumstances giving rise to the rulemaking are "unforeseen" at this time or that the other proposed changes are affected by G.S. 150B-21.1 at all.

Further, for every Rule, the agency is proposing to add language that states, "[T]he Director of the Criminal Justice Standards Division may allow additional breaks in a specific course delivery when the Director determines that doing so is necessary based on circumstances related to a lawfully declared State of Emergency."

Staff believes this language is ambiguous. It allows the Director broad discretion to vary the requirements within the Rule whenever the Director decides to do so, and the only limit is that the Director must determine it is necessary based upon a state of emergency. It does not state how the Director will make that determination, only that the Director must decide it is "necessary." Staff also notes that the agency says the Director may waive the rules based upon an emergency but is not required to do so, without stating the circumstances under which the Director can decide to not waive the Rule based upon an emergency. Further, the language gives rise to the question of what is a "lawfully declared" state of emergency. In addition, the Rule does not contain information on how this determination will be shared with the regulated public, nor how long the waiver will last. Therefore, staff believes this language is ambiguous as written.

§ 150B-21.1. Procedure for adopting a temporary rule.

(a) Adoption. - An agency may adopt a temporary rule when it finds that adherence to the notice and hearing requirements of G.S. 150B-21.2 would be contrary to the public interest and that the immediate adoption of the rule is required by one or more of the following:

- (1) A serious and unforeseen threat to the public health, safety, or welfare.
- (2) The effective date of a recent act of the General Assembly or the United States Congress.
- (3) A recent change in federal or State budgetary policy.
- (4) A recent federal regulation.
- (5) A recent court order.
- (6) The need for a rule establishing review criteria as authorized by G.S. 131E-183(b) to complement or be made consistent with the State Medical Facilities Plan approved by the Governor, if the rule addresses a matter included in the State Medical Facilities Plan, and the proposed rule and a notice of public hearing is submitted to the Codifier of Rules prior to the effective date of the Plan.
- (7) The need for the Wildlife Resources Commission to establish any of the following:
 - a. No wake zones.
 - b. Hunting or fishing seasons, including provisions for manner of take or any other conditions required for the implementation of such season.
 - c. Hunting or fishing bag limits.
 - d. Management of public game lands as defined in G.S. 113-129(8a).
- (8) The need for the Secretary of State to implement the certification technology provisions of Article 11A of Chapter 66 of the General Statutes, to adopt uniform Statements of Policy that have been officially adopted by the North American Securities Administrators Association, Inc., for the purpose of promoting uniformity of state securities regulation, and to adopt rules governing the conduct of hearings pursuant to this Chapter.
- (9) The need for the Commissioner of Insurance to implement the provisions of G.S. 58-2-205.
- (10) The need for the State Chief Information Officer to implement the information technology procurement provisions of Article 15 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes.

- (11) The need for the State Board of Elections to adopt a temporary rule after prior notice or hearing or upon any abbreviated notice or hearing the agency finds practical for one or more of the following:
 - a. In accordance with the provisions of G.S. 163-22.2.
 - b. To implement any provisions of state or federal law for which the State Board of Elections has been authorized to adopt rules.
 - c. The need for the rule to become effective immediately in order to preserve the integrity of upcoming elections and the elections process.

- (a2) A recent act, change, regulation, or order as used in subdivisions (2) through (5) of subsection (a) of this section means an act, change, regulation, or order occurring or made effective no more than 210 days prior to the submission of a temporary rule to the Rules Review Commission. Upon written request of the agency, the Commission may waive the 210-day requirement upon consideration of the degree of public benefit, whether the agency had control over the circumstances that required the requested waiver, notice to and opposition by the public, the need for the waiver, and previous requests for waivers submitted by the agency.
- (a3) Unless otherwise provided by law, the agency shall:
 - (1) At least 30 business days prior to adopting a temporary rule, submit the rule and a notice of public hearing to the Codifier of Rules, and the Codifier of Rules shall publish the proposed temporary rule and the notice of public hearing on the Internet to be posted within five business days.
 - (2) At least 30 business days prior to adopting a temporary rule, notify persons on the mailing list maintained pursuant to G.S. 150B-21.2(d) and any other interested parties of its intent to adopt a temporary rule and of the public hearing.
 - (3) Accept written comments on the proposed temporary rule for at least 15 business days prior to adoption of the temporary rule.
 - (4) Hold at least one public hearing on the proposed temporary rule no less than five days after the rule and notice have been published. If notice of a public hearing

has been published and that public hearing has been cancelled, the agency shall publish notice at least five days prior to the date of any rescheduled hearing.

(a4) An agency must also prepare a written statement of its findings of need for a temporary rule stating why adherence to the notice and hearing requirements in G.S. 150B-21.2 would be contrary to the public interest and why the immediate adoption of the rule is required. If the temporary rule establishes a new fee or increases an existing fee, the agency shall include in the written statement that it has complied with the requirements of G.S. 12-3.1. The statement must be signed by the head of the agency adopting the temporary rule.

(b) Review. - When an agency adopts a temporary rule it must submit the rule and the agency's written statement of its findings of the need for the rule to the Rules Review Commission. Within 15 business days after receiving the proposed temporary rule, the Commission shall review the agency's written statement of findings of need for the rule and the rule to determine whether the statement meets the criteria listed in subsection (a) of this section and the rule meets the standards in G.S. 150B-21.9. The Commission shall direct a member of its staff who is an attorney licensed to practice law in North Carolina to review the statement of findings of need and the rule. The staff member shall make a recommendation to the Commission, which must be approved by the Commission or its designee. The Commission's designee shall be a panel of at least three members of the Commission. In reviewing the statement, the Commission or its designee may consider any information submitted by the agency or another person. If the Commission or its designee finds that the statement meets the criteria listed in subsection (a) of this section and the rule meets the standards in G.S. 150B-21.9, the Commission or its designee must approve the temporary rule and deliver the rule to the Codifier of Rules within two business days of approval. The Codifier of Rules must enter the rule into the North Carolina Administrative Code on the sixth business day following receipt from the Commission or its designee.

(b1) If the Commission or its designee finds that the statement does not meet the criteria listed in subsection (a) of this section or that the rule does not meet the standards in G.S. 150B-21.9, the Commission or its designee must immediately notify the head of the agency. The agency may supplement its statement of need with additional findings or submit a new statement. If the agency provides additional findings or submits a new statement, the Commission or its designee must review the additional findings or new statement within five business days after the agency submits the additional findings or new statement. If the Commission or its designee again finds that the statement does not meet the criteria listed in subsection (a) of this section or that the rule does not meet the standards in G.S. 150B-21.9, the Commission or its designee must immediately notify the head of the agency and return the rule to the agency.

(b2) If an agency decides not to provide additional findings or submit a new statement when notified by the Commission or its designee that the agency's findings of need for a rule do not meet the required criteria or that the rule does not meet the required standards, the agency must notify the Commission or its designee of its decision. The Commission or its designee shall then return the rule to the agency. When the Commission returns a rule to an agency in accordance with this subsection, the agency may file an action for declaratory judgment in Wake County Superior Court pursuant to Article 26 of Chapter 1 of the General Statutes.

(b3) Notwithstanding any other provision of this subsection, if the agency has not complied with the provisions of G.S. 12-3.1, the Codifier of Rules shall not enter the rule into the Code.

(c) Standing. - A person aggrieved by a temporary rule adopted by an agency may file an action for declaratory judgment in Wake County Superior Court pursuant to Article 26 of Chapter 1 of the General Statutes. In the action, the court shall determine whether the agency's written statement of findings of need for the rule meets the criteria listed in subsection (a) of this section and whether the rule meets the standards in G.S. 150B-21.9. The court shall not grant an ex parte temporary restraining order.

(c1) Filing a petition for rule making or a request for a declaratory ruling with the agency that adopted the rule is not a prerequisite to filing an action under this subsection. A person who files an action for declaratory judgment under this subsection must serve a copy of the complaint on the agency that adopted the rule being contested, the Codifier of Rules, and the Commission.

(d) Effective Date and Expiration. - A temporary rule becomes effective on the date specified in G.S. 150B-21.3. A temporary rule expires on the earliest of the following dates:

- (1) The date specified in the rule.
- (2) The effective date of the permanent rule adopted to replace the temporary rule, if the Commission approves the permanent rule.
- (3) The date the Commission returns to an agency a permanent rule the agency adopted to replace the temporary rule.
- (4) The effective date of an act of the General Assembly that specifically disapproves a permanent rule adopted to replace the temporary rule.
- (5) 270 days from the date the temporary rule was published in the North Carolina Register, unless the permanent rule adopted to replace the temporary rule has been submitted to the Commission.

(e) Publication. - When the Codifier of Rules enters a temporary rule in the North Carolina Administrative Code, the Codifier must publish the rule in the North Carolina Register. (1973, c. 1331, s. 1; 1981, c. 688, s. 12; 1981 (Reg. Sess., 1982), c. 1232, s. 1; 1983, c. 857; c. 927, ss. 4, 8; 1985, c. 746, s. 1; 1985 (Reg. 

12 NCAC 09B .0202 is amended under temporary procedures as follows:

12 NCAC 09B .0202 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SCHOOL DIRECTOR

(a) In planning, developing, coordinating, and delivering each Commission-certified criminal justice training course, the School Director shall:

- (1) Formalize and schedule the course curriculum in accordance with the curriculum standards established in this Subchapter;
- (2) Select and schedule instructors who are certified by the Commission;
- (3) Provide each instructor with a current Commission course outline and all necessary additional information concerning the instructor's duties and responsibilities;
- (4) Notify each instructor that he or she shall comply with the Basic Law Enforcement Training Course Management Guide and provide him or her access to the most current version of the Course Management Guide;
- (5) Ensure each instructor utilizes Commission approved lesson plans and instructional materials;
- (6) Arrange for the availability of appropriate audiovisual aids and materials, publications, facilities, and equipment for training in all topic areas;
- (7) Develop, adopt, reproduce, and distribute any supplemental rules and requirements determined by the school to be necessary or appropriate for:
 - (A) effective course delivery;
 - (B) establishing responsibilities and obligations of agencies or departments employing or sponsoring course trainees; and
 - (C) regulating trainee participation and demeanor, ensuring trainee attendance, and maintaining performance records;
- (8) If appropriate, recommend housing and dining facilities for trainees;
- (9) Administer the course delivery in accordance with Commission approved lesson plans and course management guides;
- (10) Maintain direct supervision, direction, and control over the performance of all persons to whom any portion of the planning, development, presentation, or administration of a course has been delegated. The comprehensive final examination shall be administered by the Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission; and
- (11) Report the completion of each presentation of a Commission-certified criminal justice training course to the Commission, utilizing forms required for submission, which are located on the Agency's website: <https://ncdoj.gov/law-enforcement-training/criminal-justice/forms-and-publications/>.

(b) In addition to Paragraph (a) of this Rule, in planning, developing, coordinating, and delivering each Commission-certified Basic Law Enforcement Training Course, the School Director shall:

- (1) Deliver training in accordance with the most current version of the Basic Law Enforcement Training Course Management Guide as published by the North Carolina Justice Academy;
- (2) Schedule course presentation to include 12 hours of instruction each week during consecutive calendar weeks, except that there may be as many as three one-week breaks until course requirements are completed; the Director of the Criminal Justice Standards Division may allow additional breaks in a specific course delivery when the Director determines that doing so is necessary based on circumstances related to a lawfully declared State of Emergency.
- (3) Schedule only specialized instructors certified by the Commission to teach those high-liability areas as specified in Rule .0304(a) of this Subchapter as either the lead instructor or as assistant instructors or role players;
- (4) With the exception of the First Responder, Physical Fitness, Explosives and Hazardous Materials, and topical areas outlined in Rule .0304(a) of this Subchapter, schedule one specialized instructor certified by the Commission for every six trainees while engaged in a practical performance exercise;
- (5) Schedule one specialized instructor certified by the Commission for every eight trainees while engaged in a practical performance exercise in the topical area "Subject Control Arrest Techniques";
- (6) Schedule no single individual to instruct more than 35 percent of the total hours of the curriculum during any one delivery of the Basic Law Enforcement Training Course presentation;
- (7) Not less than 30 days before commencing delivery of the Basic Law Enforcement Training Course, submit to the Commission a Pre-Delivery Report of Training Course Presentation pursuant to 12 NCAC 09C .0211. The Pre-Delivery Report (Form F-10A) shall indicate a requested date and location for the administration of the State comprehensive exam, and include the following attachments:
 - (A) a course schedule showing the arrangement of topical presentations and proposed instructional assignments; and
 - (B) a copy of any rules and requirements for the school. A copy of those rules shall also be given to each trainee and to the executive officer of each trainee's employing or sponsoring agency or department at the time the trainee enrolls in the course;
- (8) Monitor, or designate an instructor certified by the Commission to monitor, a presentation of each instructor once during each three year certification period in each topic taught by the instructor and prepare a written evaluation on the instructor's performance and suitability for subsequent instructional assignments. The observations shall be of sufficient duration to ensure that the instructor is using the Instructional System Design model, and that the delivery is objective-based, documented by, and consistent with a Commission-approved lesson plan. For each topic area, the School Director's evaluation shall be based upon the course delivery observations, the instructor's use of the approved lesson plan, and the results of the student evaluations of the instructor. For probationary instructors, the evaluations conducted by another instructor shall be prepared on the

- Criminal Justice Instructor Evaluation (Form F-16) and forwarded to the Commission. Based on this evaluation, the School Director shall recommend approval or denial of requests for General Instructor Certification. Any instructor who is evaluating the instructional presentation of another instructor shall hold certification in the same instructional topic area as that for which the instructor is being evaluated;
- (9) Administer or designate a staff person to administer course specific tests during course delivery:
 - (A) to determine and record the level of trainee comprehension and retention of instructional subject matter;
 - (B) to provide a basis for a final determination or recommendation regarding the minimum degree of knowledge and skill of each trainee to function as an inexperienced law enforcement officer; and
 - (C) to determine subject or topic areas of deficiency for the application of Rule .0405(a)(3) of this Subchapter; and
 - (10) Not more than 10 days after the conclusion of a school's offering of Basic Law Enforcement Training, submit to the Commission a Post-Delivery Report of Training Course Presentation (Form F-10B) that shall include:
 - (A) a "Student Course Completion" form for each individual enrolled on the day of orientation;
 - (B) a "Certification and Test Score Release" form;
 - (C) the "Police Officer Physical Ability Test (POPAT) Post-Course" final form; and
 - (D) the orientation class enrollment roster.
- (c) In addition to Paragraph (a) of this Rule, in planning, developing, coordinating, and delivering each Commission-certified "Criminal Justice Instructor Training Course," the School Director shall:
- (1) Schedule course presentation pursuant to Rule .0209 of this Subchapter;
 - (2) Schedule evaluators as follows:
 - (A) each evaluator, as well as the instructors, shall have completed a Commission-certified instructor training course or an equivalent instructor training course utilizing the Instructional Systems Design model, an international model with applications in education, military training, and private enterprise; and
 - (B) each instructor and evaluator shall document successful participation in a program presented by the North Carolina Justice Academy for purposes of familiarization and supplementation relevant to delivery of the instructor training course and trainee evaluation;

(3) Not fewer than 30 days before commencing delivery of the course, submit to the Commission a Pre-Delivery Report of Training Course Presentation [Form F-10A(ITC)] with the following attachments:

- (A) a course schedule showing the arrangement of topical presentations and proposed instructional assignments;
- (B) the names and last four digits of the social security numbers of all instructors and evaluators; and
- (C) a copy of any rules and requirements for the school; and
