(5) March, March 2009 administrations and thereafter; through November 2009 administrations: 27 28 passing score on Part I Applied Basic Science (ABS) examination of the National Board. 29 (6) December, December 2009 administrations and thereafter; through February 2010 administrations: passing score on Part II Patient Assessment and Management (PAM) 30 31 examination of the National Board, with a score of not less than 75 on the Disease/Trauma component within the Patient Assessment and Management (PAM) PAM examination, and a 32 33 score of not less than 75 on the TMOD component within the Patient Assessment and 34 Management (PAM).- PAM. (7) March, March 2010 administrations and thereafter: through February 2014 administrations: 35 passing score on the Part III Clinical Skills Examination (CSE) of the National Board. 36
