In Paragraph (a), line 6, is the word "specialized" also supposed to be deleted? If so, please strikethrough. If not, then is it supposed to be capitalized?

With the removal of the specific hour requirement for the individual components of the training in Paragraph (b), how will your regulated public know how to divvy up the 70 hours in Paragraph (a)?

In (c), line 15, is it supposed to read "<u>Juvenile Justice</u> Specialized Instructor..."? That appears to be the full term elsewhere in the Rule. Also, I am a bit confused by the language of Paragraph (c). What exactly is the applicant applying for? Is the applicant required to meet the qualifications set forth in (c)(1) and (c)(2) in order to take the course? You may want to consider revising this Paragraph to make it more clear.

In reviewing these rules, the staff determined that the following technical changes need to be made:

In Paragraph (a), line 4, please state "except as set out in Paragraph (d) of this Rule."

In Sub-Paragraph (b)(1), why is Specialized Instructor Certification on line 8 capitalized, but general probationary instructor certification on line 10 is not? It seems as though since they are both certifications, they should both be capitalized. This inconsistency occurs several times throughout the Rule.

In Sub-Paragraph (b)(2), line 15, should general certification be capitalized? Please note that it is capitalized in 12 NCAC 09G .0311.

In Sub-Paragraph (c)(1), lines 32 and 33, should "in-service training coordinator" be capitalized? Please note that it is capitalized in Sub-Paragraph (c)(2), line 1. Please make consistent.

In Sub-Paragraph (c)(1), please add a dash in between "three" and "year" on in order to be consistent with "three-year" in Paragraph (c), line 27. The same issue is present in (c)(2), (c)(3)(A), and (e). Please make consistent.

In Sub-Paragraph (3), line 16, "Specialized Instructor" is capitalized; however, it is not in Sub-Paragraph (d), line 18 and line 22 or Sub-Paragraph (e), line 26. Please make consistent.

It appears that the language on Page 2, lines 15-16, applies to the entire Paragraph. As such, it should be brought to the left margin.

Please correct the Rule name on the Submission for Permanent Rule Form.

In Item (1), lines 9-11, the phrase "delivering CPR certifications that include cognitive and skills testing, use of equipment training conducted by a manufacturer, manufacturer's representative or a service provider and documented through a certificate of completion" is not clear. Perhaps it would be more clear if it was broken into several sentences? It is difficult to decipher which instructors do not need the Instructor Certification as written.

In Item (2), "department head" is not capitalized. This is inconsistent with "Department head" in Paragraph (5), line 33. Please make consistent.

Also in Item 2, do you need the language on lines 20 and 21, "in addition to meeting the above testing requirement,"? It seems duplicative.

In Item 3, delete the "as" line 26.

Does your regulated public know where to get the forms referenced in Items 4 and 5? Are they available online? You may want to consider adding this information.
