Please incorporate this outside authority in accordance with 26 NCAC 02C .0109. Consider adding the citation at the first mention in the Code or as a defined term. Page 3, line 35, is the use of the term "Justice Academy" correct? This is not a defined term and is used in an inconsistent manner throughout this Subchapter. Sometimes it is the "North Carolina Justice Academy" or "Academy."

Page 4, line 2, add brackets around the form reference to be consistent with other form reference citations

Page 4, line 8, add a comma after "completion"

Page 4, lines 2, 9, 29, and page 5, line 2, where are the forms located? How does the regulated public know how to obtain the forms?

Page 4, line 8, add "Form" after "Report" for consistency

Page 4, line 14, is there a space between "completedthe"

Page 4, line 19, there is a list of items on line 17 and 36. Why does the list on this line not contain the term "radar and time-distance"?

Page 4, line 21, delete the semicolon after "instruction" and replace with "as follows:"

Page 4, line 27, add a comma after "date"

Page 4, lines 32 thru 33, is there not a time constraint on when the Director shall review and notify the requester?
