# 12 NCAC 09B .0228 BASIC TRAINING - WILDLIFE ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

- (a) The basic training course for wildlife enforcement officers appointed by the Wildlife Resources Commission as authorized under G.S. 113-136 shall consist of at least 652 hours of instruction designed to provide the trainee with the skills and knowledge to perform those tasks essential to function as a wildlife enforcement officer.
  - (b) Each basic training course for wildlife enforcement officers shall include the following identified topical areas and minimum instructional hours for each area:

The officer shall complete such course within one year from the date of his 7 original appointment as determined by the date of the probationary certification. 8 (b) Each law enforcement officer, except wildlife enforcement officers, officer shall have satisfactorily completed in its 9 entirety the accredited basic training course as prescribed in 12 NCAC 9B .0205(b) prior to obtaining probationary 10 certification, (c) Each wildlife enforcement officer shall have satisfactorily completed in its entirety the Basic Training - Wildlife 11 12 Enforcement Officers' course stipulated in 12 NCAC 9B .0228(b) prior to obtaining probationary certification. 13 (d)(c) If a trainee completes the basic training course prior to being employed as a law enforcement officer, the trainee shall be duly appointed and sworn as a law enforcement officer within one year of the completion of training for that basic training 14 15 course to be recognized under these Rules. This one year period shall begin with the successful completion of the State 16 Comprehensive Examination. 17 (e)(d) If local confinement personnel complete basic training prior to being employed by a facility in a position which 18 requires certification, such personnel shall be duly appointed to a local confinement facility position within one year of the 19 completion of training for that basic training course to be recognized under these Rules. 17	Standards Division unless sooner terminated for cause.			
18	(d) Before a prospective law enforcement officer, except wildlife enforcement officers, officer can be issued a Probationary			
19	O Certification, the prospective officer must have successfully completed the required basic training course stipulated in 12			
20	NCAC 9B .0205(b).			
21	(e) Before a prospective wildlife enforcement officer can be issued a Probationary Certification, the prospective officer must			
22	have successfully completed the required basic training course stipulated in 12 NCAC 9B .0228(b).			
23	(f)(e) An applicant for certification who holds a valid Probationary Certification issued by the North Carolina Sheriffs'			
24	Education and Training Standards Commission shall be certified as a probationary law enforcement officer as specified under			
25	Paragraphs (b), (c) and (d) of this Rule.			
26	(g)(f) Where the local governing authority lawfully declares the existence of a public emergency, the department head of the			
27	criminal justice agency of the jurisdiction may swear persons as law enforcement officers without first obtaining Probationary			
28	Certification for those officers. The employing agency shall obtain Probationary Certification for such emergency officers not			
29	more than 20 days after the administration of their oath of office.
