Line 10, add a comma after "discharge"

Lines 10, 15 and 17, add "has started" after "treatment"

Line 15, delete "appropriate antibiotic"

Line 16, why have "until one week after onset"? Is hepatitis A no longer infectious at that stage?

Line 20, replace "which" with "that"

Lines 21 thru 22, consider rewriting the citation as follows:

"Section .2800 of 15A NCAC 18A"

Line 22, correct the name, as I believe it is currently titled "Sanitation of Child Care Centers"

Line 34, why is G.S. 110-91(2) included in the authority? Consider deleting.

5	axillary, or 101 degrees orally, or 102 degrees rectally and who remains capable of participating in routine group				
6	activities; provided the child does not:				
7	(1)	have the sudden onset of diarrhea characterized by an increased number of bowel movements			
8		compared to the child's normal pattern and with increased stool water; or			
9	(2)	have two or more episodes of vomiting within a 12 hour period; or

11	(4)	have scabies or lice; or

#### 10A NCAC 09 .1003 has been amended as published in 28:19 NCR 2302-2303 as follows:

#### 3 10A NCAC 09.1003 SAFE PROCEDURES

4 (a) The driver or other adult in the vehicle shall assure that all children are transferred to a responsible person who

- 5 is indicated on the child's application as specified in Rule .0801(a)(4) of this Chapter or as authorized by the parent.
- 6 (b) Each center shall establish safe procedures for pick-up and delivery of children. These procedures shall be
- 7 communicated to parents, and a copy shall be posted in the center where they can easily be seen. Centers licensed
- 8 for three to 12 children located in a residence are not required to post these procedures.
- 9 (c) A first-aid kit shall be located in each vehicle used on a regular basis to transport children. The first-aid kit shall
- 10 be firmly mounted or otherwise secured if kept in the passenger compartment.

(d) For each child being transported emergency and identifying information shall be in the vehicle.

- 12 (e) The driver shall:
- 13 (1) be 21 years old or a licensed bus driver;
- 14 (2) have a valid driver's license of the type required under North Carolina Motor Vehicle Law for the
  15 vehicle being driven or comparable license from the state in which the driver resides; and
- 16 (3) have no convictions of Driving While Impaired (DWI) or any other impaired driving offense
  17 within the previous three years.
- 18 (f) Each person in the vehicle must be seated in the manufacturer's designated areas. No child shall ride in the load
- 19 carrying area or floor of a vehicle.
- 20 (g) Children shall not be left in a vehicle unattended by an adult.
- (h) Children shall be loaded and unloaded from curbside or in a safe, off-street area, out of the flow of traffic, so
- that they are protected from all traffic hazards.
- 23 (i) Before children are transported, written permission from a parent shall be obtained which shall include when and
- 24 where the child is to be transported, expected time of departure and arrival, and the transportation provider.
- (j) Parents may give standing permission, valid for up to 12 months, for routine transport of children to and from thecenter.
- 27 (k) When children are transported, staff in each vehicle shall have a functioning cellular telephone or other
- 28 functioning two-way voice communication device with them for use in an emergency. Staff shall not use cellular
- 29 telephones or other functioning two-way voice communication devices except in the case of an emergency and only
- 30 when the vehicle is parked in a safe location.
- (1) For routine transport of children to and from the center, staff shall have a list of the children being
   transported. Staff members shall use this list to check attendance as children board the vehicle and as they depart
- the vehicle. A list of all children being transported shall also be available at the center.

21	<u>(8)</u>	not use a cellular telephone or other functioning two-way voice communication device except in	
22		the case of an emergency and only when the vehicle is parked in a safe location.

1 10A NCAC 09 .2404 has been amended as published in 28:19 NCR 2310 as follows: 2 3 10A NCAC 09.2404 INCLUSION/EXCLUSION REQUIREMENTS 4 (a) Centers may enroll mildly ill children over three months of age who meet the following inclusion criteria: 5 (1)Centers that enroll children with Level One symptoms may admit children as follows: 6 (A) children who meet the guidelines for attendance in 10A NCAC 09 .0804, except that they 7 are unable to participate fully in routine group activities and are in need of increased rest 8 time or less vigorous activities; or 9 **(B)** children with fever controlled with medication of  $102^{\circ}$  or less orally, or  $101^{\circ}$  or less 10 axillary; 11 (2)Centers that enroll children with Level Two symptoms may admit children with the following: 12 (A) Inability inability to participate in much group activity while requiring extra sleep, clear 13 liquids, light meals and passive activities such as stories, videos or music as determined 14 by a health care professional; or 15 Fever fever controlled with medication of 103° maximum orally, or 102° maximum (B) 16 axillary, or 104° maximum rectally, with a health care professional's written screening; or 17 (C) Vomiting vomiting fewer than three times in any eight hour period, without signs of 18 dehydration; or 19 (D) Diarrhea diarrhea without signs of dehydration and without blood or mucus in the stool, 20 fewer than five times in any eight hour period; or 21 (E) With with written approval from a child's physician and preadmission screening by an 22 on-site health care professional prior to the current day's attendance unless excluded by 23 Subparagraphs (b) (1), (2), (3), (4), (6), or (7) of this Rule. 24 (b) Any child exhibiting the following symptoms shall be excluded from any care: 25 (1)Temperature temperature unresponsive to control measures; or 26 (2)Undiagnosed undiagnosed or unidentified rash; or 27 (3) Respiratory respiratory distress as evidenced by an increased respiratory rate and 28 unresponsiveness to treatment, flaring nostrils, labored breathing or intercostal retractions; or 29 (4) Major major change in condition requiring further care or evaluation; or 30 (5) Contagious contagious diseases required to be reported to the health department, except as 31 provided in Part (a)(2)(E) of this Rule; or 32 Other other conditions as determined by a health care professional or onsite administrator; or (6) 33 (7)Sluggish sluggish mental status. 34 (c) Children less than three months of age shall not be in care. 35 (d) (c) Once admitted, children shall be assessed and evaluated at least every four hours or more frequently if 36 warranted based on medication administration or medical treatment to determine if symptoms continue to meet

37 inclusion criteria.
