3	15A NCAC 101	F .0333 MECKLENBURG AND GASTON COUNTIES
4	(a) Regulated	Areas. This Rule applies to the following waters of Lake Wylie in Mecklenburg and Gaston
5	Counties:	
6	(1)	McDowell Park - The waters of the coves adjoining McDowell Park and the Southwest Nature
7		Preserve in Mecklenburg County, including the entrances to the coves on either side of
8		Copperhead Island;
9	(2)	Gaston County Wildlife Club Cove - The waters of the cove at the Gaston County Wildlife Club
10		on South Point Peninsula in Gaston County;
11	(3)	Buster Boyd Bridge- The areas 250 feet to the north and 150 feet to the south of the Buster Boyd
12		Bridge;
13	(4)	Highway 27 Bridge – The area beginning 50 yards north of the NC 27 Bridge and extending 50
14		yards south of the southernmost of two railroad trestles immediately downstream from the NC 27
15		Bridge;
16	(5)	Brown's Cove – The area beginning at the most narrow point of the entrance to Brown's Cove and
17		extending 250 feet in both directions;
18	(6)	Paradise Point Cove - The waters of the Paradise Point Cove between Paradise Circle and
19		Lakeshore Drive as delineated by appropriate markers;
20	(7)	Withers Cove - The area 50 feet on either side of Withers Bridge; and
21	<u>(8)</u>	Sadler Island west- beginning at a line formed from a point on the western shore of Lake Wylie at

28		81.0143W to a point on the eastern shore of Lake Wylie at 35.26501N, 81.01374W.

32	any public boat-	launching ramp, dock, pier, marina, boat storage structure or boat service area.
33	(c) Speed Limi	t Near All Other Bridges. No person shall operate a vessel at greater than no-wake speed within 50
34	feet of any bri	dge in North Carolina that crosses the waters of Lake Wylie that is not otherwise specifically
35	mentioned in Pa	aragraph (a) of this Rule.
36	(d) Speed Limi	t in Marked Swimming or Mooring Areas. No person shall operate a vessel at greater than no-wake

speed within 50 yards of any marked mooring area or marked swimming area.
