The Rules Review Commission staff has completed its review of this rule prior to the Commission's next meeting. The Commission has not yet reviewed this rule and therefore there has not been a determination as to whether the rule will be approved. In reviewing these rules, the staff determined that the following technical changes need to be made. Approval of any rule is contingent upon making technical changes as set forth in G.S. 150B-21.10.

Page 1, line 8 – Replace "Training in 12 NCAC" with "Training and as described in 12 NCAC"

Page 1, line 10 – replace "number of credits assigned to the number of hours," with "course,"

Page 1, line 11 – insert a comma after "course"

Page 1, line 11 – insert "of instruction" after "hour"

Page 2, lines 2, 8, 10, 14, 16, 21, 23, 30, 32, 37 and page 3, lines 2 and 6 – the terms "topical area" and "topic area" are used interchangeably. Please choose one term and use it consistently – either "topical area," "topic area," or "topics."

A written test comprised 15 of at least five questions per hour of training shall be developed by the delivering agency, or the agency may use the 16 written test developed by the North Carolina Justice Academy, for each in-service training topic.
