Children shall not -30 sleep or nap in a room with a closed door between the children and the supervising staff. 31 The staff shall be on the same level of the home where children are sleeping or napping. 32 (a)(b) The operator shall provide the following on a daily basis for all children in care: 33 (1)Developmentally appropriate equipment and materials for a variety of outdoor activities 34 which that allow for vigorous play, large and small muscle development, and social, 35 emotional, and intellectual development. For purposes of this Rule "vigorous" means done with 36 force and energy. Each child shall have the opportunity for outdoor play each day that weather

1		conditions permit. The operator shall provide space and time for vigorous indoor activities when
2		children cannot play outdoors;
3	(2)	An individual sleeping space such as a bed, crib, play pen, cot, mat, or sleeping bag with
4		individual linens for each pre-school aged child in care for four hours or more, or for all
5		children if overnight care is provided, to rest. rest comfortably. Individual sleep requirements
6		for infants aged 12 months or younger shall be provided for as specified in 10A NCAC
7		09 .1724(a)(2). Linens shall be changed weekly or whenever they become soiled or wet;

9		but shall be able to hear and respond [<mark>quickly</mark>] without delay to them. Children shall not sleep or

12	(5) [<mark>(7)] <u>(4)</u></mark>	A safe sleep environment by ensuring that when a child is sleeping or napping, bedding or other
13		objects shall not be placed in a manner that covers the child's face;
14	<mark>(3)</mark>	A quiet, separate area which that can be easily supervised pursuant to Paragraph (a) of this Rule for
15		children who become ill to the extent that they can no longer participate in routine group activities.

18	[<mark>(8</mark>)] (6)	The opportunity each day for each child under the age of 12 months to play while awake

21		equipment shall be available indoors and outdoors to support the activities listed on the
22		written schedule. The written schedule shall:
23		(A) [(a)] Show blocks of time <mark>usually</mark> assigned to types of activities and include periods of
24		time for both active play and quiet play or rest;
25		(B) [(b)] Be displayed in a place where parents are able to view; view it;
26		(C) [(c)] Reflect daily opportunities for both free choice and guided activities;
27		(D) [(d)] Include a minimum of one hour of outdoor play throughout the day, if weather
28		conditions permit; and
29		(E) [(e)] Include a daily gross motor activity which that may occur indoors or outdoors; and
30		outdoors.
31	(8) <mark>[(10)] <u>(c)</u></mark>	When screen time, including videos, video games, and computer usage, is provided, it shall be:
32		(A) [(a)] (1) Offered only as a free choice activity, activity;
33		(B) [(b)] <u>(2)</u> Used to meet a developmental goal, goal; and
34		(C) [(C) [(C)] (3) Limited to no more than two and a half hours per week for each child two years
35		of age and older.
36	Usage ti	me periods may be extended for specific special events, projects, occasions such as a current

3	[(5)] (d) Nothing contained in this Rule shall be construed to preclude a "qualified person with a disability,"		
4	as defined by G.S. 168A-3(9), or a "qualified individual," [individual with a disability,"] as defined by the		
5	Americans With Disabilities Act at 42 U.S.C. 12111(8), from working in a licensed child care facility.
