In reviewing these rules, the staff determined that the following technical changes need to be made. Approval of any rule is contingent upon making technical changes as set forth in G.S. 150B-21.10.

*Lines 8 and 13, delete the phrase "all of"*

*Line 23, consider placing "Wake" and "Warren" county in alphabetical order*

*Page 2, line 2, remove the underlining for "{(1)}"*

*Page 2, between lines 18 and 19, add back in the italicized language that was published for the temporary rule and update line 1 on page 1 to reflect that the italicized language was approved by the Rules Review Commission on March 19, 2016 for amendment, but with a delayed effective date of August 1, 2016.*

*Page 3, line 14, please correct the effective date to May 31, 2016. G.S. 150B-21.3(a) specifies the effective date of a temporary rule, with no option to delay, as allowed for permanent rules. If there is another specific statute indicating a delayed effective date, please provide a copy of the statute to justified the delayed effective date. On the "Temporary Rule-Making Findings of Need" form, please delete the "August 1, 2016" in Box 5g to reflect this change.*



3 **15A NCAC 10B .0202 BEAR**

5 (a) Open Seasons for hunting bear shall be from the:

6 (1) Monday on or nearest October 15 to the Saturday before Thanksgiving and the third Monday after  
7 Thanksgiving to January 1 in and west of Surry, Wilkes, Caldwell, Burke, and Cleveland counties.

8 (2) Second Monday in November to January 1 in all of Bladen, Brunswick, Carteret, Columbus,  
9 Cumberland, Duplin, New Hanover, Onslow, Pamlico, Pender, and Sampson counties.

10 (3) First Monday in December to the third Saturday thereafter in ~~Brunswick, Columbus, and Robeson~~  
11 County ~~counties~~.

12 (4) Second Monday in November to the following Saturday and the third Monday after Thanksgiving  
13 to the fifth Saturday after Thanksgiving in all of Beaufort, Camden, Chowan, Craven, Dare,  
14 Edgecombe, Greene, Halifax, Hyde, Jones, Lenoir, Martin, Nash, Northampton, Pasquotank, Pitt,  
15 Tyrrell, Washington, Wayne, and Wilson counties.

16 (5) Saturday preceding the second Monday in November to the following Saturday and the third  
17 Monday after Thanksgiving to the fifth Saturday after Thanksgiving in Bertie, Currituck, Gates,  
18 Hertford, and Perquimans counties.

19 (6) Concurrent with the open season for all lawful weapons for hunting deer as specified in 15A  
20 NCAC 10B .0203(a)(1) in Alamance, Alexander, Anson, Cabarrus, Caswell, Catawba, Chatham,  
21 Davie, Davidson, Durham, Franklin, Forsyth, Gaston, Granville, Guilford, Harnett, Hoke, Iredell,  
22 Johnston, Lee, Lincoln, Mecklenburg, Montgomery, Moore, Orange, Person, Randolph,  
23 Richmond, Rockingham, Rowan, Scotland, Stanly, Stokes, Union, Vance, Warren, Wake, and  
24 Yadkin counties.

25 (b) Restrictions

26 (1) For purposes of this Paragraph, "bait" means any natural, unprocessed food product that is a grain,  
27 fruit, nut, vegetable, or other material harvested from a plant crop that is not modified from its raw  
28 components.

29 (2) Bears shall not be taken with the use or aid of:

30 (A) any processed food product as defined in G.S. 113-294(r), any animal, animal part or  
31 product, salt, salt lick, honey, sugar, sugar-based material, syrups, candy, pastry, gum,  
32 candy block, oils, spices, peanut butter, or grease;

33 (B) any extracts of substances identified in Part (A) of this Subparagraph;

34 (C) any substances modified by substances identified in Part (A) of this Subparagraph,  
35 including any extracts of those substances; or

36 (D) any bear bait attractant, including sprays, aerosols, scent balls, and scent powders.

37 (3) Bears may be taken with the aid of bait from the Monday on or nearest October 15 to the Saturday  
38 before Thanksgiving in the counties in Subparagraph (a)(1) of this Rule.

1 ~~(3)~~(4) Bears may be taken with the aid of bait during the entire open season in the counties identified in  
 2 Subparagraphs (a)(4) (2) through (a)(6) of this Rule. ~~from the first open Monday through the~~  
 3 ~~following Saturday only in the counties in Subparagraphs (a)(1) through (a)(5) of this Rule. In~~  
 4 ~~counties with a season split into two or more segments, this Subparagraph applies only to the first~~  
 5 ~~segment.~~

6 (4)(5) Bears shall not be taken while in the act of consuming bait.

7 (5) ~~— Bears may be taken with the aid of bait during the entire open season in the counties identified in~~  
 8 ~~Subparagraph (a)(6) of this Rule.~~

9 (6)(5) Hunters shall not take bears using dogs in the following counties: Alamance south of Interstate  
 10 85, Anson west of N.C. Hwy 742, Cabarrus, Chatham, Davie, Davidson, Franklin, Forsyth,  
 11 Gaston, Guilford, Lee, Lincoln, Mecklenburg, Montgomery, Orange south of Interstate 85,  
 12 Randolph, Rockingham, Rowan, Stanly, Union, and Wake south of N.C. Hwy 98. In all other  
 13 counties and parts of counties, hunters may take bears using dogs and may release dogs in the  
 14 vicinity of bait.

15 (c) No Open Season. There is no open season in those parts of counties included in the following posted bear  
 16 sanctuaries:

- 17 Avery, Burke, and Caldwell counties--Daniel Boone bear sanctuary except by permit only
- 18 Beaufort, Bertie, and Washington counties--Bachelor Bay bear sanctuary
- 19 Bladen County--Suggs Mill Pond bear sanctuary
- 20 Brunswick County--Green Swamp bear sanctuary
- 21 Buncombe, Haywood, Henderson, and Transylvania counties--Pisgah bear sanctuary
- 22 Carteret, Craven, and Jones counties--Croatan bear sanctuary
- 23 Clay County--Fires Creek bear sanctuary
- 24 Columbus County--Columbus County bear sanctuary
- 25 Currituck County--North River bear sanctuary
- 26 Dare County--Bombing Range bear sanctuary except by permit only
- 27 Haywood County--Harmon Den bear sanctuary
- 28 Haywood County--Sherwood bear sanctuary
- 29 Hyde County--Gull Rock bear sanctuary
- 30 Hyde County--Pungo River bear sanctuary
- 31 Jackson County--Panthertown-Bonas Defeat bear sanctuary
- 32 Macon County--Standing Indian bear sanctuary
- 33 Macon County--Wayah bear sanctuary
- 34 Madison County--Rich Mountain bear sanctuary
- 35 McDowell and Yancey counties--Mt. Mitchell bear sanctuary except by permit only
- 36 Mitchell and Yancey counties--Flat Top bear sanctuary
- 37 Wilkes County--Thurmond Chatham bear sanctuary

1 (d) The daily bag limit is one, the possession limit is one, and the season limit is one.

2 (e) Kill Reports. The carcass of each bear shall be reported as provided by 15A NCAC 10B .0113.
