35		(B) any extracts of substances identified in Part (A) of this Subparagraph;	
36		(C) any substances modified by substances identified in Part (A) of this Subparagraph,	
37		including any extracts of those substances; or	
38		(D) any bear bait attractant, including sprays, aerosols, scent balls, and scent powders.

13		Gaston, Guilford, Lee, Lincoln, Mecklenburg, Montgomery, Orange south of Interstate 85,
14		Randolph, Rockingham, Rowan, Stanly, Union, and Wake south of N.C. Hwy 98. In all other
15		counties and parts of counties, hunters may take bears using dogs and may release dogs in the
16		vicinity of bait.
