The instructor may satisfy the teaching requirement for the General Probationary 16 Instructor certification by teaching any specialized topic for which certification has been issued;
- when Specialized Instructor Certification is issued during an existing period of General Instructor
   Certification, either probationary status or general status, the specialized instructor may satisfy the
   teaching requirement for the General Certification by teaching the specialized subject for which
   certification has been issued;
- (3) where Specialized Instructor Certification becomes concurrent with an existing active period of
   General Instructor Certification, and there are 12 months or more until the certifications'
   expiration date, the instructor shall teach 12 hours for each specialized topic for which

(4) proof that the individual applying for renewal as a Specialized Physical Fitness Instructor has

### COMMENT:

Upon review of Session Law 2015-49, it appears as though a large majority of this Rule is duplicative of G.S. 17C-10.1. A comparison is provided below of the statutory and rule language. Please note that two portions of this Rule are not duplicative and are therefore not highlighted in the chart below:

- In Paragraph (a) of 12 NCAC 09B .0701, the agency has identified the form used to provide information to the Division; and
- In Subparagraph (e)(4) of 12 NCAC 09B .0701, the agency has identified the 180 hours of "supplementary high-liability training" to satisfy G.S. 17C-10.1(c)(5).

A comparison of 12 NCAC 09B .0701 to the applicable statute, G.S. 17C-10.1, "Certification of military service members and veterans with law enforcement training and experience," reflects that a substantial portion of the rule is duplicative of the statutory language. G.S. 150B-21.9 requires the following of the Rules Review Commission:

- (a) Standards. The Commission must determine whether a rule meets all of the following criteria:
  - (1) It is within the authority delegated to the agency by the General Assembly.
  - (2) It is clear and unambiguous.
  - (3) It is reasonably necessary to implement or interpret an enactment of the General Assembly, or of Congress, or a regulation of a federal agency. The Commission shall consider the cumulative effect of all rules adopted by the agency related to the specific purpose for which the rule is proposed.
  - (4) It was adopted in accordance with Part 2 of this Article.

In light of the duplicative content of this Rule, 12 NCAC 09B .0701 does not appear necessary to implement or interpret G.S. 17C-10.1. The information that is contained within this Rule and not

duplicative of G.S. 17C-10.1 is the information referencing the Commission's Form F-21, and the 180 hours of "supplementary high-liability training" set forth on page 2, lines 17 through 31 to identify what courses satisfy G.S. 17C-10.1(c)(5).

### SUMMARY:

Staff is concerned that the adoption of 12 NCAC 09B .0701 by the Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission is an unnecessary rule, aside from the reference to the form and the supplemental training. It is staff's opinion that this Rule should be objected to for failure to comply with G.S. 150B-21.9(a)(3).
