Generally, the subparagraphs under Paragraph (a) are not consistently punctuated. Each subparagraph begins with "the waters of [name of waterbody]." This phrase is sometimes followed by a comma. Can this be consistent? It appears that a comma is proper in most cases, but in any event please use consistent punctuation. If commas are added, one is not needed in (a)(7), (a)(9), or (a)(11).

Page 1, line 9 – replace "it" with "Taylor's Creek"

Page 1, line 15 – add a comma after "Shepard"

Please consider revising Paragraph (c) as follows (I have tried to format this in accord with our publication rules – please check):
