Since you are ending Items (1) through (4) with semicolons, rather than periods, I believe you should insert an "and" at the end of the sentence on line 16, because I assume you are requiring all of the Items (1) through (5). If you don't, please insert "or"

In Item (5), line 17, by "rules" do you mean the rules of the Section? If so, state that "the rules of this Section." Or you can say "these Rules"

4	A registered nurse employed by a local health department may dispense prescription drugs or devices under the

6	(1)	Drugs or devices may be dispensed only to health department patients, with the exception of:
7		(a) opioid antagonists, which may be dispensed either to health department patients or to
8		others as permitted by G.S. <u>90-12.7</u> ; <del>90-106.2</del> ; and
9		(b) epinephrine auto-injectors, which may be dispensed either to health department patients
10		or to school personnel as permitted by G.S. 115C-375.2A;
11	(2)	No drugs or devices may by dispensed except at health department clinics;
12	(3)	The health department shall secure the services of a pharmacist-manager who shall be responsible
13		for compliance with all statutes, rules, and regulations governing the practice of pharmacy and
14		dispensing of drugs at the health department;
15	(4)	Only the general categories of drugs or devices listed in Rule .2403 of this Section may be
16		dispensed by a health department registered nurse;
17	(5)	All drugs or devices dispensed pursuant to G.S. 90-85.34A and these rules shall be packaged,
18		labeled, and otherwise dispensed in compliance with state and federal law, and records of
19		dispensing shall be kept in compliance with state and federal law. The pharmacist-manager shall
20		verify the accuracy of the records at least weekly, and where health department personnel dispense
21		to 30 or more patients in a 24-hour period per dispensing site, the pharmacist-manager shall verify
22		the accuracy of the records within 24 hours after dispensing occurs.

6	indicated conditions:		
7	(1)	Anti-tuberculosis drugs, as recommended by the North Carolina Department of Health and Human	
8		Services in the North Carolina Tuberculosis Policy Manual (available at www.ncdhhs.gov), when	
9		used for the treatment and control of tuberculosis;	
10	(2)	Anti-infective agents used in the control of sexually-transmitted diseases as recommended by the	
11		United States Centers for Disease Control in the Sexually Transmitted Diseases Treatment	
12		Guidelines (available at www.cdc.gov);	
13	(3)	Natural or synthetic hormones and contraceptive devices when used for the prevention of	
14		pregnancy;	
15	(4)	Topical preparations for the treatment of lice, scabies, impetigo, diaper rash, vaginitis, and related	
16		skin conditions;	
17	(5)	Vitamin and mineral supplements;	
18	(6)	Opioid antagonists prescribed pursuant to G.S. 90-12.7; 90-106.2; and	
19	(7)	Epinephrine auto-injectors prescribed pursuant to G.S. 115C-375.2A.	
20	(b) Regardless of the provisions set out in this Rule, no drug defined as a controlled substance by the United States		
21	Controlled Substances Act, 21 U.S. Code 801 through 904, or regulations enacted pursuant to that Act, 21 CFR 1300		
22	through 1308, or by the North Carolina Controlled Substances Act, G.S. 90-86 through 90-113.8, may be dispensed		
23	by registered nurses pursuant to G.S. 90-85.34A.
