## **RRC STAFF OPINION**

## COMMENT:

The agency changed the designation of the above-referenced Rules after publication, from "necessary <u>with</u> substantive public interest" to "necessary <u>without</u> substantive public interest."

Staff notes that the agency received identical comments for each Rule from agency staff. All comments stated:

This Rule should not have an Agency Determination as 'Necessary with substantive public interest.' It should have the determination 'Necessary without substantive public interest.' This was an error that occurred during the internal Rules Review process.

It appears that the initial determination of "necessary <u>with</u>" was made in error. For these three Rules, however, the initial determination posted by the agency reflected that it would be readopting them. The change after the comment period to reflect that the agency would not be taking additional action on these Rules may affect the expectations of the regulated public.

One Rule that was published as "unnecessary" was changed to "necessary without substantive public interest," apparently in response to the comment. Staff notes that the Commission has historically allowed agencies to change the designation of "unnecessary" and "necessary without substantive public interest" to the other in the past. However, the Commission has determined that agencies cannot change the designation of rules that were published as "necessary with substantive public interest" to a different designation after publication of the report.

Therefore, it is staff's recommendation that the classification of these Rules be changed to what was published, "necessary <u>with</u> substantive public interest."
