The Rules Review Commission staff has completed its review of this rule prior to the Commission's next meeting. The Commission has not yet reviewed this rule and therefore there has not been a determination as to whether the rule will be approved. You may call this office to inquire concerning the staff recommendation.

In reviewing these rules, the staff determined that the following technical changes need to be made:

Please restart the line numbers at 1 for each page. (See Rule 26 NCAC 02C .0108(1)(h))

Please put these defined terms in quotation marks and in alphabetical order.

In current Items (3) and (4), lines 8 and 10, should "detailed implementation plan" be capitalized to be consistent with Item (12)? I note the term is capitalized in Rule .0103(a).

In Item (4), line 10, I believe "Division" should be capitalized to be consistent with Item (14).

Also, what are the three regions? Are those set forth somewhere?

In Item (5), line 12, please be sure to also put "cooperator" in quotation marks.

In Item (6), please put "Actual costs" on line 14 in quotation marks as well.

On line 15, what are "direct costs"? Does your regulated public know?

In Item (7), are the practices known to your regulated public? Are you relying upon Rule .0104 of this Section to further clarify this concept?

On line 17, why not delete "those types of practices which are"? I think the sentence would be clearer without it. If you need to retain it, replace "which" with "that"

In Item (8), line 21, what is the "operating unit"?

In Item (9), line 22, replace "which" with "that"

In Item (12), line 33, how is the plan approved?

Amanda J. Reeder Commission Counsel Date submitted to agency: September 22, 2016 Consider breaking Item (12) into a list, like so:

"Detailed Implementation Plan" means the plan... including:

- (a) annual program goals;
- (b) district, statewide, and regional allocations;

In Item (13), line 36, please remove the underline from (11)

Also on line 36, please replace "and which" with "that"

On line 37, how is this approved by the Division? And what is "technically adequate"?

In Item (15), Page 2, line 39, I suggest replacing "allocation, which" with "allocation that"

In Item (16), line 41, please insert a comma after "annum"

Also on line 41, what is a "technical" position? Or is this tied to "District technicians" in Rule .0103(e)(6)?

In Item (17), so that I'm clear – the district must approve these before they are submitted to the Commission?

In Item (18), line 48, I believe "year-to-year" should be hyphenated.

On line 49, insert a comma after "quasi-governmental agency"

On line 50, do you need to retain "or any such agency, by whatever name called," given the language on line 49? Could you say "<u>Any</u> governmental or quasi-governmental agency..." and delete the language on line 50?

In Item (20), line 55, define "successfully"

In Item (22), line 60, replace "their" with "its"

Is there a reason Item (23) does not parallel the language in Item (15)? Do both portions of the funds apply to the district funds?

Please retype the rule accordingly and resubmit it to our office at 1711 New Hope Church Road, Raleigh, North Carolina 27609.

The Rules Review Commission staff has completed its review of this rule prior to the Commission's next meeting. The Commission has not yet reviewed this rule and therefore there has not been a determination as to whether the rule will be approved. You may call this office to inquire concerning the staff recommendation.

In reviewing these rules, the staff determined that the following technical changes need to be made:

Please restart the line numbers at 1 for each page. (See Rule 26 NCAC 02C .0108(1)(h))

In (a), line 6, please insert a comma after "regional"

On line 6, so that I'm clear – the eligible purposes are what are in (a)(1) through (3)?

In (a)(1), to be consistent with (a)(2) and (3), please begin "cost" with a lowercase "c"

Please end (a)(1) through (2) with semicolons, not commas.

On line 8 and elsewhere the term is used, what is "cost share"? "Cost share incentive" is defined in Rule .0102, but this term is not. Does your regulated public know what this means?

On line 12, change "on" to "upon"

On line 12, Page 3, line 76 (both places) and line 82, and Page 4, lines 111 and 112, please capitalize "Division"

On line 12, so that I'm clear, the "needs expressed by the districts" will be those in the Strategy Plan defined in Rule .0102?

In (b), line 14, how are the districts "designated eligible"?

On line 15, do you need to retain "annual" before "strategy plan" since the term as defined in Rule .0102 states that it is annual?

On line 16, do you mean "program year" instead of "fiscal year" given that program year is defined in Rule .0102?

On line 24, what is meant by "sufficient"?

On line 25, how is this identified? And should it read "NPS pollution problems"?

On line 27, please replace "is based on" with "shall be based upon"

On line 28, please replace "are" with "shall be"

In (c)(3), Page 2, line 42, please strike "to be used"

In (c)(4), lines 46-47, how does this determination occur?

So that I'm clear, where does the money from (c)(5) come from? The emergency funds? Or unallocated funds?

What does (c)(6) mean? I'm sure your regulated public knows, but I do not, so I would appreciate clarification.

In (c)(7)(A), line 57, districts can be comprised of more than one county, correct? If so, then how will this work? The Commission will still consider by county, rather than the district as a whole?

In (c)(7)(A), (B), and (E), since you are relying upon outside sources, I assume you wish to incorporate them by reference using G.S. 150B-21.6? If so, please state where someone can obtain them, at what cost, and whether you are including subsequent amendments and editions (and given the text of the Rule, I assume you are).

In (c)(7)(C), does your regulated public know what "Phase I and Phase II requirements" are?

In (c)(7)(B), lines 64-65, you specify that the Division is within DEQ. Why aren't you doing the same in (c)(7)(A) and (E)?

How will (c)(7)(F) work? Since 100 points are already allocated by (c)(7)(A) through (E), will there be bonus points? What other factors may the Division recommend, and why will it do so? You need to provide guidance on this in the Rule.

In (d), Page 3, line 76, I take it that the determination of "appropriate" will be made by the district?

Also on line 76, how will the Division rank them? Using what criteria?

In (e), line 79, replace "on" with "upon"

On line 80, the needs expressed by the district will be through the strategy plan, correct?

On line 83, the term "at least" is generally not favored in rule, as rules set the minimum requirement. However, I take it you need to retain the term here?

On line 84, replace "to which funds are allocated" with "allocated funds"

Also on line 84, how shall the district demonstrate this?

On line 86, replace "is" with "shall be"

On line 87, replace "are" with "shall be"

In (e)(3), line 93, I suggest you strike "beyond those requested by the district"

In (e)(4)(B) and (C), can you please explain the "normalized to 1 to 100 scale" to me? I am sure your regulated public is familiar with this, but I need clarification.

In (e)(5), it seems you are missing words after "local match." Should it read "<u>the funding shall</u>" or <u>"the Commission shall</u>" before "provide support"? Who is going to do this?

In (e)(6), line 110, how is this eligibility determined? Is it because there is a cost share agreement?

In (e)(6), Page 4, line 111, replace "must" with "shall"

On line 112, is "concerned" the right word? What about "participating"?

I am unclear about the scenario on lines 112-113. What if there are 3 districts participating in this agreement – how will this work then?

On line 113, replace "must" with "shall"

In (e)(7), line 116, do you mean "shall" rather than "may"? If not, then when will the Commission decide when there are funds available to not allocate monies for administrative costs?

In (f), line 119, replace "on" with "upon"

On line 120, again "as expressed" will be in the Strategy Plan?

On line 122, replace "must" with "shall"

- 4 (a) The Commission shall consider the total amount of funding available for allocation, relative needs of the program for
- 5 BMP implementation, local technical assistance, and education to determine the proportion of available funds to be
- 6 allocated for each eligible purpose. This determination shall be done prior to allocating funds to statewide, regional and
- 7 <u>district allocation pools and the Division</u>. Funds may be allocated for any or all of the following purposes:
- 8 (1) Cost share and cost share incentive payments,
- 9 (2) technical assistance and administrative assistance, and
- 10 (3) statewide or local education and outreach activities.
- 11 The percentage of funding available for each purpose and each allocation pool shall be specified in the annual Detailed

13 (a)(b) District Allocations: The Commission shall allocate the cost share funds from the district allocation pool to the

- 16 fiscal year. Funds may be allocated to each district and the Division for any or all of the following purposes:
- 17 (1) Cost share and cost share incentive payments,

- 20 (b) The Commission shall consider the relative needs of the program for BMP implementation, local technical
- 21 assistance, and education to determine the proportion of available funds to be allocated for each eligible purpose prior to
- 22 allocating funds to districts and the Division.

23 (c) Funds for cost share and cost share incentive payments shall be allocated to the districts at the beginning of the fiscal 24 year and whenever the Commission determines that sufficient funds are available in the district allocation pool to justify 25 a reallocation. Districts shall be allocated monies based on the identified level of nonpoint source pollution problems and 26 the respective district's BMP installation goals as demonstrated in the district annual strategy plan. The allocation 27 method used for disbursement of funds is based on the score of each respective district for those parameters approved by 28 the Commission pursuant to Subparagraph $\frac{(9)}{(7)}$ of this Paragraph. The points each district scores on each parameter are 29 totaled and proportioned to the total dollars available for district allocation under the current program year funding 30 according to the following formula:

Each district 81 may use these monies to fund new positions or to accelerate present technical assistance. Districts must provide an 82 itemized budget to the division in order to qualify for technical assistance funds. N.C. Community Conservation 83 Assistance Program technical assistance funds may be used for technical assistance with the district matching at least 50 84 percent of the total. Each district to which funds are allocated for technical assistance shall demonstrate to the 85 Commission that matching funds are available prior to any expenditure of funds. The allocation method used for 86 disbursement of funds is based on the score of each respective district for those parameters approved by the Commission 87 pursuant to Subparagraph (4) of this Paragraph. The points each district scores for each parameter are totaled and 88 proportioned to the total dollars available under the current program year funding according to the following formula:
