Page 1, line 18 – replace "where the student is provides" with "is provided"

Page 1, lines 20-21 – do you intend to limit "clinical judgment" to a "student's knowledge" etc.? If not, perhaps revise as follows (and note the added comma):

(8) "Clinical judgment" means the application of nursing knowledge, skills, abilities, and experience in making decisions about client care.

Page 1, line 22 – add a comma after "skills"

Page 1, line 25 – what are "psychomotor" skills – is this term well understood by your regulated community?

Page 1, line 29 – replace "the nurse as defined" with "a nurse as described" or "a nurse as outlined"

Page 1, line 34 – replace "objectives/outcomes" with "objectives or outcomes" or "objectives and outcomes"

Page 1, line 36 – do you intend for "accountability" to have the meaning defined in Item (2)? If so, use the defined term precisely as written in the definition.

Page 1, line 38 – replace "reflective thinking is encouraged," with "are encouraged to reflect on their performance,"

- Page 2, line 1 replace "while" with "during discussion of"
- Page 2, line 2 delete "are discussed"
- Page 2, line 4 replace "legal/ethical" with "legal and ethical"
- Page 2, line 4 add a comma after "practice"
- Page 2, line 6 delete "the"
- Page 2, line 7 delete the comma after "students"
- Page 2, line 7 replace "separate from each other" with something like "not in the same location" or "not in the same room" or "not in the same facility" whatever you mean.

If you insist on retaining it, delete "functioning in a dependent role in" and replace "direction" with "supervision" because that term is defined in Item (46).
- Page 4, line 2 add a comma after "development"
- Page 4, line 3 delete the comma after "individual"
- Page 4, line 5 add a comma after "methods"

Page 4, line 6 – add commas after "observations" and "documents," delete "and after "observations and add and after documents," and replace "in person" with "in-person"

Page 4, line 9 – add "by the Board" at the end of this line.

Page 4, line 10 - replace "the" with "an"

Page 4, line 11 – delete the comma after "possessed"

Page 4, line 12 - consider adding "or acquired" at the end of this line.

Page 2, lines 5 and 7 – be consistent as to whether you do or do not capitalize "initial approval." In your rules, you generally (though not perfectly consistently) do not capitalize defined words, although "Initial Approval" is often capitalized in this Rule.

Page 2, line 5 – add a comma after "approval" and after this comma add "and shall establish" or "and shall set"

Page 2, lines 9-10 – revise as follows:

(h) The Board shall rescind the initial approval of a program if the controlling institution fails to submit documentation as set forth in the plan required by Subparagraph (a)(10) of this Rule.

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### 21 NCAC 36 .0323 RECORDS AND REPORTS

- 4 (a) The controlling institution's publications describing the nursing program shall be accurate.
- 5 (b) There shall be a system for maintaining official records. Current and permanent student records shall
- 6 be stored in a secure manner that prevents physical damage and unauthorized access.
- 7 (c) Both permanent and current records shall be available for review by Board staff.
- 8 (d) The official permanent record for each graduate shall include documentation of graduation from the program and a transcript of the individual's achievement in the program.
- 10 (e) The record for each <u>currently</u> enrolled student shall contain up-to-date and complete information, 11 including the following:
  - (1) documentation of admission criteria met by the student;
  - (2) high school graduation, high school equivalent, or earned credits from post-secondary institution approved pursuant to G.S. 90-171.38(a); and
  - (3) transcript of credit hours achieved in the classroom, laboratory, and clinical instruction for each course that reflects progression consistent with program policies.
  - (f) The nursing program shall file with the Board records, data, and reports in order to furnish information concerning operation of the program as prescribed in the rules in this Section including:
    - (1) an Annual Report to be filed with the Board by November 1 of each year;
    - (2) a Program Description Report for non-accredited programs filed with the Board at least 30 days prior to a scheduled review; and
      - (3) notification by institution administration of any change of the registered nurse responsible for the nursing program. This notification shall include a vitae for the new individual and shall be submitted within 20 10 business days of the effective date of the change.
  - (g) All communications relevant to accreditation shall be submitted to the North Carolina Board of Nursing at the same time the communications are submitted to the accrediting body.
- (h) The Board may require additional records and reports for review at any time to provide evidence and substantiate compliance with the rules in this Section by a program and its associated agencies.
  - (i) The part of the application for licensure by examination to be submitted by the nursing program shall include a statement verifying satisfactory completion of all requirements for graduation and the date of completion. The nursing program director shall submit the online verification form to the Board within one month [10 business days] following completion of the [graduation from a] Board approved nursing program.
