6	those in which there is an opportunity for live two-way communication between the presenter and attendee. An on-	
7	line continuing education course may satisfy this contact-hour requirement provided that the continuing education	
8	course includes live two-way communication between the presenter and attendee. standard is met.	
9	(c) A pharmacist who accumulates more than the required 15 hours of continuing education in a single year may carry	
10	forward up to five surplus hours to be applied to the following year's continuing education requirements.	
11	(d) (c) A pharmacist shall preserve all continuing education records for three years. If a continuing education provider	
12	approved in Paragraph (e) of this Rule maintains an electronic database of all pharmacists granted continuing	
13	education credits accredited by the provider, then the storage of that information in the provider's database shall be	
14	deemed to satisfy the pharmacist's recordkeeping requirement.	
15	(e) (d) Upon license renewal, the pharmacist shall report continuing education hours through the Board's online	
16	license renewal portal. on a form approved and provided by the Board. The Board may require a pharmacist to submit	
17	records, reports of accredited hours and certificates of credit on a random basis pursuant to a continuing education	
18	audit.	
19	(f) (e) All continuing education shall be obtained through continuing education courses accredited by the	
20	Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education or the North Carolina Association of Pharmacists. Pharmacists may	
21	also acquire [up to] five hours continuing education credit for precepting, for at least 160 hours, a student enrolled in	
22	the University of North Carolina Eshelman School of Pharmacy, the Campbell University College of Pharmacy and	
23	Health Sciences, the Wingate University School of Pharmacy, or the High Point University Fred Wilson School of	
24	Pharmacy as part of these schools' academic program. The Board shall approve continuing education courses as	
25	accredited if they provide education on matters that will maintain or increase the participant's professional competence	
26	and proficiency as a pharmacist.	
27	(f) A pharmacist shall be exempt from the requirements of this Rule if:	
28	(1) The pharmacist is eligible for a waiver of continuing education requirements under 21 NCAC	
29	<u>46 .1613; or</u>	
30	(2) For the entire year preceding license renewal, the pharmacist resided in another state, did not	
31	practice pharmacy in North Carolina, and satisfied the state of residence's continuing education	
32	requirements for pharmacist licensure.	
33	(g) Continuing education shall not serve as a barrier to reciprocity; however however, all licensees by reciprocity	
34	must observe the continuing education standards specified in (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) of this Rule within the first	
35	renewal period after licensure in this state.
