 - (3) It is unlawful for persons who have been issued a Horseshoe Crab Biomedical Use Permit to fail to comply with the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission Interstate Fishery Management Plan for Horseshoe Crab. The Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission Interstate Fishery Management Plan for Horseshoe Crab is incorporated by reference including subsequent amendments and editions. - (b) Dealers Permits for Monitoring Fisheries under a Quota/Allocation:
 - (1) During the commercial season opened by proclamation or rule for the fishery for which a Dealers Permit for Monitoring Fisheries under a Quota/Allocation permit is issued, it is unlawful for the fish dealers issued such permit to fail to:
 - (A) fax or send via electronic mail by noon daily, on forms provided by the Division, the previous day's landings for the permitted fishery to the dealer contact designated on the permit. Landings for Fridays or Saturdays shall be submitted on the following Monday. If the dealer is unable to fax or electronic mail the required information, the permittee shall call in the previous day's landings to the dealer contact designated on the permit, but shall maintain a log furnished by the Division;

 - (E) record the permanent dealer identification number on the bill of lading or receipt for each transaction or shipment from the permitted fishery.

Lines 9, 18, and 24 – the terms "initiation of the action" and "commence proceedings" seem to mean the same thing. Please choose one term and use it consistently. I recommend "commence proceedings."

Line 12 – add a comma after "right"

Line 13 – add a comma after "Hearings"

Lines 15, 23, and 29 – delete "lawful"

Line 18 – replace "for the initiation of the action" with "to commence proceedings"

Line 24 – replace "for the initiation of the action" with "to commence proceedings"

Line 28 – add a comma after "and"

Line 28 – add "shall" before "notify" and delete "of"

Line 30 – delete ", but not limited to"

Line 31 – delete the comma

Line 33 – "may" – what factors or standards govern the exercise of the Division's discretion? Are these factors or standards nothing more than that "the public health, safety, or welfare requires emergency action"? Are these standards more fully set out in statutes, other rules, or materials incorporated by reference?
