- 15 (2) the length of time the applicant has been licensed in good standing to practice veterinary medicine; and
- 16 (3) the reasons which that the applicant offers for requesting a limited veterinary license; and
- 17 (4) whether facts available to the Board indicate the applicant's application has merit; and
- (5) any other criteria bearing directly upon information affecting the applicant's capability and need for a
 limited veterinary license, license, determined on a case-by-case basis, including the applicant's record of
 any criminal charges and convictions.
- 21 (d) Upon written application, the Board may issue a limited veterinary license to a person employed by the North Carolina
- 22 Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (NCDA&CS) in a position with the North Carolina Veterinary Diagnostic
- 23 Laboratory System (NCVDLS), provided the applicant meets the criteria for issuance of this limited veterinary license. The
