On lines 6-7, why is "general instructor" lowercase here, when it is capitalized on line 4? Whichever is correct, please be consistent with your capitalization.

On line 7, define "teaching professional"

On lines 7-8, I recommend stating, "The F-12 form used for this recommendation..."

In the History Note, line 10, G.S. 150B-11 was repealed in 1991. Please remove it from your History Note.
