Furthermore, the limitation that, ' No payment is due a hospital when an autopsy is performed in that facility. ' is inappropriate since the hospital has the same duties if not more if an autopsy is performed. The fee should be substantially increased.</p>	While the comment has merit, increasing the fee would require legislative action to appropriate additional funds.
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
