Rule 21 NCAC 66 .0206 is amended as published in 32:05 NCR 458-460 with changes as follows:

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21 NCAC 66 .0206 MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR CONTINUING EDUCATION

Each person holding a veterinary license, <u>limited license</u>, a faculty certificate, <u>or</u> a zoo veterinary certificate (<u>collectively referred to herein as "veterinarian"</u>) or a veterinary technician registration issued by the Board shall comply with the standards in this <u>Rule</u>, <u>Rule</u>, <u>which The</u> standards shall be a condition precedent to the renewal of a license certificate or registration, respectively. <u>Except as otherwise qualified</u>, the criteria with respect to continuing veterinary medical education of a person holding a certificate of registration as a veterinary technician shall be the same as that for a licensed veterinarian. The standards are as follows:

- (1) Continuing education credit hours shall relate to veterinary medicine.
- (1)(2) A Veterinarians veterinarian shall earn 20 continuing education credit hours each calendar. for the calendar year license renewal period.
- (2)(3) A Veterinary veterinary technicians technician registered with the Board shall earn 12 continuing education credit hours every for the two calendar years, year registration renewal period.
 - A Veterinarians veterinarian or veterinary technician may request and be granted an extension of time, not to exceed six months, to satisfy the continuing education requirement if the veterinarian or veterinary technician provides evidence of an ineapacitating illness a debilitating injury or illness or evidence of other circumstance which that constituted [constitutes] a severe and verifiable prevents the veterinarian or veterinary technician from being able to obtain continuing education. hardship such that to comply with the continuing education requirement would have been (is or was) impossible or unreasonably burdensome. If the incapacitating illness or circumstance is likely to result in loss of life of the veterinarian the Board shall exempt the veterinarian from the uncarned portion of the continuing education requirement for that renewal period. If the veterinarian or veterinary technician submits evidence of failure to complete continuing education due to debilitating injury or illness or hardship, the Board shall consider the evidence submitted on a case-by-case basis. If the Board finds that the debilitating injury or illness or hardship was the basis for non-compliance with the continuing education requirement, the Board shall exempt that individual from completing the unearned portion of the continuing education for that renewal period. [If the evidence shows that the incapacitating illness or other circumstance is or was so severe that it is or was impractical or impossible, or unreasonably burdensome to comply with the continuing education requirement, the Board shall exempt the veterinarian or veterinary technician from any uncarned portion of the continuing education requirement for that renewal period.
- (4) Credit hours may be earned as follows: one hour credit for each hour of attendance at in depth seminars such as seminars sponsored by the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA), the American Animal Hospital Association (AAHA), the North Carolina Veterinary Medical Association (NCVMA), and academies and schools of veterinary medicine. Only one hour credit may be acquired for attendance at a local sectional association meeting. The Board shall consider additional course

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1		offerings for approval for continuing education credit, provided that the Board is furnished sufficient
2		information to establish that the course content and quality is substantially comparable to the course
3		offerings by those seminars sponsored by the organizations or institutions listed in this Subparagraph.
4		Approval for continuing education credit for courses other than those specified herein shall be
5		obtained prior to attendance at a course; however, the Board may waive the requirement of approval
6		prior to attendance at the course if circumstances beyond the veterinarian's or registrant's control
7		prevented obtaining the prior approval. Only three four hours credit per year may be acquired from
8		review of an audio or video cassette or computer-based training.
9	<u>(5)</u>	Continuing education credits hours may be earned [only] from courses, programs, or materials
10		presented or approved by the following providers:
11		(a) the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA);
12		(b) the American Animal Hospital Association (AAHA);
13		(c) the North Carolina Veterinary Medical Association (NCVMA):
14		(d) the American Association of Veterinary State Boards' (AAVSB) Registry of
15		Approved Continuing Education (RACE); and
16		(e) academies, schools, or colleges of veterinary medicine.
17		These providers are designated herein as "approved continuing education credit providers."
18		The Board shall consider additional courses, [presentations] presentations, or materials eligible for
19		approval for continuing education credit [hours] hours, provided that the individual seeking the credit
20		[furnish] furnishes the Board sufficient-information to establish that the content and quality of the
21		course, [presentation] presentation, or material are of an educational level reflective of the audience
22		(veterinarians or veterinary technicians). [substantially comparable to that offered or approved by the
23		approved continuing education credit providers.] Board approval for continuing education credits for
24		such additional courses, [presentation] presentations, or materials shall be obtained prior to attendance
25		or participation; however, the Board [may] shall waive the requirement of prior approval if illness,
26		injury, or natural disaster [eircumstances beyond the control of the veterinarian or veterinary
27		technician] [prevent obtaining the prior approval,] prevented the individual from obtaining the prior
28		approval.
29	<u>(6)</u>	Subject to the limitations in this Rule, continuing education credit hours may be earned [by] by:
30		(a) attendance at [in-depth] in-person courses or presentations;
31		(b) or by completion of independent self-study courses;
32		(c) non-interactive on-line presentations, courses or materials; or
33		(d) <u>by-completion of live interactive on-line presentations or courses.</u>
34	<u>(7)</u>	One continuing education credit [hour] hour, up to 100% of the CE requirement for renewal, may be
35		earned for each hour of in-person attendance at courses presented or approved by approved continuing
36		education credit providers. Up to 25% of the CE requirement for renewal may be obtained from
37		independent self-study [courses] courses, for materials, approved by approved continuing education

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1		eredit providers, with content transmitted through] videos, DVDs, CDs, prerecorded webinars, audio
2		conferences, and non-interactive on-line presentations approved by approved continuing education
3		credit providers. Up to 50% of the CE requirement for renewal may be obtained from live interactive
4		on-line presentations or courses approved by approved continuing education credit providers.
5		[providers, provided however] However, the number of credit hours earned from live interactive on-
6		line presentations or courses shall be reduced by the number of credit hours earned from independent
7		self-study courses or materials and non-interactive on-line presentations or courses. A live interactive
8		on-line presentation or course [must] shall:
9		(a) include instant or asynchronous two-way communication; [and]
10		(b) provide [timely] access to both technical personnel and professional faculty, as well
11		as interactivity among participants for the exchange of questions and answers via
12		instant messaging or a moderated teleconference; and
13		(c) document the level of participation by keeping a record of the participant's activity
14		in asking or answering questions during the presentation and the score of any
15		examination administered at the end or the presentation.
16	(5) (8)	Each veterinarian and veterinary technician shall keep a record of for the three most recent renewal
17		periods of the content of courses submitted to the Board for continuing education credit hours hours.
18		earned. Each year he or she shall certify on a form provided by the Board the number of credit hours
19		earned. The Board shall mail the form to each veterinarian at the time of annual renewal.
20	(6) (9)	During the calendar year in which a veterinarian graduates from veterinary college or during the
21		calendar year in which a veterinary technician graduates from veterinary technician school, a
22		veterinarian or veterinary technician, respectively, shall not be required to earn continuing education
23		eredits for that portion of the calendar year remaining from the date when the license or registration
24		was issued to the end of the calendar year.
25	(7) (10)	A veterinarian licensed in the year of graduation from a veterinary medical college is not required to
26		earn continuing education credit hours to be eligible for license renewal for the next renewal period.
27	(8) (11)	A veterinary technician registered in the year of graduation from a veterinary medical technology
28		program is not required to earn continuing education credit hours to be eligible for registration renewal
29		for the next renewal period.
30	(9) (12)	A veterinarian or veterinary technician serving in the armed forces of the United States and to whom
31		an extension of time to file a tax return is granted pursuant to G.S. § 105-249.2 is granted the same
32		extension of time to comply with the continuing education requirement of this [rule] Rule.
