The Rules Review Commission staff has completed its review of this Rule prior to the Commission's next meeting. The Commission has not yet reviewed this Rule and therefore there has not been a determination as to whether the Rule will be approved. You may call our office to inquire concerning the staff recommendation.

In reviewing this Rule, the staff recommends the following technical changes be made:

In Item (2), is the use of detergent in "soap (or detergent)" necessary given its use on line 13 "detergent or chemical cleaner"?

In Item (6), please make the phrase on line 22 beginning with "requires the use of chemical..." into a full sentence. A suggestion would be "Disinfect' is the process of making a non-porous item safe for use that includes use. Requires the use of a chemical..."

In Item (10), please consider breaking out the different requirements of each licensing cycle into a list for easier reading. A suggestion would be as follows:

- (10) "Licensing cycle" shall be as follows:
 - (a) for eosmetologists cosmetologists, the licensing cycle is a three-year period beginning on the first day of October and ending on the third following first day of October and continuing thereafter in three year intervals. For intervals;
 - (b) for estheticians, natural hair care specialists and manicurists, the licensing cycle is one year in length beginning on the first day of October and ending on the next first day of October. For intervals; and
 - (c) for teachers, the licensing cycle is a two-year period beginning on the first day of October of an even-numbered year and ending on the next first day of October of the next even-numbered year.

In Item (14), would it be helpful to provide some examples for porous materials as you have for non-porous materials in Item (13)?

In Item (16), is sterilization specific to non-porous materials as disinfect is specific to porous materials?

20	88	BB-2(5), but is not solely a manicurist or an esthetics school.
21	(5) "C	Cosmetology Student" is a student in any cosmetic art school whose study is the full curriculum.
22	(6) "I	Disinfect" is the process of making a non-porous item safe for use. Requires the use of a chemical
23	in	tended to kill or denature a bacteria, virus or fungus. Items to be disinfected must be cleaned
24	pr	ior to disinfection. UV light is not acceptable for disinfection.
25	(7) "I	Disinfectant" is an EPA registered bactericidal, virucidal and fungicidal disinfectant that is
26	ap	proved for use in hospital beauty salon or salon settings, following instruction label for dilution
27	ra	tio and contact time, or an EPA registered Sodium Hypochlorite 5.25 percent or higher
28	(h	ousehold bleach) with instructions for disinfection, diluted as instructed on the label and
29	ob	serving the contact time listed on the manufacturers label. Bleach must be active (not expired)
30	Wi	ith a manufacture date of less than 6 months prior to use.
31	(8) "E	Esthetician School" is any cosmetic art school that teaches only the cosmetic art of skin care.
32	(9) "E	Esthetician Student" is a student in any cosmetic art school whose study is limited to the

34	(10) "L	cicensing cycle" for cosmetologists is a three-year period beginning on the first day of October

37	ye	ar in length beginning on the first day of October and ending on the next first day of October.

1		For teachers, the licensing cycle is a two-year period beginning on the first day of October of an
2		even-numbered year and ending on the next first day of October of the next even-numbered year.
3	(11)	"Manicurist School" is a cosmetic art school that teaches only the cosmetic art of manicuring.
4	(12)	"Manicurist Student" is a student in any cosmetic art school whose study is limited to the
5		manicurist curriculum set forth in 21 NCAC 14T .0605.
6	(13)	"Non-porous" is a material that has no pores and does not allow for liquids to be absorbed or pass
7		through. Common non-porous materials include glass, metal, and plastic.
8	(14)	"Porous" is a material that has minute spaces or holes through which liquid or air may pass.
9		Porous may also be called permeable, penetrable, or cellular.
10	(15)	"Renewal period" for individual licensees is a three-month period beginning on the first day of
11		July and ending on the first day of October of a renewal year. The "renewal period" for salon
12		licensees is a two-month period beginning on the first day of December and ending on the first day
13		of February of a renewal year.
14	(16)	"Sterilize" is the eradication of all microbial life through the use of heat, steam, or chemical
15		sterilants. Autoclaves and or dry heat sterilizers used to sterilize must be spore tested through an
16		independent lab every 30 days. Autoclaves or dry heat sterilizers used to sterilize must be FDA
17		approved and used only as instructed by the manufacturer. Spore testing results and maintenance
18		records must be kept onsite for 12 months.
19	(17)	"Successful Completion" is the completion of an approved cosmetic art curriculum with a
20		minimum grade of "C" or 70 percent, whichever is deemed as passing by the cosmetic art school.

Please make "The presence of animals or birds as prohibited in Rule .0402 of this Subchapter" a complete sentence. Perhaps something like "The presence of animals or birds as shall be prohibited as set forth in Rule .0402 of this Subchapter"

What is meant by "sanitary manner" in "All creams, lotions, wax, cosmetics, and other products dispensed to come in contact with patron's skin shall be kept in clean, closed containers and dispensed in a **sanitary manner**." Please delete or define.
