Dear Ms. Garrett:

At its March 21, 2013 meeting the Rules Review Commission objected to the above-captioned rules in accordance with G.S. 150B-21.10.

The Commission objected to rules .0601 and .0901 on the basis of a failure to adopt them in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act. The agency failed to make the technical changes as requested by counsel and cannot approve the rule until the changes are made. The issues leading to the technical change requests are serious enough that when cumulated they render the rules ambiguous.

The Commission objected to rule .0602 on the basis of ambiguity. It is not clear whether the use of the licensee's email address, as set out in the first sentence of (a) is mandatory or discretionary on the licensee's part. The board's rule .0603 requires an applicant to "notify the Board within 30 days of a change of name, work or home address." Rule .0401 concerning application procedures states in (g) that the "Board shall mail any notices to a licensee at the last known address." Taken together these three rules make it ambiguous whether the use of the email address to mail renewal notices is mandatory or at the discretion of the licensee.

Please respond to this letter in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 150B-21.12. If you have any questions regarding the Commission's action, please let me know.

3	21 NCAC 65 .0601 CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSED
4	RECREATIONAL THERAPIST AND LICENSED RECREATIONAL THERAPY
5	ASSISTANT
6	(a) During the two-year licensing period, a recreational therapist or recreational therapy assistant who is licensed by the
7	North Carolina Board of Recreation Therapy Licensure shall complete continuing education as outlined below.
8	Candidates for license renewal must complete a minimum of 20 points hours of continuing education to renew the
9	license. The renewal cycle is two years prior to your expiration date, 20 hours or 2.0 CEUs must be earned within these
10	two years. Content of continuing education must be directly related to the practice of recreational therapy or therapeutic
11	recreation and must be consistent with the current Job Analysis conducted by the National Council for Therapeutic
12	Recreation Certification. A licensee shall acquire credit through continuing education courses, academic courses, and
13	professional publications and presentations.
14	(b) Point Values will be awarded as the following: follows:
15	One CEP (Continuing Education Point) - one contact hour
16	0.1 CEU (Continuing Education Unit) = one contact hour
17	10 CEPs = 10 contact hours = 1.0 CEU (Continuing Education Unit) = ten hours
18	2.0 CEUs= 20 Hours of Continuing Education every two years
19	Renewal Cycle is two years back from renewal due date
20	(c) Continuing education is accepted if provided by an organization that adheres to the National or International Council
21	on Continuing Education Standards or by other approved providers of continuing education as defined by Board. The
22	content of the continuing education experiences must be linked directly to the knowledge areas from the most recent
23	National Job Analysis Study conducted by the National Council for Therapeutic Recreation Certification and any
24	subsequent amendments or changes.
25	(d) Academic Courses: Credit equivalents for completing academic coursework are: three semester hours equals 45
26	Hours CEPs or 4.5 CEUs.

27 (e) Professional Publications and Presentations: No more than 10 CEPs in the area of professional publications and
28 presentations shall be accepted for each renewal period according to the following point value: Repeat presentations are
29 limited to the current renewal cycle and does not apply to their use in subsequent cycles.

- 50 <u>Licensees shall attend Board directed Ethics training once per Renewal cycle for two hours credit.</u>
- 51 (i) Submission for on-line training documentation shall show value awarded, content, sponsoring body and submit link to
