14		In addition, each instructor certified by the Criminal Justice Commission to teach in a
15		Commission-certified course shall remain competent in his/her specific or specialty areas.
16		Competent includes remaining current in the instructor's area of expertise, which may be
17		demonstrated by attending and successfully completing all instructor updates issued by the
18		Commission.
19		(e) Instructors who teach a required in-service training course must achieve a passing grade on a
20		course-specific test developed by the North Carolina Justice Academy or by the agency delivering
21		the training. Instructors who teach a required in-service training course online, in addition to
22		meeting the above testing requirement, must also complete the in-service training for the course
23		he or she will be teaching. Instructors who teach an in-service training course in a traditional
24		classroom format will receive credit toward their own in-service training requirements, provided
25		that they pass all required tests and have their instruction adequately documented once completed.
26	(2)	The use of guest participants is permitted provided they are subject to the direct on-site
27		supervision of a commission-certified instructor.
28	(3)	The instructor shall deliver the training consistent with the specifications as established in the
29		rules in this Section.
30	(4)	The instructor shall document the successful or unsuccessful completion of training for each
31		person attending a training program and forward a record of their completion to each person's
32		Sheriff or Department Head.

8	C	ertification-Firearms" issued by the North Carolina Criminal Justice Education and Training
9	St	andards Commission. The instructor who teaches the classroom instruction regarding use of force
10	m	ay be either a Professional Lecturer by virtue of possessing a law degree under this Commission or
11	<u>th</u>	e North Carolina Criminal Justice Commission or a "Specific Certification-Firearms" issued by the
12	<u>N</u>	orth Carolina Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission;
13	(2)	The instructor shall deliver the training consistent with the minimum specifications as established

15		being conducted to personally provide all supervision, classroom training, range training, and
L6		scoring for certification purposes;
L7	(3)	The instructor shall document the successful or unsuccessful completion of training for each
<b>L</b> 8		officer on a commission-approved Firearms Requalification Record Form and forward such form
19		to each officer's sheriff;
20	(4)	The instructor shall submit to the sheriff copies of all courses of fire used for qualification of
21		deputy sheriffs and detention officers in compliance with 12 NCAC 10B .2101(1).
