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Hello Seth,

I do have several questions:

On line 5, are the contents or substantive requirements of the form prescribed by rule or statute? Where? See 150B-2(8a)d. Detailed here: 21 NCAC 25 .0201 THE APPLICATION

Do we need to make a reference to this rule in our temporary rule?

Regarding lines 10-12, it appears that G.S. 90D-7(c) [second paragraph] permits DPS, not your agency for charging a fee for the background check. Where does your agency get the authority to collect these checks? The fees are submitted to the Board, then we are invoiced for the background checks when completed and the fees are then paid to the SBI. The Board receives the fee of \$38 and that entire fee of \$38 is then submitted to the SBI.

Why is item (b), lines 15-32, still a possible path to licensure? It appears that the session laws established this as an alternate path to licensure for practicing interpreters prior to 2005. This path appears to no longer be available under the law.

This is no longer an option, should we have this struck through?

Is "good moral character as determined by the board", on lines 36, 50, and 64, further defined somewhere? Note that the RRC has previously objected to similar language as being impermissibly vague under the APA, see State Board of Education temporary rule under V.2. here: <u>https://www.oah.nc.gov/news/events/rrc-meeting-agenda-march-2024</u>. The RRC has approved this phrase when CJETS added some additional clarification/examples, see 12 NCAC 09G .0208. To be clear, I am not recommending that you have to use the same rule as CJETS, but to give you some context for the kind of definitions you could consider. This is also listed in the statute as "good moral character as determined by the board", will this affect the rule of the statute reads that way?

Regarding line 51, are there rules or statutes about how the Board approves "continuing education units"? The Board doesn't approve courses, but the courses do need to fall under specific types of CEUs, IE Professional or General as defined in the rule definitions. On line 64, you have "the board may also issue a provisional license". "May" is generally not appropriate language in this context, since it does not specify what is necessary to obtain a license? Do you mean "shall"? If not, how will the Board determine whether or not to issue a license to a person who meets the criteria in the remainder of these rules?

This is the language that is in the statute as it appears in the statute.

On lines 80 and 81, what is paragraph (f) for? This rule would only apply after the effective date anyway. **The Board's statute was changed in 2023 via HB600, on page 39 it has the below language:** SECTION 45.(d) Subsection (a) of this section becomes effective December 1, 2023, and applies to licenses and provisional licenses issued or renewed by the North Carolina Interpreter and Transliterator Licensing Board after that date. The remainder of this section is effective when it becomes law.

We wanted to make sure we addressed when this change in in effect and the licensees it effects for this licensure year.

On lines 83 and 85, why are the Session Laws still necessary authority? It appears to me that the still applicable material has been put into code.

Do I simply remove this language, or is there a rule I can look to for guidance?
