Good Morning Mr. Wiggins,

Upon review of rules for the MCC submitted for the April RRC meeting, I was concerned that a change from what was proposed from the December 15th issue of the NCR was not addressed in the "Request for Technical Changes."

Both the 10A NCAC 13A and 13D rules published in the NCR identified proposed effective dates of August 1, 2026. These rules submitted for RRC consideration have the effective date changed to May 1, 2026, three months earlier than originally proposed.

Prior to my retirement from State government, I worked as a rule coordinator for many years. In all my years as a rule coordinator, it was allowed by the RRC to extend effective dates from when they were originally proposed in the NCR but it was not allowed to submit rules with earlier effective dates from NCR publication. An agency's change to an earlier effective date was viewed by the RRC as a substantive change because the public was originally notified in the NCR of the proposed date the rules were to be in effect and the rules would then actually be put in place much sooner than the public had planned them to be.
