Thank you so much. I've attached the requested changes, and feedback for some specific edit requests below. I will be out of pocket most of the day tomorrow and back in the office Friday midmorning if there are additional changes that need to be made.

.0101 History note – that is a typo. It should read October 1. I have fixed in the submitted draft. Let me me know if I need to fix in OAH format. Good as changed.

.0204 Paragraph (a) – I tried to work with this one, but could not find a way that substantively changed the rule. I think our regulated public will understand what it means. Also the references, subsequent amendments, etc. are all available for free at the aforementioned website. I am fine with this, except could you change "additions" to "editions" at the end of line 8.

.0204 paragraph (e) – Again I think our regulated public understands what is being said here. I tried to break it up, but couldn't find anyway I liked. It's fine.

.0205 (2) – I can delete "clock" but the purpose here is to differentiate between "credit" hours (ie college credit) and also "continuing education" (CE) hours. There is a lot of confusion because they believe we are asking for credit hours...and they will die before they finish enough college courses to reach 270 credits. So we use clock here to demonstrate we are referring to hours of the day. While I understand what you are saying, continuing ed hours or credit hours are things and I don't think clock hours is a term that's used. I would delete, but I'm not going to object based on this.

.0205 (3) – This refers back to the requirements of .0202, and some applicants pay the fee at that step, others pay all at once. Fine.

.0205 (8) – We had a name change in 2020, and are in the process of moving over our web domains. I would like to leave our website unlisted throughout the rules. It does appear in .0102. Is that sufficient? The better practice is to have it listed, but if you don't know what it will be, in the near future, then it's fine.

.0206 (a) – I agree this is probably unnecessary, but I don't think I can change it without agency review. I think it holdover language from the 1990s that's purpose was to make sure that the substance abuse prevention credential was not doing treatment. They have an entirely different client base and unique scope and this rule, in addition to listing the requirements, is trying to address that. Fine.
