Paragraph (a), perhaps breaking the first sentence up would add clarity: "...supervised by an applicant supervisor. The practicum shall cover..." Also, it is unclear what exactly is being incorporated by reference. The name of the set of rules or code in which the "core functions" are listed should be named: "[set of rules or code] is incorporated by reference, including subsequent amendments and editions. This document may be accessed at internationalcredentialing.org at [cost]."

Paragraph (b), states, "The remaining hours of this practicum..." Remaining from what? Is there a better way to state this that is more clear?

Paragraph (c), should this simply state: "...the supervisor shall complete an evaluation reviewing the <u>applicant's</u> development..."?

Paragraph (d), line 17, perhaps change to "college or university or *it*-may be developed in *the* <u>a</u> work setting as long as it is <u>when</u> supervised by an applicant supervisor."

Paragraph (e) is very unclear as amended. Perhaps breaking it into several sentences and using straightforward language would help.
