Note: The Wildlife Resources Commission requests the addition of a new section to Subchapter 10B of Chapter 10 of Title 15A of the Administrative Code to be titled as follows: Section .0500 Chronic Wasting Disease Management.

15A NCAC 10B .0501 is adopted under temporary procedures as follows:

#### 15A NCAC 10B .0501 DEFINITIONS AND GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

(a) The rules in this Section apply to any area of the State where Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) has been detected, as determined by the Commission.

(b) The following definitions shall apply to rules in this Section:

- (1) "Cervid" means all animals in the Family Cervidae not otherwise regulated by the NC Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.
- (2) <u>"Cervid Health Cooperator" means an individual authorized to collect CWD samples on behalf of the Commission.</u>
- (3) <u>"Chronic Wasting Disease" or "CWD" means the transmissible spongiform encephalopathy prion disease</u> affecting species within the deer (Cervidae) Family.
- (4) "CWD Management Area" means the area delineated by the Commission where CWD has been determined to be endemic and the rules of this Section apply.
- (5) "Index location" means the approximate location where a new CWD detection has been identified.
- (6) "Primary Surveillance Area" or "PSA" means an area within an approximate five-mile radius around an index location as delineated by the Commission for CWD surveillance.
- (7) <u>"Sample" means</u> [tissue from a cervid suitable for CWD testing.] the cervid head and at least three inches of the neck.
- (8) "Secondary Surveillance Area" or "SSA" means an area within an approximate five- to 30-mile radius around an index location delineated by the Commission for CWD surveillance.
- (9) "Surveillance Area" means the PSA and SSA collectively.

(a) Any hunter who harvests a cervid in the PSA during the blackpowder or all lawful weapons season shall submit a sample to the Commission for CWD testing.

(b) No cervid carcass or carcass part originating from inside a PSA shall be transported outside the PSA unless double bagged and taken directly to a Cervid Health Cooperator in a county included in the PSA, or the carcass parts comply with Rule 10B .0503(b), or as [permitted] authorized by the Commission.

(b) Cervid carcass and carcass parts originating from inside an SSA may be transported to the PSA within the same Surveillance Area.

(c) Except as provided in 10B .0503(b), cervid carcasses or carcass parts shall not be transported outside of the SSA [without a permit from] unless authorized by the Commission.

In (a), line 6, what other activities are permitted? Is this described elsewhere in your rules? Feral hog eradication (feral swine trapping permit) and research (collection license or endangered species permit). Both covered elsewhere.

In (b), line 9, when you say "unlawful" is this a criminal act, or merely a violation of the rule? It's a Class 3 misdemeanor per 113-294(d).

In (b), line 9, add the oxford comma between "carcass" and "or". Done

In (c), line 17, change "a" to "the" prior to "Surveillance Area" for consistency. Keeping "a" so that when more areas are added we do not need to change this.

Hi Ashley,

I have a few more questions. I will just copy and paste the requests and your responses below, and my follow ups are in blue.

#### R .0501

In (b)(7), line 21, what does "suitable for CWD testing" mean? A part of the animal that can be tested for CWD. OK, then what part? What I am getting at is what makes the tissue suitable? Is it a quantity? A particular organ or body part? Something else? Will your regulated public know? Yes.

#### R .0504/.0505

In (b), line 8, what does "or as permitted by the Commission" mean in this context? That there are waste management exemptions. These exemptions are not for individuals. Are you requiring a permit? If so, what are the requirements for a permit? It is likely that we will need to issue permits to waste management companies/facilities, NC DOT, and Cervid Health Cooperators that will allow them to transport out of the PSA for disposal to specific sites.

In (c), line 9, what are the requirements for a permit? See response to second question for 10B .0504.

I'm concerned that you're establishing a permit requirement in these two rules without enumerating the requirements for the permit. Are they in a statute or another rule? What is your statutory authority for the permit?
